FAYETTE COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING SPECIAL SESSION JANUARY 5, 1993 COURTHOUSE FAYETTEVILLE, WEST VIRGINIA MEMBERS PRESENT: John L. Witt, John H. Lopez, Gene Carte, Jr.

The Fayette County Commission met in special session on this 5th day of January, 1993 and proceeded to organize for the year 1993.

Commissioner John H. Lopez offered motion to appoint Gene Carte, Jr. as President and John L. Witt as Purchasing Agent for the year 1993. Vote was unanimous.

Kelvin Holliday, newly elected County Clerk presented list of election officials, Democrat and Republican from the chairman of the Democratic and Republican Executive Committees they desire to have appointed for holding the Special Election in County on the 6th day of February, 1993.

President Carte offered motion to approve as presented. Commissioner Lopez seconded. All approved.

Vouchers presented for payment were approved.

Commissioner Carte questioned if Fayette County Board of Education Superintendent had been contacted about pads needed at Memorial Building. Administrator Charlotte Holly reported she is checking on this.

The Commissioners met with Attorney Jamie Blankenship with request to have Sheriff appointed as Committee for Roy Hughes. Sheriff Laird was present and informed this is within his capacity as Sheriff. Attorney Clint Gallaher was approved guardian ad litem and recommended the appointment. Commissioner John Lopez offered motion to approve of appointment. Commissioner John Witt seconded. All approved.

The Commissioners met with Attorney John Shumate with final hearing on minor boundary adjustment of West Virginia State Department of Highways right of way for section of West Virginia Secondary Route 27, U.S. Route 19 and West Virginia Secondary Route 19/55. There was no one in attendance to oppose this request. Commissioner John Lopez offered motion to approve. Commission John Witt seconded. All approved.

Discussions were held about Kilsyth Project. Mr. Shumate informed that he has heard nothing officially.

Commissioner John Witt informed he would like to establish policy that any and or all county property should be sold at public auction.and offered a motion to have this done with no exceptions. Commissioner Lopez seconded the motion. All approved.

Steve Cruikshank appeared before the Commission with request to advertise for applications for the position of E911 Coordinator for the County Office of Emergency Services. Mr. Cruikshank also requested the Commission approve appointment of William R. Laird, IV, Sgt. Dale Payne, John McComas, Mayor Gene Larrick and Myron Bryant as a selection screening committee for hiring all employees for the Emergency Communications Center. This was approved.

Invoice for monthly rent for office space leased by Department of Corrections was signed and approved.

Administrator Charlotte Holly reported that Janet Steele had contacted her and questioned temporary office space for Family Law Master for 1 month to 6 weeks. Ms. Holly informed she had showed her space downstairs previously occupied by the Administrator that she had agreed would work out fine temporarily. The Commissioners informed they had no objections to this but informed she would be responsible for long distance phone calls.

The Commissioners approved expenses for themselves and Administrator to attend Training Session coming up this month at Marriott.

The Commissioners received and reviewed copy of the annual jail inspection performed on December 21, 1992 by Kevin B. Burgess, Dr. D. C. Newell, Jr., D.O. and Charles P. Miller, Jr.

The Commissioners reviewed check from Bar Association in the amount of \$865.00 for Judge Abbot's furniture.

Administrator Charlotte Holly informed that Steven Zoeller had called her concerning discussion of possibly eliminating County Surveyor from ballot. The Commissioners informed they had no opinion on the matter.

Administrator Charlotte Holly reported that she had received notice from P.E.I.A. that effective 2/1/93 health insurance premiums would be reduced. Commissioner John Lopez informed he felt that employees should benefit from this. Discussions were held but no decision was made.

The Commissioners met with George Bragg with the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority. Mr. Bragg informed with the landfill closing in March the Authority would like to request the Commission lease or give property across from State Road Garage in Oak Hill for Recycling Center and or Transfer Station in the future.

Administrator Charlotte Holly reported that a portion of property in question was developed for outdoor recreation from a grant and that this could be the only use for property under conditions of the grant. She informed the Commission had written a letter to Charleston requesting to divide this property but had not received a response.

Commissioner John Lopez informed he would not have a problem with this if the State releases property.

Commissoner John Witt offered motion to sub-divide this property. Commissioner John Lopez seconded. All approved subject to receiving a release from Charleston.

The Commissioners met with Attorney Carl Harris with petition to have Sheriff Laird appointed Committee for Henry Moles. Terry Thomas from Health Center was question. Attorney Henry Armstong was approved guardian ad litem. Commissioners John Lopez offered motion to approve appointment. Commissioner John Witt seconded. All approved.

Discussions were held about blinds for Judge Hatcher's office. This was approved. Commissioner John Witt informed that Sherwin Williams had been requested to give separate prices on the Court Room and landing up to the Judge's office. Commissioner Carte informed he was not in favor of putting blinds up at landing.

Administrator Charlotte Holly informed that Kelvin Holliday had questioned new typewriter and copier for County Clerk's office. Discussions were held to hold off on copier until budget session. Paul Blake appeared before the Commission. The Commissioners requested Mr. Blake review 911 Ordinance and application for grant for an opinion if part-time person being employed by the Commission can be paid from grant funds. Mr. Blake agreed to review contract.

Commission President Gene Carte questioned if the Prosecutor's Office would assist the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority with matters of the Authority. Mr. Blake agreed to assist.

Mr. Blake also requested to be notified about Board of Equalization Hearings and informed he would be glad to assist the Commission in the future.

Attorney Jim Billings appeared before the Commission to file petitions for Committee Appointment for Robert L. Stuppio by JoAnn Grabosky, and Committee Appointment for Steven Crist by petitioner Jess and Teresa Bane.

Affidavits of County, Municipal, or other public officials establishing facsimile signatures were signed by Commissioner John H. Lopez, County Clerk Kelvin E. Holliday and Commissioner John L. Witt.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Herb Mann, Circuit Clerk, requesting that Barbara J. Coffey be put on the payroll as an Election Worker for his office effective January 4, 1992 through February 11, 1993.

Administrator Charlotte Holly reported that Dog Warden Billy Blake will be off all this week because he has the shingles.

The Commissioners reviewed letter from C & P Telephone submitting a check in the amount of \$27,494.12 for Emergency Telephone System for the Month of November, 1992.

The Commissioners approved a request submitted from Lee Massey for the Fayette County Planning Commission to increase monthly salary of Gary Harding from yearly salary of \$21,588.00 to \$24,624.00. This was approved to be effective July 1, 1993.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Governor Caperton addressed to Robert K. Holliday regarding access road from Armstrong Creek to Mahan on the turnpike. The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Attorney James B. Billings recommending that Cynthia Jones be appointed as Commissioner of the New Haven Public Service District. The Commissioners made no decision concerning this matter.

The Commissioners received and reviewed Fayette County Dog Warden Report for December, 1992.

The Commissioners approved and signed letters to Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk, informing that effective January 1, 1993, the salary of Earl Pauley shall be increased to \$23,000.00 from the General Fund and the salary of Charlotte Holly shall be increased to \$35,000.00.

The Commissioners also reviewed letter from Rick P. Powell, Superintendent of Fayette County Schools concerning maintenance of the roof at the Memorial Building.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Chief Deputy Everette Steele regarding reassignment of Sergeant Lawrence Washington to the Valley Detachment of the Fayette County Sheriff's Department.

The meeting was adjourned. The next scheduled meeting is scheduled for January 15, 1993.

ORDER

WHEREAS, the Fayette County Commission is authorized by law to sell or dispose of any property, either real or personal, belonging to the County; and

WHEREAS, the Fayette County Commission does from time to time deem it necessary to sell or dispose of various county property; and

WHEREAS, the Fayette County Commission does hereby find it necessary to adopt an official policy for disposing of any property;

NOW THEREFORE, Be It and It Is Hereby Resolved and Ordered by the County Commission of Fayette County, West Virginia, as follows:

In all instances where the Fayette County Commission is by law authorized to sell or dispose of any property, either real or personal, belonging to the County or held by it for the use of any district thereof, including the sale of any one item of property of less value than one thousand dollars, the same shall be sold at public auction, at the front door of the Courthouse of the County, and such sale shall be conducted by the President of the County in accordance with §7-3-3 of the Code of West Virginia. Provided further, that the sale at public auction shall not apply to selling or disposing of County property for a public use to the United States of America, its instrumentalities, agencies or political subdivisions or to the State of West Virginia or its political subdivisions, including county boards of education, for an adequate consideration without considering alone the present commercial or market value of the property.

This order not having been presented on January 5, 1993, is entered nunc

pro tunc.

The Fayette County Commission met in regular session on this 15th day of January, 1993.

Commissioner John H. Lopez informed of receiving complaints about a Committee Appointment for Nancy Maudi Curry. Attorney Paul Clay appeared at meeting and was questioned and confirmed that he would look at his file when he returned to his office and give Nancy Fout, the petitioner who was appointed Committee for Ms. Curry, a call and inform her of the complaints.

Assessor Tom Aiello appeared before the Commission with exonerations of real and personal property taxes. Mr. Aiello explained that the exonerations were approved by the Prosecuting Attorney. President Gene Carte informed he had talked with the Prosecuting Attorney and was informed also that they had no objections to the lists of exonerations.

Administrator Charlotte Holly presented vouchers for monthly sales tax for the Fayette County Park, Library Levy Funds and Fire Levy Funds in which she had not been able to prepare for payroll clerk and asked the Commission to approve. All vouchers were approved.

Administrator Charlotte Holly presented Invoice for Legal Services provided by King, Betts & Allen relating to the pending civil actions involving the discharge of Cecil and Michael McCormick. \$13,118.54 was approved for services.

Administrator Charlotte Holly presented list of polling places for levy election coming up on February 6, 1993. Ms. Holly explained that polling places were the same as last election with the exception of Oak Hill Armory. Ms. Holly explained that a Drill would be going on at the time of the election but was informed that the dining hall could be used. Commissioner Gene Carte informed he felt the Sheriff should be informed to instruct deputies to mark off parking spaces the night before at this polling place.

Discussions were held about upcoming levy election and the Commissioners agreed to set a time at 11:00 A.M. on February 1, 1993 to discuss this further. Administrator Charlotte Holly reported that George Stanton with the Attorney General's office had notified her of possible settlement of Court of Claims invoices. Ms. Holly explained that \$91,875.26 in invoices have been submitted. \$80,000.00 has been offered for settlement. Commissioner John Witt offered motion to accept and waive hearing. Commissioner John Lopez seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous.

The Commissioners signed order reappointing Mr. Kenneth Hayes to the New Haven Public Service District.

The Commissioners signed order adopting an official policy for disposing of any property belonging to the County. (copy attached).

Administrator Charlotte Holly reported that Janet Steele had informed that Family Law Master's will occupy the old FMRS Building. The Prosecutor's office is preparing lease. Ms. Steele has requested desk and secretary chair. Ms. Holly reported she has questioned if this is responsibility of the County Commission. Commissioner John Witt informed he felt the Commission needed to see this in writing before approving.

The Commissioners approved and signed exemption certificate for Appalachian Tire Products, Inc.

An exemption certificate was also approved and signed for Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone for Fayette County Park.

Attorney Erwin Conrad appeared before the Commission with petitions to close two streets in Lochgelly. The Commissioners accepted petition and set hearing for February 24th, 1993, at 9:30 A.M.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Attorney Gary E. Pullin concerning Koch V. Fayette County Commission, et at.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from West Virginia Development Office concerning monitoring Visit #2 of the Fiscal Year 1989-91 Small Cities Block Grant White Oak Public Service District Project.

A letter was also reviewed from Fred Cutlip, of the West Virginia Development Office informing of the extension of state/ local agreement FY1988 Small Cities Block Grant of the Northern Fayette Water Systems Plan to allow all audits to be completed. The Commissioners received and reviewed audit for years ending June 30, 1990, 1991, and 1992 of the Armstrong Creek Volunteer Fire Department.

Certificate of authority for signatures was signed by Gene Carte, Jr., President, Kelvin E. Holliday, County Clerk and William R. Laird IV, Sheriff to One Valley Bank of Oak Hill for HUD Account.

The Commissioners discussed leak at Memorial Building. Commissioner John Witt reported of looking at roof with representative of the Company. Mr. Witt informed that there was a serious problem with water and informed that this should be checked the next time there is a hard rain to determine where water is coming from. President Carte informed a letter should be written concerning the negligence of re-roofing and investigate heaving floor.

The Commissioners reviewed letter from Public Employees Insurance Agency concerning premium rate schedule for employees. The letter explained of five percent reduction of premiums. Discussions were held of short term of reductions and increases in the future. The Commissioners decided that the reduction would come form the Fayette County Commission's share only.

The Commissioners signed Renewal Maintenance Agreement with Vision Service Plan. New rates are: \$6.10 for single coverage and \$17.57 per family coverage.

Discussions were held about members appointed to select 911 coordinator and other employees for 911 center. The members unanimously agreed to add Tim Richardson and Eddie Long to the Committee.

The Commissioners signed letter to Charleston Marriott authorizing Paul Blake, Jr., Teresa Daniel, James Stacy, Henry R. C. Armstrong and Carl Harris to charge expenses while attending seminar on 2/18 - 2/21, 1993.

A letter was reviewed concerning meeting scheduled 1/21/93 at 7:30 p.m. to discuss the status of Northern Fayette County Regional Water System.

Minutes of meeting of Salem Gatewood Public held 12/10/93 were received and reviewed.

A letter was reviewed from West Virginia Division of Culture and History concerning Historic Preservation Development Grants Available.

A letter was reviewed from Circuit Clerk Herb Mann requesting Bonnie Sarver be put on payroll beginning January 11, 1993 at salary of \$14,875.08.

The Commissioners reviewed letter from Robert Wells of the Inauguration Committee requesting the Commission participate in a statewide bell ringing on Monday 1/18/93 in observance of inaugural day for Governor Caperton and in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. The Commissioners informed that they would not ask someone to ring bell on that day.

The meeting was adjourned. The next scheduled meeting is January 27, 1993.

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FAYETTE COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING REGULAR SESSION & BOARD OF EQUALIZATION AND REVIEW JANUARY 27, 1993 COURTHOUSE FAYETTEVILLE, WEST VIRGINIA MEMBERS PRESENT: Gene Carte, Jr., John L. Witt, John H. Lopez

The Fayette County Commission met in regular session on this 27th day of January, 1993.

President Gene Carte informed he felt the Commission needed to address situation for handicapped parking. He felt spaces should be designated for handicapped parking and requested for this to be looked at.

The Commissioners met with Attorney Steve Vickers with petition of Geza Barko to be appointed Committee for Helen Barko. Mr. Barko was questioned. Attorney Jamie Blankenship was approved guardian ad litem and felt it would be in the best interest of Ms. Barko to have Mr. Barko appointed. Commissioner John Lopez offered motion to approve. Commissioner John Witt seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous. Bond was set in the amount of \$500.00. Mr. Vickers is to present order.

The Commissioners met with Gary Light with the Valley Ambulance Service. Mr. Light introduced Bob Skaggs, a Senior Safety Specialist with Elkem Metals who has recently been appointed to serve on the Board of Directors for Valley Emergency Services. Mr. Skaggs explained that Elkem Metals has supported the Valley Emergency Services in the past and will continue to support due to the fast response and service of Valley Ambulance for their Company. Mr. Light informed that due to certain factors facing the company they needed to request funding from the Commission. President Gene Carte requested financial information and a break down of funding and informed the Commission could possibly consider after reviewing records.

The Commissioners met with Steve Cruikshank with concerns of renovations at the Memorial Building for the 9-1-1 Center. Commissioner Gene Carte requested that the Commissioners go to review the work being done at the site and felt they should start trimming down on expense.

The Commissioners opened bids for heating and cooling for the 9-1-1- center. Bids received were from Camco -\$12,500.00, Appalachian Heating -\$16,647.00 and Comfort Air - \$17,890.00. Commissioner John Lopez offered motion to accept lowest bid from Camco if they meet specifications. Commissioner John Witt seconded the motion. President Carte opposed. Motion passed 2 - 1.

The Commissioners met with Gary Harding with Zoning Request of Z-372-93-1: Request of Lost Paddle, Inc., Owner, by Kevin M. Whelan, for a change in land classification from R-R, Agricultural and Rural Residence District, to B-2, General Business District, on 16.43 acres, Pine Springs, Ames Heights Road and Corridor "L" New Haven District. Mr. Harding informed that Planning Commission voted 10 - 0 to approve Planned Development. Mr. Whelan who was present informed he would appeal this decision. He informed he felt this would be an unfair advantage being as Howard Campbell had his property approved to B-2.

Commissioner John Lopez offered motion to uphold decision of the Planning Commission. Commissioner John Witt seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous.

The Commissioners heard Request Z-373-93-1: Request of Patrick Settle, Owner, by Rex Settle, for a change in land classification from R-R, Agricultural and Rural Residence Distrct, to B-2, General Business District, on .58 acre, Loup Creek, located at Johnson's Branch, Kincaid, Valley District. Mr. Harding informed that Planning Commission voted 10 - 0 to deny. Commissioner Lopez offered motion to uphold Planning Commission's decision. Commissioner Witt seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous.

Z-360-92-3: Request of A. L. Browning Lumber Inc., Owner for a change in land classification from B-3, Highway Business District, to I-1, Light Industrial District, on Lots 48 thru 53, 69 thru 74 and 81, Wolf Creek Gardens, located on Hinkle Road at Corridor "L" New Haven District was withdrawn.

Administrator Charlotte Holly informed that Judge Hatcher had requested that the Commission supply Family Law Master signs for the Family Law Master. The Commissioners had purchased the signs for the Annex Building when it was thought that this would be the space provided for the Family Law Master. The Commissioners approved. The Family Law Master's office is currently the old FMRS building.

The Commissioners signed requested letter to School House Services supporting the implementation of the West Virginia Healthy Schools Program in Fayette County. The Commissioners approved and signed letter to Governor Caperton advising that the West Virginia Commission on Aging is considering the discontinuance of its \$500 monthly payment of rent for use of the Fayette County Senior Center in Oak Hill. The Commission requested that his office investigate the matter and assure that the \$500 monthly rent will continue being as the Center is a vital source of service to the senior citizens of Fayette County. President Carte requested that Delegates, Senators and Ms. Gladys Gray receive a copy of the letter.

The Commissioners signed letter to Firestone Building Products Company requesting that they investigate complaints of leaks and warping to the wooden basketball flooring of the auditorium at the Fayette County Memorial Building.

Commissioner John Witt informed he felt that the Commission should draft letter to the Board of Education concerning the replacement of bleachers. He felt that work on the bleachers was not done satisfactorily. He felt the letter should state that the Commmission wanted the bleachers replaced completely. This was approved.

Lee Massey presented a Resolution from the Planning Commission in which they honored the service of Hobart Booth as a long and faithful member of the Planning Commission.

Mr. Massey also presented a letter requesting the adjustment on Gary Harding's salary to \$25,000.00 as of July 1, 1993.

The Commissioners met with Attorney Ralph Young and several concerned citizens regarding final hearing for annexation without election for City of Oak Hill, 5 street areas known as Halstead, Boley, Crawford, Jordan and one unnamed street. Mr. Young presented order to the Commission certifying that the City has approval from majority of voters to annex areas in question.

Riley Thompson, a citizen from Crawford street presented a petition from citizens of the area who do not want to be annexed.

Commissioner John Witt requested a list of persons who want to be annexed. Attorney Ralph Young informed that the City has submitted what they feel is needed and nothing else would be supplied. He informed that they have done what is required and requested the Commission to sign order. The Commissioners informed they would consult with the Prosecuting Attorney before making a decision. The Commissioners set a time of 11:00 a.m. on February 3rd, 1993 to render a decision on the matter.

Attorney Ralph Young presented information for minor boundary adjustment for City of Oak Hill and explained the matter had been presented at prior meeting and questioned if the Commission would like him to republish legal ads pertaining to the matter. The Commissioners instructed they would suggest this be done.

The Commissioners met with Kenneth Fox with the Page Kincaid Public Service District. Mr. Fox gave report on project and informed completion should be before the end of the year. Mr. Witt also presented a plaque for the district for completion of Mulberry project.

The Commissioners met with Riley Thompson and Virginia Beckett. Mr. Thompson informed the group from areas in question for annexation by the city of Oak Hill would like to explore reactivating the Wolf Creek Public Service District to determine if this would be a way for them to obtain a sewer service. The Commission had only 1 member as currently being on the Wolf Creek PSD. Ms. Beckett agreed to serve on this district. The Commissioners signed order appointing Ms. Beckett to replace Mr. Gerald Greene, who is deceased. Term to expire November 1, 1997.

The Commissioners met in session as Board of Equalization and Review of Property Assessments.

Mr. Robert C. Woods appeared before the Commission with application for review for property in Gauley Bridge area.

The Commissioners reviewed all information with Mr. Woods and Cabby Bennett, from the Assessor's Office. Mr. Woods was informed the Commission would consider all information and would make a decision by the 24th of February, 1993.

Prosecuting Attorney Paul Blake, who was present for Board of Equaliztion Hearings informed that his office has looked at Computer System which would tie into State Agencies and West Law. He informed that they are looking at a total of 5 units at a cost of \$13,000.00 to \$15,000.00.

The Commissioners reviewed letter from Sheriff Laird regarding salary adjustment for Timothy Luikart, Joseph Coy, and Druscilla Harris. The Commissioners reviewed information from George P. Stanton, III concerning claim No. CC-92-399 Fayette County Commission v. Division of Corrections.

The Commissioners received and reviewed audit report of fiscal year ending June 30, 1992 for Nuttall Volunteer Fire Department.

The Commissioners signed order appointing Jacqueline Martin Campbell as Committee for Hannah Josephine Martin.

The Commissioners reviewed and approved Certified Local Government Program application for certification Part II for the Historical Landmark Commission.

The Commissioners reviewed information concerning workers' compensation claim of Percy Gilliam. The Commissioners requested information be forwarded to Prosecuting Attorney.

The Commissioners reviewed letter from Attorney Paul Clay concerning Committee Appointment for Nancy Curry.

The Commissioners reviewed quotes for blinds for 2nd floor landing, \$285.00, Court Anti Room, Jury Room, Reception Room, Door and Judges chamber, \$1,675.00. This was approved. A quote was received for Circuit Court room for \$905.00. No decision was made, Quotes were from Sherwin Williams of Beckley.

Ms. Holly presented quote from NuEx, Inc. for cleaning 15,000 gallon above ground water tank at Fayette County 4-H Park. Quote being \$3,587.00. This was approved.

The Commissioners also reviewed information for Windsor upright carpet cleaner. Cost being \$1,990.00. This was approved.

The Commissioners also reviewed bid for Pool concrete work from Richard Myles. Quote being \$1,400.00. This was approved. A quote was also received for new access and ramp. This quote being \$3,800.00. This was approved.

Ms. Holly presented information concerning damage to ambulance of General Ambulance. Ms. Goff had submitted estimate for the damage to the ambulance but CNA insurance informed that policy carries a \$1,000.00 deductible for collision. Mr. Witt

informed he had spoken to Ms. Goff and given her this information.

The Commissioners signed paper work for draw down for White Oak Public Service District.

The Commissioners approved and signed letter to Opal Leggett, of Fayette County Child Development, Inc., informing that property in which she has requested for Head Start Program is restricted for outdoor recreation use only. The Commission informed that unless an alternate use for the site is approved by the federal project agency, they could not permit property to be utilized for another purpose. 9°

President Gene Carte informed he felt Earl Pauley should go to look at site at Harlem Heights and determine what may need to be done to improve recreation area. Discussions were held about possibly putting in outdoor lights for basketball area. No decision was made.

Administrator Charlotte Holly presented a letter from Charles Wendell in which he requested a hearing to review increased assessment of C & W Associates. Ms. Holly informed she would forward this information to the Assessor for advice.

The Commissioners signed order approving list of alternate workers for upcoming Special Election.

The Commissioners signed letter to Mr. Thomas Koontz acknowledging receipt of letter for consideration to be appointed as a member of the Fayette County Planning Commission. The Commissioners informed that this information would be reviewed at such time when an appointment is to be considered.

The Commissioners also reviewed notice of hearing of Elizabeth A. Blackburn on January 28, 1993 with the West Virginia Department of Employment Security.

Administrator Charlotte Holly requested permission to open up saving account with the State Board of Investments for 9-1-1 funds. This was approved.
