The Fayette County Commission met in regular session on this 4th day of January, 1995.

Commissioner John Lopez moved that Commissioner John Witt replace Commissioner Gene Carte as President of the County Commission. Commissioner Carte seconded.

Commissioner Lopez made motion that Charlotte Holly Administrator, and Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent be authorized to make purchases up to \$600.00 without prior County Commission approval. Commissioner Witt informed he had no problem with Ms. Holly or Mr. Pauley being authorized to make purchases as long as they got 3 quotes before purchasing. Commissioner Carte seconded. All approved.

Commissioner Lopez made motion that Debbie Berry be the assistant purchasing agent. Commissioner Carte seconded. All The Commissioners approved. signed organization order. Commissioner Witt asked when was the decision made to have Charlotte and Earl authorized to make purchases, and why order is Commissioner Lopez informed he had called already prepared. Charlotte yesterday and asked her to prepare order for today's meeting.

Ron Walton with Whipple Community in Action appeared before the Commission regarding Pace Property in Whipple. Mr. Walton informed he had talked with the Pace Brothers and they agreed they

would sell their 2 ½ acre share of the property for \$3,300.00 and would like for county to have property surveyed. Commissioner Carte informed Mr. Walton that the other property owners would have to sign deed also, Commissioner Lopez informed you would have to have the entire property surveyed not just the brothers share of the property. Discussion was held, Ron informed the Commissioners Mike Pace said he would take day off to come in and talk with the Commission regarding the property. Commissioner Carte asked Ms. Holly to contact Mike and have him to appear January 13th at 10:00 a.m.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Jackie Hickman had checked with the Assessor's Office to see if they had any addresses on any the heirs of property owners in Whipple, informed Gloria Bozo checked, Assessor's Office have same addresses. Commissioner Carte informed the Commission would have to publish. Commissioner Witt asked how many times would they have to publish. Ms. Holly asked the Commission if they could go through with Fublic Notice without having sent the original clean up letter to the heirs.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners minutes of the zoning hearing on November 30, 1994 for their signature.

sent to all Emergency Medical Services Providers operating vehicles to answer any liability on behalf of the Commission only. Letter signed. Commissioner Witt asked Ms. Holly if she had a list of the Emergency Medical Services Providers. Ms. Holly informed she would get a list for him.

The Commissioners signed letter to Penelope Crandall, Director, Family Law Masters requesting for reimbursement for rent in the amount of \$550.00 for the month of December, 1994.

Fresident Witt signed Sales Tax Report for the Fayette County Park for the month of December, 1994.

The Commission signed order as advised by the Assessor of Fayette County to waive the first half interest and/or penalty for 1994 real estate taxes for account 08174138 in the name of Ray and Violet T. Lamb due to clerical error.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received notice from Frances C. Webb requesting payment for overtime for December 28th, 29th, and 30th for lunch hours worked. Discussion was held, overtime approved. Commissioner Lopez suggested asking the Switchboard workers in again.

Commissioner Witt asked if individuals are aloud to walk-in.

Ms. Holly informed it has always been our policy to call and schedule for an appointment. Commissioner Witt informed Ms. Holly when she advertise to include by appoint basis only.

Exonerations were signed and approved.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received follow-up on grant for Fayette County Park was informed the Commission need to contact a delegate to get in-put in digest and he's to let the West Virginia Development Council no the Commission is still interested.

Commissioner Witt asked Ms. Holly to contact everyone on the Water Project list and let them know that Senator Byrd is setting up a meeting for the 20th or 23rd to discuss New Haven Public Service District Water Project, Senator Byrd will do invitations. Commissioner Witt asked Ms. Holly to include David Wagner, would like to know by Friday. Meeting will be in County Commission Chambers.

Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners if they wanted the clean-up letters to Steve Campbell and Robert L. Ellis to go out today or wait until Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney complete title search. The Commissioners informed Ms. Holly to hold for title search from Prosecuting Attorney's Office.

Gary Harding, Tim Fish, Jack Wood and several people were again present to discuss the Route 19 Zoning Study and Report. Mr. Harding gave each Commissioner copy of proposal from Mr. Fish. Mr. Fish informed he had discussed proposal with Lee Massey, Planning Commissioner and he suggested that a public meeting be held regarding the proposal. Jack Wood, Planning Commissioner asked the

Commissioners if they had seen proposal. Commissioner Witt informed he haven't had time to review plan. Mr. Fish informed he believe a public meeting is a good ideal but prefer meeting in evening hours. Commissioner Witt informed he wasn't sure about getting someone from out of the Faytte County area to do this study. Mr. Fish informed the Commission that Woolpert is dedicated to satisfying their clients.

The Commissioners suggested having Fublic Meeting regarding the Route 19 Zoning Study and Report proposal and asked that the Flanning Commission set date and time for meeting. The Commissioners hope to resolve at next County Commission meeting.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that in their revised vacation and sick leave policy she had been questioned about a Doctor's excuse after 3 days, Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners if they wanted to include this in the policy. Commissioner Witt made motion to include Doctor's excuse after 3 days of sick leave in policy. No objections motion carried.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that at last meeting she submitted letter from Steve Cruikshank, Emergency Coordinator, regarding generator on Mann Mountain and invoice requesting payment of \$7,608.60 to Electro-Tech Services, Inc. Ms. Holly informed it was approved to be paid and informed the Commissioners that Steve Cruikshank informed it would be paid out of 911 Fund and if you have any questions she could call Steve at his office and have him to come in. The Commissioners approved to pay from E-911 Fund.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners Appraisal Report from Mike Walbrown for county property on Wiseman Avenue. Amount

\$19,000.00. Commissioner Lopez asked if they wanted to advertise. Commissioner Witt said yes. Commissioner Carte informed he was against advertising and selling. Vote passed 2-1. Ms. Holly asked if they wanted to have Fublic Auction. The Commissioners informed yes. Commissioner Witt suggested checking with Earl to see if he has any equipment to auction. Ms. Holly asked if they wanted to advertise the appraisal value. The Commissioners informed yes. Invoice to ERA Wise and Yeager Realty was approved. Amount \$200.00.

The Commissioners received and reviewed from Cleek, Fullin, Knopf and Fowler a "Defendants Motion to Compel" and "Defendants response to plaintiff's request for production of Documents" regarding Clint R. Lawson, Sr. v. Gene Carter, Jr., et al for their files.

Ms. Holly informed the Commission that Alarm System is now working at Courthouse, Annex and Jail. Sheriff has given keys to Steve Cruikshank so they would be able to access.

Ms. Holly asked Commissioner Witt if he had talked with Vernon Bailey, Raleigh County Commissioner regarding waiver for dumping dogs at landfill, Ms. Holly informed she had talked with Brian Shumate they had voted no to the waiver, but the County could apply to get taxes waived.

Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners about Ms. Abbot's request for funds. Discussion held, Commissioner Carte moved that the Commission give \$400.00 to Humane Society. Commissioner Lopez suggested Raleigh County Solid Waste Authority bill the County for disposal of dogs. Commissioner Witt agreed to have Raleigh County

Solid Waste Authority bill separately effective January 1, 1995.

The Commissioners received and reviewed copy of letter from Master Tele-Cable, Inc. regarding rate change.

Commissioner Carte received letter of appreciation from Governor Gaston Caperton, Major General Joseph Shaff, Commissioner Hun and Jack J. Roop for participating in the Mount Olive Correctional Complex dedication held December 12, 1994.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners they had approved 1994 Work Study Student for West Virginia University Extension Office, informed the Commission that Bob Arthur turned in refund from the Fayette County 4-H Leaders Association, Inc. Amount \$537.00.

The Commissioners received and reviewed Audit Report from Pax Volunteer Fire Department for fiscal years ending June 30, 1993 and June 30, 1994.

The Commissioners received and reviewed 3rd Place Award for 1994 Annual Christmas Decorating Contest from the Fayetteville Junior Woman's Club.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received letter from West Virginia Development Office thanking the Commission for submitting application for Small Cities Fartnership Grant, also was informed pre-application forms requesting council review could be obtained by contacting West Virginia Development Council. Ms. Holly informed the Commission she had written letter requesting two pre-application forms for (1) Bellwood Community Water System Improvement Froject, (2) New Haven Public Service District Water Extension Project.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that she and Judge

Hatcher had talked about accessibility procedures for Circuit Court and the Circuit Clerk's office and asked the Commission to review document to keep on file.

Commissioner Lopez informed the Commissioners they are entitled to reimbursement from worthless check account feel the Commission should transfer money to General County Fund.

The Fayette County Solid Waste Authority met with the Commission to discuss the inmate work program. Jim Murdock, Chairman of the Authority informed the Commission we definitely need jail inmate to work on litter control program, informed the Commission that program has always worked. Commissioner Witt asked Mr. Murdock if he had talked with the Magistrates and Judges. Mr. Murdock informed he had met with Prosecuting Attorney, Magistrates, and Judges and they all agreed. Commissioner Lopez informed the Authority if the Commission sounded a little negative it was because they wasn't ever informed or enlighten about what their obligation or commitment would be. Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners that beginning next week Coordinated Enforcement Frogram will be started to enforce the litter and waste in Fayette County. Commissioner Lopez asked the Sheriff if he would have the manpower to offer an officer during the day, feel this would cut down on liability. Sheriff Laird informed he would do everything he could to monitor program. Ms. Holly was asked to check with insurance agent regarding liability. Commissioner Lopez made motion subject to no complications regarding liability and insurance they would support inmate work program. Commissioner Witt seconded. All approved. Ms. Holly asked Mr. Murdock whether

or not this program could be extended to the cleaning up of creeks. Mr. Murdock informed they have had that type of problem before.. Aubrey Riner questioned about the landfill lease. Commissioner Witt informed we have no further use for it and don't think we are obligated. Mr. Murdock informed he made request to Prosecuting Attorney's Office and was informed they have no one with expertise that could answer.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that John Kessler had purchased a mail slot for his door an asked if some one from maintenance could install. This was approved.

Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners if they wanted to discuss parking rules and regulations today. The Commissioner asked that this be tabled for later.

The Commissioners received and reviewed from Sheriff Bill Laird, Regional Jail Reports.

Ms. Holly informed she received first request on Juvenile

Justice Grant for Sandra Tucker, amount \$750.00 plus travel from

Martha Hager.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a list of "refusals to pay" associated with the Emergency Telephone system for the month of November, 1994.

The Commissioners received and reviewed check in the amount of \$28,531.62 for the Emergency Telephone System for the month of November, 1994.

Commissioner Carte informed the Commission he received call from Library informing that the tile is coming up in three places, need ballast replaced in the lights. Ms. Holly informed she told

James Ferdue. The Commissioners approved for James to take care of.

The Commissioners received and reviewed copy of Assessor's Valuation Budget from Department of Tax and Revenue, have until January 15, 1995 to submit comments to Tom Aiello, Assessor.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from the Raleigh County Solid Waste Authority regarding the new landfill cell and rules for disposal beginning January.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Robert Reed, President, FMRS Mental Health Council, Inc. asking the Commission if they know anyone they would like to recommend to be appointed to the Board of Directors.

The Commissioners received and reviewed thank you letter from Jerome Litton regarding appraised value on his property.

The Commissioners signed letter to Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk informing that effective January 1, 1995 the annual salary of Charlotte Holly shall be \$38,000.00 plus benefits to be paid from General County Fund.

The Commissioners received and reviewed report from Chemical Bank regarding Union Carbide Bond issue.

The Commissioners received and reviewed copy of letter from Paul Blake, Prosecuting Attorney from the Division of Correction informing the Commission they have been awarded \$53,235.06 for housing of prisoners.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Green Thumb regarding Personal Leave policy.

The Commissioners received and reviewed invoice from

Automotive Research Tech, amount \$1,070.60.

The Commissioners decided to hold invoice to Woolpert, check number 7907 to be paid from Coal Severance Fund.

The Fayette County Commission met in regular session on this 13th day of January 1995.

Fresident Witt announced that on Tuesday, January 24, 1995 in the County Commission Chambers at 7:00 p.m., the Empowerment Zone will hold a meeting for the purpose of electing (1) one member to represent census tract #206 and (2) two members to represent census tract #205 of Fayette County to the Board of Directors of Central Appalachia Empowerment Zone of West Virginia.

Fresident Witt read resolution endorsing the county-wide water treatment and distribution plan proposed by West Virginia-American Water Company. Commissioner Carte made motion to endorse the county-wide water treatment and distribution plan provided West Virginia American Waters include the Bay Heights Project in Summerlee. The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to revise resolution to include Bay Heights Water Project, will sign this afternoon.

Commissioner Witt informed that a representative from Senator Robert Byrd's office will be here on Monday, January 23, 1995 at 1:30 to discuss water project for Fayette County.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received notice that the Enterprize Community Zone Board of Directors want the Commissioners to elect a member to set on the Board. Commissioner Carte moved that Fresident Witt serve. Vote unanimous.

Commissioner Witt accepted.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received notice from Gloria Bozo that the State Tax Department wanted all mineral hearings scheduled on February, 14, 1995, if someone can't come on that day the State Department will try to have someone available at another time.

Ms. Holly informed the Commission she received call from Family Law Master office yesterday informing that wall paper will not stay up, believe it might be do to the condensation from the Laundromat, was informed they have brought paint and supplies but want to know if maintenance can come down and paint. Commissioner Witt opposed to having maintenance paint, Commissioner Carte approved. Decision to be made when Commissioner Lopez is present.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received audit report form Department of Tax and Revenue for fiscal year ended June 30, 1992 for the County, informed the Commission the report discloses the existence of certain instances of a noncompliance with state statues. Ms. Holly informed the Commission she prepared a letter to Sheriff William Laird, Prosecuting Attorney Faul Blake and Assessor Thomas Aiello asking them to remedy the instances of a noncompliance with the West Virginia State Laws. Letters signed.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received certified a letter from Page-Kincaid Fublic Service District informing that the Beards Fork Elementary School had not been signed up on the wastewater system. Ms. Holly informed the Commission she prepared letter and forwarded certified letters to the Board of Education informing that ownership of the Beards Fork Elementary School

property had not been transferred by deed to the Fayette County Commission. Letter signed.

Ms. Holly informed the Commission she received invoice from Otis Elevator Company for charges for travel time to and from jobsite for \$243.82; Ms. Holly informed she had discussed the work performed with the maintenance personnel, informed the Commission she feel the nature of the problem should have been detected during normal maintenance and the subsequent work performed should be covered under our maintenance agreement. Ms. Holly informed the Commission she prepared letter protesting the charges. The Commission approved and signed.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Sheriff Bill Laird regarding invoices from the Regional Jail and Correctional Facility Authority for the confinement of Fayette County inmates at the Southern Regional Jail, also informed the Commissioners that invoices have been prepared for the City of Oak Hill and the City of Mount Hope reflecting our expenses for city commitments.

The Commissioners received a letter from Ann Berry requesting the Commission to sign order canceling and reissuing 3 outstanding checks paid from General County Fund. Order signed, Ms. Holly informed the Commission she would have to check on one of the checks.

The Commissioners signed a letter to Elected Officials and Department Heads requesting that each office, prior to March 2, 1995 submit a detailed request for appropriations for anticipated or expected expenditures for ensuing fiscal year.

Ms. Holly asked the Commission if they would approve for her to prepare vouchers for Fire Levy request for standard reimbursement for payment. Invoices approved checks to be written.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that she received a Inmate Labor form request from Sheriff Bill Laird that's required to be completed if an inmate is used for litter clean-up. Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners' she talked with Jim Lively about liability was informed he would write to our insurance company about Counties liability, he felt unless we're extremely negligent the county shouldn't have any problem, but he would check into and let us know. Ms. Holly informed the Commission she would check with the Sheriff about form.

Commissioner Witt informed the Commission need to get together and spend a little time to discuss what they're going to do with the Jail. Ms. Holly also suggested discussing property purchased from the Estate of Evelyn Estep. Commissioner Witt asked about floor plans on the buildings. Ms. Holly informed she had floor plans. It was decided to discuss in next meeting.

The Commissioners received and reviewed copy of Boomer Volunteer Fire Department quarterly report.

The Commissioners received and reviewed copy of Dog Warden report for the month of December.

Ms. Holly reminded the Commission that the West Virginia County Commissioners' Association Annual meeting is scheduled for February 12th through February 15th and asked if anyone will be attending. Commissioner Witt informed he would be attending. Commissioner Carte will not be attending.

The Commissioners received and reviewed several letters from Page-Kincaid Fublic Service District regarding previous complaints and correspondences.

Ron Walton appeared before the Commission to discuss property in Whipple. Commissioner Carte informed Mr. Walton he feel the Face Property could not be sold in parts as per his request. Commissioner Carte informed Mr. Walton that the Commission was committed for the entire amount requested. Mr. Walton asked the Commission to call Mr. Face to see what his decision is; Mr. Walton asked if they could look other where for property. The Commission informed Mr. Walton he could check on other property but asked Mr. Walton would property be comparable to the Pace property. The Commission asked Mr. Walton to find out what's available and get back with them. Ms. Holly asked Mr. Walton if he had found out anything about the Mountain Laurel Property. Mr. Walton informed he hadn't heard anything regarding their decision.

The Commissioners received and reviewed Audit Report from Armstrong Creek Volunteer Fire Department for fiscal year ending June 30, 1993 and June 30, 1994.

Ms. Holly informed the Commission that AT&T was here yesterday to provide telephone training for Frances Webb and Nancy Massey, Switchboard Operators for new telephone system.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letters from Sheriff Bill Laird regarding Annual leave payment request for Gayle Koone and Bill Webb. Discussion was held, okay to pay but to have Mr. Koone and Mr. Webb sign statement acknowledging receipt of money and informed them that they're no longer correctional officers and

they're no longer under the Civil Service Commission.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners Bob Arthur had obtained copier for the Fayette County Park from West Virginia University Extension Service in Morgantown.

The Commission received and reviewed letter from the Civil War Re-enactment Ball Committee requesting waiver of rental fee of Memorial Building. This was approved; the Commission asked Ms. Holly to check with Dean Lockett, principal at the Fayetteville Middle School, but if the Ball Committee wanted special custodial services this has to be approved by the Board of Education.

The Commissioners received and reviewed minutes from Gauley River Public Service District for the months of October, November and December.

The Commissioners received and reviewed minutes for the month of December from Salem-Gatewood Public Service District.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Division of Highways requesting their review and comments regarding the Statewide Transportation Plan.

Ms. Holly informed the Commission she had talked with Mark Lokant regarding invoice from Automotive Research Tech. informed the Commission that West Virginia Gas match was in the equipment that this was the county share from the grant, informed the Commission that they would receive 2 more invoices; asked the Commission if they wanted to go ahead and pay this invoice or hold until other invoices are mailed. Ms. Holly informed once these invoices are paid County would be reimbursed. The Commissioner approved to hold for remaining invoices.

Mark Lokant, Chairman and members of the Fayette County Transition Team met with the Commission to give an update on the progress of the Transition team. Guy Dooley, member of the team gave brief update on what the team has done in last 2 years. Commissioner Witt recognized seven members of Transition Team and asked Mr. Dooley to introduce each member. Mr. Dooley informed the Commissioners they were here today to request that the Commission include in their 95-96 budget a salary and office space for a County Resource Coordinator to be paid a yearly salary of \$35,000 to \$40,000. Commissioner Witt informed he feel this coordinator would benefit the County. Discussion was held; Commissioner Witt informed he was in favor of coordinator, real opportunity and lot of jobs would be created. Commissioner Witt thanked the Transition team for coming. Commissioner Carte informed the Transition Team the Commission would discuss during budget.

Commissioner Witt questioned voucher Number 7921, asked Ms. Holly why we're paying for communication center travel out of Coal Severance Fund. Ms. Holly informed the Commission during budget session for '94-'95 it was decided to use this fund for 911 Emergency travel. Ms. Holly informed the Commission she talked with Steve Cruikshank and he informed her it would be okay to pay from Enhanced 911 Fund. The Commission asked Ms. Holly to void voucher Number 7921 and pay Communication Center travel out of the 911 Enhanced Fund.

Ms. Holly informed she received notice of hearing from unemployment compensation benefits regarding Diana Hudson. The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to check with the Prosecuting

Attorney's Office to see if someone could attend and check to see whether Earl should attend.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she had talked with Sheriff Bill Laird regarding form for inmate work program was told this was a general request form once everything is lined up, will follow the same procedure used when we had the County jail.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Ed Koone slipped and failed in the bathroom of the Memorial Building.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners as a follow up of last meeting she was waiting to hear from Ann Berry regarding the balance of the worthless check fund.

The Commissioners signed and approved exonerations.

The Commissioners recessed to go into Executive Session with Bob Arthur.

Meeting reconvened; informed the Executive Session was regarding personnel matter.

Outstanding bills and payroll were approved.

Kelvin Holliday appeared before the Commission to discuss hiring of part time worker, recommend hiring Maxine Blagg to work 3 working days and need part time position for in office training to help with preparing deeds from delinquent sales.

Commissioner Carte made motion to hire part time worker for 3 working days at \$35.00 a day and suggested talking about the hiring of a person for one day training for redemption of land in budget session.

Ms. Holly presented the revised resolution endorsing the county-wide water treatment and distribution plan proposal by West

Virginia American Water Company. Order signed.

The Commissioners received and reviewed report from Danese Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad, Inc. for the month of December.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letters from Workers' Compensation Division regarding Harold W. Conners.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from Department of Tax and Revenue regarding Board of Equalization and Review hearing.

The Commissioners reviewed list of ambulance titled to the County.

The Commissioners approved to purchase Square D safety switch for mainline power disconnect part for annex building.

The Commissioners approved to pay invoice to SCT public Sector, Inc. for payroll and accounting computer hardware. Amount \$10,725.00.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she would have a list of 1996 holidays prepared for their next meeting, but informed the Commission she received fax from the Department of Administration regarding State holidays; Ms. Holly informed the Commission the State is giving ½ day off for Christmas Eve, 1996 and New Year's Eve, 1996. The Commission agreed to give county employees ½ day off for Christmas Eve, 1996 and New Year's Eve, 1996.

Ms. Holly informed the Commission that Earl Pauley informed her that his crew would help with the plowing and shoveling of

the snow at the courthouse next week if necessary.

Ms. Holly informed the Commission that Earl Pauley informed her that the end loader that was sold at the auction would not start and requested the Commission's permission to help try to get it started; the Commissioners informed Ms. Holly to tell Earl it was okay for employees to help start, but they're not to supply fluids, batteries or anything else.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent received information from Ashland regarding the natural gas at the Park; he said that Ashland was supposed to send the Commission a contract next month.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Earl want to know if the Commission had made any decision on the purchase of the SW-B10 parts washer for park. Ms. Holly informed the Commission they had asked her to hold; Ms. Holly informed the Commission that Earl Pauley said it was okay if they did not approve. Ms. Holly informed the Commission that Earl has a demo at the park, and he needed to know if they wanted to purchase or to have NAPA pick up. The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to tell Earl to have NAPA pick up demo and would not purchase at this time.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received a call from Sandra Morris asking if she could operate a private catering business at the Fayette County Park kitchen. Ms. Holly informed the Commission she told Ms. Morris that this was not allowed, but if someone scheduled a reception or whatever at the park and

independently contracted for her to cater the scheduled event that was okay.

Ms. Holly informed the Commission the play for the Centennial will be held Tuesday, November 21 and if they had no objections if she asked James Perdue to work overtime to help Scott Light since he is the new janitor on night shift. This was approved.

Ms. Holly asked the Commission if they wanted to talk about the Leash Law or the Parking lot. Commissioner Witt asked to hold until Commissioner Lopez got here.

Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners if they wanted to make a decision on whether or not to have Commission meeting December 27. The Commission decided to cancel meeting for the end of the month of December.

Payroll and outstanding bills were approved.

Commissioner Lopez arrived at 10:24 a.m. after having stopped at the Office of the Kanawha Falls Public Service District to answer questions regarding the proposed regional water plan of West Virginia Water. Mr. Lopez advised the Commission that rumors had arisen that the Kanawha Falls Public Service District was included in that regional plan and he had stopped by to notify the Public Service District that it was not in that regional plan and that the plan involved the Plateau area of the county.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letters from

CableVision informing of the new channels that will be added January 1, 1996.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter and pictures from the residents of East Kingston regarding abandoned property Lot 21, Block E, East Kingston, property owner Ray N. Clark. Ms. Holly asked the Commission if they wanted Gary Harding, Zoning Officer to look at property. The Commissioners informed that by looking at the pictures it was not necessary to have Gary go down and look at the property. Commission Witt made motion that letter be sent to the property owner. Commissioner Carte seconded. All approved.

The Commissioners met with Steve Cruikshank, Emergency Coordinator, David Neal, 911 Emergency Coordinator, Sheriff Bill Laird, Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent, Bert Horrocks, Dog Warden, and two (2) Conservation Officers to discuss switching of the low band radios to high band. Mr. Cruikshank informed the Commissioners they have two radio base systems (1 in the Valley, and 1 on Mann Mountain), these two were installed about 25 years ago and in his opinion would cost the county a great deal to keep upgrading and maintaining, so he asked that the Commission switch over to UHF and get rid of low band because the UHF system would have better radio coverage and it would be the same as the 911 Communication System. Commissioner Lopez asked if the 911 Fund have any money to help with getting new system; Commissioner Lopez inquired about the approximate cost of \$8300, and asked

Steve how many radios he was talking about. Mr. Cruikshank informed that the Sheriff's Office would need 4; Commissioner Lopez asked Mr. Pauley how many that the Park would need, and he informed 2; also, Mr. Horrocks needs 1, and the Conservation Officers need 3 for a total of 10 radios. Discussion was held regarding how the Conservation Officers would use radios; it was decided that the Conservation Officer who live in the Fayette County area would carry one, and the two other Officers would check out their radios at the 911 Center when they are in the Fayette County area. The Commission and Commissioner Carte discussed getting a radio for the Gauley Bridge Police Detachment. Commissioner Lopez made motion to purchase 10 radios for the Emergency System and for communication with the Fayette County Park and the Fayette County Dog Warden payable from the Coal Severance Fund; Commissioner Witt seconded motion to purchase the 10 radios; Commissioner Carte opposed 10 radios and made a motion to increase to 11. Vote passed 2 - 1 to purchase 10 radios; Commissioner Carte voted nay.

Mr. Cruikshank recommended the Commission hold off on giving low band radio units out to REACT because of problem they might have with some of the old units. Charlotte Holly and Steve Cruikshank are to see if they would have to advertise for purchase of new radio equipment since the total amount would be over \$5,000. Mr. Cruikshank informed the Commission that since he did obtain the bid from the State purchasing contract, he felt

there was no need to advertise. Ms. Holly informed the Commission she would check to make sure whether or not the Commission would have to advertise or not; if the equipment is purchased on the state contract, advertisement is not required.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:20 a.m. Next scheduled meeting is November 29, 1995.

Commissioner Witt informed Mr. Lilly that the Commission has drafted a Leash Law policy for the county. Commissioner Witt informed Mr. Lilly that the Prosecuting Attorney is reviewing the Leash Law policy and hopefully the Commission will act on the policy in January. Mr. Witt informed Mr. Lilly that the county leash law would have no jurisdiction over the Leash law of municipalities.

Jim Zoeller presented to the Commission a video of the courthouse centennial held November 22, 1995.

The Commissioners signed clean-up letter to Ray Clark.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she had received a call from Thelma Baldry regarding Eugene Walker property in Minden. Ms. Holly informed the Commission that Gary Harding had checked the property and recommended clean-up. The Commissioners signed clean-up letter to Mr. Walker.

The Commissioners received and reviewed monthly Solid Waste Authority Reports.

Joe Myers member of the Solid Waste Authority informed the Commission that the county would be losing state funding for city clean-ups and community clean-ups and informed the Commission the Solid Waste Authority has not received anything in writing regarding this matter, but he did talk with Randy Huffman.

Gary Harding, Zoning Officer presented to the County Commission for disposition: Z-415-95-1: Request of Ronald L. Walton, owner, for a change in land classification from RR-1, Agriculture and Rural Residence District, to R-3, Residence District, on Lot 39 and 37, Justus Colins Estate, located on Route 15, Whipple Plateau District.

Commissioner Witt announced that he received information from Senator Shirley Love that the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority has been granted a sum of \$29,000 for the Litter Clean-up Program.

Commissioner Witt and Commissioner Lopez informed they would like to thank Senator Love for getting this grant approved.

The Commissioners signed letter to Lightning, Inc. informing that a hearing regarding the correction of the 1995 appraised values of the four tracts of land is not necessary and that the corrections have been made through the Office of the Fayette County Assessor and corrected

statements have been issued.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she had received a request from the Valley Emergency Medical Service for contribution payment of the \$10,000.00 previously approved and asked the Commissioners if it was okay to release the check. The Commissioners informed okay to release check.

The Commissioners received and reviewed letter from the Firefighters Association with their recommendation for the Fire Levy appropriations and a letter from the Office of Emergency Services regarding the Fire Levy Funding.

The Commissioners signed letter to Calvin Jones, Mayor and Council Members of the City of Oak Hill informing they have received recommendation for the distribution of the Fire Levy Funds for the proposed new levy from the Fayette County Firefighters Association.

As previously approved, Ms. Holly presented the Commissioners with an order to a adopt Hotel Occupancy Tax; Ms. Holly reported that the order had been reviewed and approved by Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Carl Harris, and Ms. Holly asked the Commission under the definition of hotel if they wanted language to include "bed and breakfast" to make inclusion clear; the Commissioners informed yes.
