The Fayette County Commission met in a regular session on this 6^{th} day of January 2003.

Commissioner Lopez called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioner John H. Lopez made a motion to name Commissioner Matthew D. Wender as President for the year 2003; Commissioner Kenneth L. Eskew seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion was held regarding changing the Commission meeting dates.

Commissioner Wender suggested having two regular meetings per month, the first Monday immediately preceding the 15th of each month at 9:00 a.m. and the last Monday in the month effective March 3, 2003.

Commissioner Wender suggested all day meetings.

Commissioner Wender suggested meeting for the month of January on the 6, 15 and 31, 2003.

Ms. Holly asked Eddie Young, to check to see if Monday, February 3 okay for Board of Equalization and Review, may have to meet prior to the end of January 2003.

The Commissioners suggested Commissioners John Lopez as Purchasing Agent and Deborah Berry designated Assistant Purchasing Agent, suggested and authorized for Charlotte Holly, County Administrator and Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent to make purchases up too \$600.00 prior to County Commission approval for the year 2003. Commissioner Wender suggested notices of the meetings, date, time, place and tentative agenda of all regular scheduled sessions and the date, time, place and purpose of all special sessions shall be made available, in advance as per order.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to accept reorganization order as per discussion. Commissioner Wender seconded. All approved.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to approve and sign as presented exonerations. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and sign a request to combine or divide and segregate land as submitted by the Assessor's Office. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to approve paying \$1,500.00 to the City of Montgomery to facilitate the replacement of the roof drainage system and related roof structure. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved. Check to be released today.

Commissioner Lopez informed the Commissioners he thought Shirley Roberts, Mayor of Pax would be in today, if so, any request she may have, Commissioner Lopez asked the Commission to consider in Budget Session.

Commissioner Lopez informed the Commissioners the County has no Dog Warden at this time. Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners he received a call Saturday morning regarding some dogs. Commissioner Lopez said he called the 911 Center and was told they were not taking dog calls. Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners he called David Neal, E911 Coordinator was told that he was not aware that the 911 Center was not taking calls. Mr. Neal told Commissioner Lopez the call should have been passed on to the closest deputy. Commissioners Lopez told the Commissioners that the deputy is not able to take the dogs.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that the dog warden position is under the Sheriff Department. Ms. Holly told the Commissioners the Sheriff is talking with C-PAC, C-PAC feels they have an employee that could do the job. This has not been addressed by anyone at this time.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners it is her understanding that C-PAC is taking care of the animal calls at this time.

Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners that Deputy Donnie Williams called 911 Center and 911 Center told him to call the Commission.

Commissioner Wender suggested asking Sheriff Laird to appear this afternoon to discuss.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that the Sheriff is working with C-PAC.

Commissioner Wender read legal notice from Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent informing they would be accepting bids for a Bell Saw Mill.

Commissioner Eskew questioned who would do clean up. Mr. Pauley replied they would do the clean up.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that proof of insurance, workers' compensation etc. would have to be provided.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that at their last meeting they approved to advertise.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioners that Jim Hall was sick cannot attend meeting today to discuss mini golf course and slick tracks but if the Commission has any questions they could call Mr. Hall at 465-8370.

Mr. Pauley questioned the Commissioners about the accident problems with vehicles.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioners he and Ms. Holly has talked about having to get three estimates.

Mr. Pauley asked the Commission if it was possible to put Sam's Body Shop on a retainer to use for all the vehicles instead of getting the three estimates.

Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners that Sam's is the cheapest, and he charges \$25.00 per hour others changes more.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioners he's tried to give others a chance, Pat Kessler will not paint vehicles and will not order parts.

Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners that Sam's Body Shop would give priority to the County vehicles.

Commissioner Eskew suggested that a cap of \$2,000 be placed on repairs, anything above the \$2,000 would have to get bids.

Commissioner Wender questioned why Mr. Pauley has to get estimates and not the deputies.

Mr. Pauley replied this way repairs would get done faster. The deputies are too busy.

Commissioner Wender suggested running ad with this request for work, the shop to be inspected by Mr. Pauley.

Commissioner Wender suggested that Mr. Pauley write down what is expected in the ad and bid request.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners he would talk with Sam to see if he would be interested.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she talked with Mr. Pauley

about getting quotes for work not a retainer.

Commissioner Wender suggested stating in the bid that you need a date when they are available to do the work and cost.

Commissioner Wender suggested running ad for work not a retainer.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners he will give information to Ms. Holly on bid for service.

The Commissioners suggested waiting until Jim Hall can be present to discuss mini golf course and slick tracks.

Mr. Pauley requests that the Commission go into Executive Session to discuss personnel matter.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to go into Executive Session. Commissioner Eskew seconded.

Upon reconvening as County Commission meeting Commissioner Lopez made a motion that the employee be suspended with pay until investigation is complete by Sheriff Department. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved.

Kenneth Fox, John David and Bart Jackson with Page-Kincaid Public Service Commission appeared before the Commission to request a grant from the Commission in the amount of \$20,000.00 to flow tests and clean both of their wells in order to restore the quality and quantity of their only water supply.

Mr. Fox told the Commissioners they received a letter about two months ago regarding possibly refinancing loans. Mr. Fox told the Commissioners that parties that have the bond's would have to approve. Mr. Fox asked the Commissioners if they could give him directions on how to do this.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Fox that the first letter came from

the Commission regarding interest rates on bonds. Commissioner Wender informed Mr. Fox that if the rates are higher they would need an Agreement with the Bond holder. Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Fox to contact a Bond Council.

John David asked the Commissioners if they would administer bond issue for Page-Kincaid Public Service District.

Commissioner Lopez asked if the Commission could do this.

Commissioner Wender suggested having Vince Collins, Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney appear at future meeting to see if feasible.

Commissioner Wender asked Dr. David to check with Vince Collins. Dr. David agreed. Carl Harris requested to appear for guidance.

Commissioner Lopez suggested to the Commission to curtail expenditures until Budget Session. Commissioner Lopez informed he does not want the County to be in the red come July 2003.

The Commissioners told Mr. Fox they will take under consideration during Budget Session.

The Commissioners suggested to Mr. Fox to take their request before the current Legislature.

Commissioner Lopez told Mr. Fox that the Fayette County Commission is not in any position to fund this request.

Mr. Fox told the Commissioners that this is not an emergency request, just wanted to take care of the flow testing and cleaning as soon as possible.

Commissioner Lopez asked Mr. Jackson about Page-Kincaid Public Service District reserves. Mr. Jackson replied reserves depleted from the flood. Commissioner Wender suggested first to deal with the bond issue and then ask vendor cost in stages on how to deal with.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Fox before the Commission make a decision they will discuss during Budget Session.

Ms. Holly told Mr. Fox that since this is not an emergency Ms. Holly suggested to Mr. Fox to submit request to budget digest.

Commissioner Wender suggested scheduling a meeting with the Bond Council, check with Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator to see if he could get possible funding elsewhere, ask Legislative for assistance and bring up at Budget Session have an amount needed.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she returned Commissioner Witt's swipe card to the Sheriff Department.

Sheriff William Laird appeared before the Commission to address the Dog Warden issues.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners they need to recruit and fill the Dog Warden position, the Dog Warden would have to be able to work with C-PAC.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners Patti Payne informed him that an employee at the Center would handle until issue could be resolved.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners they need to address the City Councils, deputies are out there the cities enjoying service without helping, service can be improved if the cities worked with the deputies.

Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners and the Sheriff the main problem is communication and suggested to the Sheriff to see if possible get C-PAC in line with the 911 Center and give C-PAC a contact number.

Sheriff Laird asked the Commissioners for time to get with Patti Payne and the 911 Center, will try to look at a package for the cities to review.

Commissioner Wender informed he has talked with Paul Blake, Prosecuting Attorney about C-PAC hiring the Dog Warden, was told by Mr. Blake that the Dog Warden has to be a county employee.

Commissioner Eskew questioned as to why the cities were not responding.

Ms. Holly replied some cities did contribute several years ago. The Fayette County Commission tried to work out a solution.

Commissioner Lopez asked Sheriff Laird about the issues of back pay for officers. Commissioner Lopez asked the Sheriff to share information.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that the Levy does not fund enough to take care of deputies, staffing short.

Commissioner Wender asked about the history of the Law Enforcement Levy.

Sheriff Laird explained how the Levy got started.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners he asked Joe Carelli to sit in on preliminary discussion of back pay.

Sherif Laird told the Commissioners the estimated figures was roughly projected at \$43,000.00 to \$44,000.00.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners he looked at payment sources, would try to prevent a Circuit Court suit.

Commissioner Wender and Commissioner Eskew asked if some of the deputies are no long working as deputes. Sheriff Laird replied yes. Commissioner Wender asked if the County had to pay interest. Sheriff Laird replied deputies would waive interest.

Commissioner Wender asked if other Counties have had the same problem. Sheriff Laird replied this could possibly make become Case Law and has worked with the Prosecuting Attorney and will work with the amount of \$43,000.00-\$44,000.00 and try to work out.

Commissioner Wender told the Sheriff the Commission would like to see worked out amicably and asked the Sheriff to work out a presentation.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly and the Sheriff to look at Levy Funds and the Commission will look at during Budget Session.

Commissioner Wender asked that this be taken care of before March 2003.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners he will draft a memo informing of the procedure.

Commissioner Wender asked the Sheriff to work out over several years if interest does not apply.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners if majority does come from Levy will not make a difference in County budget as long as employee salaries okay to use. Ms. Holly told the Commissioners the Sheriff would need to submit a list.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners expenditures more than what is taking in. Roll back features could make better results.

Commissioner Wender asked the Sheriff to submit proposal and work with Ms. Holly and the Prosecuting Attorney.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to pay outstanding bills. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved. Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she is holding check for Data Design, waiting for a letter from the Prosecuting Attorney's Office.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she is holding a check for ACS to Budget an Accounting waiting for mitigation.

The Commissioners signed checking accounts information sheets for the Branch Banking & Trust(BB&T), Fayette County National Bank, and Bank of Mount Hope, Inc.

Swipe Card Access to side doors was issued to Commissioner Kenneth Eskew.

Mr. Holly presented to the Commissioners letters requesting that meals, authorization, for the Elected Officials to stay at the Charleston Marriott and the Embassy Suite Hotel and Conference Center for the Annual West Virginia Association of Counties meeting being held January 26-28, 2003. Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that since Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk is staying at the Embassy Suites. The cost per night is \$99.00.

The Commissioners received and reviewed claims from Workers' Compensation Division.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a check from Verizon for \$40,149.17, a check from Z-Tel Communications, Inc. for \$2.00, a check from Citizens Telecommunication Company for \$58.38 and a check from Metro-Teleconnect Company for \$35.28 for 911 fees for the month of November.

The Commissioners received and reviewed reimbursements checks from the Town of Fayetteville (\$90.00) and the City of Oak Hill (\$765.00) for jail fees for the month of November. The Commissioners received and reviewed reimbursement check for \$1,500.00 for rent for the Family Law Master Office for the month of December 2002.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a check from the West Virginia Development Office for New Haven Public Service District Water Extension-Paint Creek/Plum Orchard Grant, amount \$40,329.88.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a check for Gasoline Excise Tax 60 Refund, amount \$13,441.65.

The Commissioners received and reviewed reimbursement check for TRIDENT overtime for Garland Burke, \$920.49 for the month of September.

The Commissioners received and reviewed Erie Insurance Group information regarding Garland Burkes vehicle.

Commissioner Wender read order dated December 13, 2002 transferring the balance of the Fayette County General School Fund in the amount of \$154,383.20 for the calendar year 2002, to be transferred to the Fayette County General Fund to defray the balance due said fund for the cost of care and feeding of misdemeanor prisoners incarcerated by magistrates.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that any balance left in the General School Fund would go to the State that's the reason for the transfer.

Ms. Holly read letters from the City of Ansted and the City of Mount Hope requesting that the Fayette County Commission on their behalf request a tap on the Dominion transmission gas line for their community.

Commissioner Wender suggested that Ms. Holly incorporate the two

requests and write a letter to Bob Orndorff, contact Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney to discuss the Hawks Nest issues.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she will give the letter to Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney to draft for the Commissioners and send copies to the City of Ansted and the City of Mount Hope.

Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners he will ask Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent to come to a County Commission meeting in February to discuss status of gas line issue and Mr. Pauley to contact anyone he needs to appear with him.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners for Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator an Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) Grant (\$1,008,457) from the West Virginia Development Office.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to approve and authorize the acceptance of the Resolution. Commission Eskew seconded. All approved. Resolution signed.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners from Mr. Pollard Contract Agreement for the Flex-E-Grant (\$10,000.00).

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion that Commissioner Wender sign contract agreement for the Flex-E-Grant. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received a letter from Michael Dougherty, Extension Specialist regarding the Commission request to review the four administrative/professional positions, to examine the pay levels of all county employees and the final report for the project.

Commissioner Eskew made a motion that the Commission table for future meeting until they have time to read. Commissioner Lopez seconded. All approved.

The Commissioners received and reviewed Weekly Fees Collected from the Fayette County Animal Control Center for the month of December, amount \$895.00 and the Weekly Fees Collected for January 1, 2003-January 2, 2003, amount \$30.00, the Monthly Revenue for the Report of December, and Activity Report for the month of December.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners Trial Balance Reports, estimated Revenue Expenditures for December 31, 2002.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that the Revenue is not the exact amount this is to give the Commissioners an ideal of where the County stands.

Commissioner Wender requested that Ms. Holly review year to date Revenues.

The Commissioners will take an early look at in February at the other line items.

Eddie Young, Chief Tax Assessor asked the Commissioners if they were going to meet for the Board of Equalization and Review hearings on or before February 1, 2003.

The Commissioners discussed their schedule for the Board of Equalization and Review hearings no decisions were made.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she received an invoice form the Fayette County Board of Education for cost of utilities at the Memorial Building for 2001 and 2002. The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to check.

Discussion was held regarding including on the Fayette County commission stationary a picture of the Courthouse.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to contact Bud Hill to get

approval from Carolyn Hill to use her sketch of the courthouse on the Fayette County Commission letterhead.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners from Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent, FEMA reimbursements for new construction work done at the Animal Shelter at the Fayette County Park. Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she forwarded copies to Steve Cruikshank, OES Director and asked him to submit reimbursement to FEMA as soon as possible.

Earl Pauley appeared before the Commission to request that the Commission put on paper what cost are budgeted for the Animal Shelter.

Commissioner Lopez informed the Commissioners they need to get Steve Cruikshank in here to get answers on FEMA reimbursements. Commissioner Lopez informed the Commissioners he was told by Senator Shirley Love that there's a time frame on the reimbursements.

Commissioner Wender suggested asking Mr. Cruikshank to present a written report on the status of all claims broken down by categories, status of deposit, and accounting of funds.

Commissioner Wender asked that Attorney James Blankenship and Jon Lopez, FEMA be present to discuss status on Buy-Outs.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Family Court Judge informing they reviewed a letter from Matt Edwards and believe that the revised Option 2 with the five year period until the rent would come under review again, and the provision that the landlord would provide for minimal garbage collection, is workable and in the best interest of the Supreme Court and Fayette County.

The Commissioners were informed Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney is in the process of preparing lease agreement.

Commissioner Wender questioned the Supreme Court approval of the

increase.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she talked with the Family Law Master and they are in agreement.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that the addendum can cancel the lease between the Fayette County Commission and Matt Edwards.

The Commissioners agreed to Option 2 lease agreement with Matt Edwards.

Commissioner Wender asked to include in the lease agreement the provision subject to approval of the Supreme Court to reimburse County Commission \$9.00 square feet at \$2,025.00 a month.

Commissioner Lopez questioned about the lottery cut to West Virginia.

Commissioner Wender asked about the ambulance service in the Meadow Bridge area.

The Commissioners discussed getting someone to service the area.

Commissioner Wender suggested asking David Neal, E911 Coordinator to contact different ambulance services to see who could service the area.

The Commissioners received and reviewed an estimate from Electro-Tech Service, Inc. for a back up generator at the E911 Center the cost to replace is \$25,000 plus or minus 10%.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she recommended to Mr. Neal to get a second opinion.

The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to have Mr. Neal get dollar amount for second party to inspect the generator and have Mr. Neal give status at next meeting.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Gauley

River Public Service District informing they have been awarded a Governor's Community Partnership Grant in the amount of \$45,000 to assist in the restoration of the Belva Steel Water Storage Tank.

The Gauley River Public Service District is requesting the Commission's commitment of \$5,000 toward this project contingent upon the same commitment from Nicholas County Commission. The Commissioners approved.

Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk appeared before the Commission to request reopening of the door adjoined to the County Clerk's Office.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve opening door adjoined to the County Clerk's Office but keep the front door closed. Commissioner Lopez seconded. All approved.

Mr. Holliday informed the Commission he would like to discuss the future use of the County Clerk's Office, has ideas he needs to address.

Mr. Holliday asked about the status of the copier for the County Clerk's Office.

Kelvin Walker with Appalachian Office Products was present and presented to the Commissioners figures of the cost (\$8,190.00) and information on the copier for the County Clerk's Office.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that the copier in the County Clerk's Office has not been used to capacity.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she would contact American Office System and have them talk with Mr. Holliday.

Commissioner Eskew left at 1:35 p.m.

Commissioner Wender informed he would like minutes today by the next meeting.

The Commissioners approved to purchase two filing cabinets for the County Commission Office.

The Commissioners received and reviewed notice from James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor asking to deduct one day salary from Scott McComas check, he did not work January 3, 2003 and has no sick or annual leave at this time. The Commissioners approved.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the United States Department of the Interior informing they are developing a free management plan that will include preparedness activities, suppression of wildlife and the use of prescribed fire in accordance in National Park Service policies. Copy forwarded to Steve Cruikshank, OES Director and David Neal, E911 Coordinator.

The Commissioners signed order having been advised of the need to substitute certain securities pledged on behalf of the Fayette County National Bank, hereby order the release of said securities provided that securities will be substituted simultaneously and that Fayette County funds deposited with said banking institution will not be unsecured.

The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to prepare calendar for Board of Equalization and Review.

The Commissioners received and reviewed Statement of Expenditures for the Fayette County Park as of December 2002.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from J. Dan Snead and Associates enclosing the final closeout documents for the elevator project (AIA G706A-Contractor's Affidavit of Release of Liens, AIA G706-Contractor's Affidavit of Payment of Debts and Claims, and AIA G707-Consent of Surety Company to Final Payment). The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to call Mr. Snead to see if anything the Commission needed to do regarding the three documents.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Division of Highways regarding an overdue balance for flood related emergency water hauling. Copy forwarded to Steve Cruikshank, OES Director to respond.

The Commissioners received and reviewed Notice of Approval of Evidentiary Materials and release of Funds from the West Virginia Development Office for Paint Creek/Plum Orchard Water Extension Project.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a copy of a notice to David Neal, E911 Coordinator informing that December 29, 2002 is the last day of employment for Michael R. Myers, as a full time Telecommunication Specialist for the 911 Center.

The Fayette County Commission met in a regular session on this 15^{th} day of January 2003.

Commissioner Wender called the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m. Exonerations were approved and signed.

Angie Sleeth with Region 4 Planning and Development Council presented a request for payment for the Small Cities Block Grant New Haven Public Service District Water Extension Project Contract 13, amount \$3,522.63 to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and authorize the payment of services. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous. Resolution signed.

Ms. Sleeth presented a letter to the Commissioners addressed to the West Virginia Development Office requesting 90% (\$9,000) from the Fiscal Year 2002 Flex E-Grant Program for the Tourism Destination Feasibility Study, the Commission will provide a complete accounting for the funds in accordance with the terms and conditions contained in the Flex E-Grant Program Agreement dated January 6, 2003.

Sheriff William Laird and Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney appeared before the Commission to discuss the Military Leave requirements.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners he was notified by Deputy J. R. McMullen that his National Guard unit was recently mobilized and he has been ordered to report on January 30, 2003 for in-processing and training before his further deployment.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners that Sergeant C. R. Bryant and Deputy Sheriff M. A. Webb could also be ordered to report at a later date.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that from his limited research it appears that the "Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act of 1994" ("USERRA") 38 U.S.C. 401 et seq. is the controlling federal statue in defining employer responsibilities during military activations.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners that the minimum requirements are that employers are obligated to maintain the budgeted position and that the returning employee is entitled to the same position and pay grade which the employee would have held if employment had been uninterrupted.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners that from his interpretation of this law, it is clear that employers have no obligation to compensate employees who are performing military service, although some employers have elected to voluntarily compensate employees for the difference between their military pay and what the employee would have received had their employment not been interrupted for military service.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that the provisions of the Federal law may apply to leave benefits, health care coverage, and pension plans. Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that USSERA provides that service members who are on duty for more than 30 days may elect to continue employer-sponsored health care coverage for themselves and their family members for up to 18 months. Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that should this option be exercised, it would appear that the employee can be required to pay increased portions of the full premium cost. Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that this matter would not be an issue since persons activated for military service are qualified to receive their health benefits through the military.

Sheriff Laird discussed with the Commissioners the retirement or pension benefits, Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners it would appear that employees may be required to continue to pay the employee contribution share into the retirement system, however, it would appear that returning service members are to be given an extended period of time in which to repay employee contribution (i.e. three (3) times the period of military service, but no longer than five (5) years).

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that the Consolidated Public Employees Retirement System should be able to provide additional clarification on this.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners he have encouraged the West Virginia Association of Counties to provide some statewide guidance in this matter since it will be important for counties to maintain some consistency in handling this matter.

The Commissioners asked the Sheriff to work with Carl Harris in drafting up a Military Leave Policy by January 31, 2003.

Discussion was held regarding the Regional Jail cost.

Commissioner Wender asked that the Sheriff and Paige Skaggs be placed on the agenda for January 31 to discuss Deputy Sheriff Jesse McMullen reimbursement to the City of Ansted. Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney appeared before the Commission to inform them that he had gotten with Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk, last week to go over Data Design, Inc. invoices.

Mr. Harris recommended to the Commission to pay invoices for \$142,50, \$190.00 423.75, \$142.00 and \$71.25. Mr. Harris informed the Commissioners that the amount they billed for presentation will be taken off, but the per diem expense is in their contract. Mr. Wender,

In response to your e-mail to Charlotte, which was forwarded to me, concerning the request made by Mr. Tim Goode. Currently Quinwood Ambulance Service serves the Meadow Bridge area, primarily from their Greenbrier County locations in Rainelle or Quinwood. Unfortunately, they do not appear to be maintaining the Meadow Bridge station any longer. I am in total agreement that there is a great need for an ambulance service in the Danese-Meadow Bridge area. I have contacted both private providers, General and Jan Care, on multiple occasions. Both companies agree that there is a need for service, however, neither provider is willing to establish a station in that area. I have gone so far as to contact the Fire Department in Danese to solicite an agreement to allow the Ambulance to be housed within the Fire Department. Even with an agreement no action was taken by either company. Mr. Shane Wheeler, Jan Care Ambulance, has stated that they would provide service in that area IF the county would provide a financial subsidy.

In addition to the aforementioned situation, the E-911 Center maintains a log of temporary shortages of ambulance coverage for the entire county. I have enclosed a copy of the log for your review.

In conclusion, I am not aware of any agency or regulation that could be utilized to encourage and/or force coverage issues. If you would like to meet with the representatives from the ambulance companies and me, I will set up a time, date and location. If you require further, let me know. Thank you for your concern in this issue.

The Fayette County Commission met in a special session on this 31st day of January 2003 as Board of Equalization and Review.

Commissioner Wender called the Board of Equalization and Review to order at 9:10 a.m.

No hearings were scheduled.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that the land books for the ensuing year have been prepared and are available for inspection.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she received a letter from Tom Aiello, Assessor, asking the Commission to give him permission to make corrections to the initial assessment roll and that any errors created by the West Virginia Department of Tax and Revenue or by the Assessor of Fayette County be corrected before the 27th day of February 2003.

Commissioner Eskew made a motion to approve Mr. Aiello request to make corrections to the initial assessment roll and that any errors created by the West Virginia Department of Tax and Revenue or by the Assessor of Fayette County be corrected before February 27, 2003. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received a letter from Chuck Barlow, Chief Geologist/Manager with the Department of Tax and Revenue informing they have completed a correction of coal values on certain parcels in Fayette County.

Mr. Barlow informed the Commissioners that these parcels were

inadvertently mapped incorrectly during the initial run of the Reserve Coal Valuation Mode. Mr. Barlow is asking that the Commission give the Department of Tax and Revenue permission to make correction and manually relink each of the affected parcels in Fayette County.

Commissioner Eskew made a motion to adjourn as Board of Equalization and Review. Commissioner Lopez seconded.

The Commissioners reconvened for a Special County Commission meeting at 9:15 a.m.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioner's he received a fax from Doug Hurst informing he had talked with the staff at the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), they have a program called the Earth Team, a volunteer group which works on soil and erosion control projects. The Natural Resource Conservation Service informed that for a first project they would like to plant grass and stream bank shrub species (exact species to be decided under the direction of the NRCS) at the Animal Shelter on Laurel Creek, asked for the Commission support.

The Commissioners informed Earl Pauley they support the Natural Resource Conservation Service to plant grass and stream bank shrub species at the Animal Shelter on Laurel Creek.

The Commissioners signed order to make corrections to the initial assessment roll, that any errors created by the West Virginia Department of Tax and Revenue or by the Assessor be corrected before the 27th day of February 2003.

Ms. Holly presented copies of the outstanding vendor list to the

Commissioners that are to be approved today. The Commissioners told Ms. Holly they would review later this afternoon.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners today in the mail she received from Senator Shirley Love, Budget Digest Request Forms. Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners what projects they wanted to submit this year.

The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to submit requests for additional funding for the purchase and installation of an elevator, including architectural services for the Fayette County Courthouse (\$78,535), funding for scraping and painting exterior woodwork of the Fayette County Courthouse (\$20,000), funding for purchase and install one Generator for the Valley Tower site and one Generator for the Fayette County E911 Center (\$45,000) funding for restoration of a slate roof of historic Fayette County Jail (\$52,000), funding to construct an accessible ramp to improve access to the Courthouse from the adjacent parking lot (\$30,000) and funding for a roof at the Sheriff's Road Office (\$10,200). The Commissioners asked Sheriff Laird to present this to the Legislators this afternoon.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners from David Neal, E911 Coordinator bid specifications for a generator for the E911 Center.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to request bids for a generator for the E911 Center. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that \$5,000.00 had been taken out of Courthouse Expenditures for the Elevator project, Ms. Holly recommended to the Commissioners to take the \$5,000 out of the \$25,000 Governor's Contingency Grant to reimburse the Courthouse Expenditures.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Keith Spangler term of office as a member of the Fayette County New River Gorge Bridge Day Commission expired on August 8, 2002. Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners if they wanted to reappoint Mr. Spangler as a member. The Commissioners replied yes.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to reappoint Keith Spangler a member of the Fayette County New River Gorge Bridge Day Commission. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous. Order and letter of appointment signed.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Eddie Young, Chief Deputy Assessor informing of Penny Begley overpayment of taxes on Account #9000513, 10-02-15-132.002, amount \$697.22 and recommending that Ms. Begley be given a credit on future taxes.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Berry to talk with the Sheriff.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Cruikshank if the Fayette County Firefighters Association would consider giving Mr. Berry a vehicle.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Berry to let the Commission know how the discussion went with Sheriff Laird and asked Mr. Berry to make a written request to the Fayette County Firefighters Association.

Commission Wender asked Mr. Berry to submit a written proposal to the Commission they would consider for the 2003-2004 Budget.

Brian Sparks, Agricultural Agent, Brent Clark, 4-H Youth Development Instructor, Karen Arrington, Nutrition Outreach Instructor, and Diane Meadows, Family Consumer Service Agent appeared before the Commission to give an update of the activities going on at the West Virginia University Extension Office.

Ms. Holly presented a copy of a Claim Details from the Hartford Specialty Company to the Commissioners. Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that the amount of the expenses paid is \$2,626.84. Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners he got another grant to Digitize Flood Maps, would be classed Q4. Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners that Fayette County would be the first in the State with Q4 mapping. Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners this would take over a year before they would be able to produce some maps.

The Commissioners asked that Steve Cruikshank be put on the agenda February 21, 2003 at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Cruikshank if he had some kind of an outline of the mapping plans.

Commissioner Lopez asked Mr. Cruikshank about the rent on the temporary Animal Shelter.

Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners that he would have something in writing on February 14, 2003 regarding the FEMA drawdowns.

Commissioner Eskew made a motion to approve outstanding vouchers. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Eddie Young, a member of the Ben Argento Basketball League appeared before the Commissioners to show their appreciation and thanks for the use of the Fayette County Memorial Building for their Basketball League. Mr. Young presented coffee mugs as tokens of their appreciation to the Commissioners.

The Fayette County Commission met in Regular Session on this 5th day of February 2003.

Commissioner Wender called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m.

The Commissioners received and reviewed the two applications for the custodian position. The Commissioners suggested asking James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor to interview and give his recommendation to the Commission.

Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator, introduced to the Commissioners Lisa Creger, his secretary from 4-C Economic Development Authority to work in his office.

Commissioner Wender presented to the Commissioners a request for office supplies from Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator; fax machine \$80, 3 laser printers (one for Randy Housh, one for the new 4-C Employee, and one for his intern) the cost of the printers is \$175.00 each for a total of \$525.00, monitor for intern \$150.00 and two surge strips \$15.00 each total \$30. Total cost of supplies is \$785.00.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to approve office supplies for David Pollard, County Resource Coordinator, amount \$785.00. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved.

Sharon Cruikshank, Director of the New River Convention and

Visitor Bureau appeared before the Commission and presented a packet of the fliers and brochures that were given out during the Year 2003.

Ms. Cruikshank informed the Commissioners that the New River Convention and Visitors Bureau receives assistance from the City of Oak Hill, the Town of Fayetteville and the Town of Ansted.

Ms. Cruikshank asked the Commissioners if they would continue their support and funding for 2003-2004 budget. Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Cruikshank what did the Commission fund last year. Ms. Cruikshank replied \$3,500.00.

The Commissioners informed Ms. Cruikshank they would take under advisement during the 2003-2004 Budget Session.

Tom Aiello, Assessor presented a draft of the Tax Increment Financing in West Virginia to the Commissioners.

Mr. Aiello informed the Commissioners that this will go through a public comment period. Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners he would relay any comments back to Charleston.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent, presented a contract agreement with Allegheny Power and Equitable production Company for natural gas service to the Fayette County Park to the Commissioners.

Mr. Pauley presented the requirements and options for the natural gas to the Fayette County Park to the Commissioners.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners a Limited Service Agreement signed by Allegheny Power, Equitable Gas and the Fayette County Commission will be required; Allegheny Power will provide the material and labor necessary for the construction of the regulator station; Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners they have two Options 1-Pipeline to be

owned by Allegheny Power the County would have to sign a Customer Install/Acquire Agreement; Option 2-Pipeline to be owned by the County, Allegheny Power will provide a part-time pipeline inspector and will fuse, test and tie in all mains, Allegheny Power will inspect every five (5) years, the County will provide the ditch, backfill, material, labor permits, and anything else required for the installation of the main line extension.

Mr. Pauley presented a list of items for the County to consider when determining ownership of the proposed pipeline to the Commissioners: <u>Allegheny Power Facility</u>: Response time for pipeline dig ins and request for service, State and Federal compliance issues for leak inspection, System expertise. <u>County Facility</u>: Single monthly meter charge, ability to extend service with bolt-on tapping tees and stab couplings, ability to contract services with Allegheny Power.

Commissioner Wender informed that independent of the contract, Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to write a letter to Allegheny Power asking that they verify in writing their approval of the County's request to delay the commencement of construction until late fall, 2003, clarify who pays for line inspections if owned by the County, and clarify responsibility for line maintenance and who pays associated costs if owned by the County.

Commissioner requested a letter to Equitable Gas Company requesting they provide gas free of charge to the Fayette County Park facilities for as long as the gas wells located at the park are producing, and asked that they confirm the validity of the Limited

Service Agreement for gas service at the Fayette County Park.

The Commissioners decided to discuss Lease Contract this afternoon with Paul Blake, Prosecuting Attorney or Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney.

The Commissioners informed Mr. Pauley they received no bids on the log sawing bid.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that the person who contracts would have to have insurance.

Mr. Pauley asked the Commissioners about the county moving the logs to the saw mill.

Commissioner Lopez asked Mr. Pauley how much liability would cost.

Commissioner Wender suggested to the Commission to rebid and change the bid to read: Bids are to be stated so much per thousand feet. Delivery of logs and pick up of sawed lumber will be performed by the County. Anyone wishing to bid these logs can see the logs at the Fayette County Park.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to rebid log sawing bid and change the bid stating that delivery of logs and pick up of sawed lumber will be performed by the County. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved.

The Commissioner asked Mr. Pauley to do hauling.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley the status of the Animal Shelter.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that due to the weather they have not been able to do anything, plumbing and windows already on

sight.

Ms. Holly asked Steve Cruikshank, OES Director if any drawdowns have been submitted for the Animal Shelter.

Mr. Cruikshank informed that because of the Hazard Mitigation Program Buyouts submitting drawdowns for the Animal Shelter have been put on the back burner. Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners he would have to get back to working on the drawdowns for the Animal Shelter.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that since Tammy Gill is no longer employed at the Fayette County Park he has only one Certified Pool Operator. Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners he would contact the Fayette County Health Department to see if they know anyone with a Certified Pool Operator Certification.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioner he needs two (2) cash registers (one for the pool and one for the canteen).

The Commissioners told Mr. Pauley they would take up in the 2003-2004 budget session and asked Mr. Pauley to get some description of the cash register.

Steve Cruikshank, OES Director appeared before the Commissioners to present a proposal and contract for the Hazard Mitigation Planning Grant (HMPG).

Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners of the difficulties he's having in trying to get the mapping part done.

Mr. Holly asked Mr. Cruikshank if the Commission could download the maps off the website.

The Commissioners suggested to Mr. Cruikshank to contract with

Mark Ehrnschwender.

The Commissioners suggested that a special meeting for February 10 be scheduled to discuss further.

Commissioner Lopez suggested to Mr. Cruikshank to work on outstanding reimbursements for FEMA.

Commissioner Eskew made a motion to contract with Mark Ehrnschwender to work with Mr. Cruikshank on getting the computer to download the information for the mapping for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. Commissioner Lopez seconded. All approved.

Bart Jackson and Kenneth Fox with Page-Kincaid Public Service District appeared before the Commission to ask if they would be the sponsors for a Small Cities Block Grant for the Ingram Branch area.

Mr. Jackson told the Commissioners that a three and a half million-dollar grant is in place with the United States Department of Agriculture.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that the Fayette County Commission sponsor the Small Cities Block Grant for the Page-Kincaid Public Service District Ingram Branch area. Commissioner Lopez seconded. All approved.

Tim Richardson and James Perdue appeared before the Commission to discuss the security windows at the Fayette County Memorial Building.

Mr. Richardson explained to the Commissioners how the windows were measured incorrectly.

After a brief discussion, Commissioner Lopez made a motion to accept bid from Fayette Awning for the purchase of security windows (\$2,160.00) at the Fayette County Memorial Building and approved for

complained to PVC, have employed an individual contractor to come and look at the methodology that's currently being utilized by the Department of Tax and Revenue at the Counties expense, was told they agree in concept with the Assessor's complaint but there is nothing on the books in the way of correcting the problem at this time.

Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners that the problems he has with some of the methodology that's being applied to valuation of reserved coal and other minerals have to do with just what we're witnessing here this morning.

Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners that when he is given the values from the Department of Tax and Revenue and he is supposed to notify taxpayers that these are the values that they can expect to see and they can expect to pay taxes on and then those value changes before the Assessor's Office can get the 10% notices out to the taxpayers, Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners he has a problem with that, Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners it is a violation of the law, when the letters go out the values that go out on those letters are supposed to be the values that we deal with.

Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners that when the glitch in the system occurs it makes it impossible for him to give numbers to the Commissioners that they could use to derive values from that they could operate this County.

Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners for this reason there are issues they need to pay very close attention to; and not summarily let the values fall where they may because what appears today could be an increase in value and when the hearings are over with there very well

might be a terrible decrease.

Mr. Aiello asked the Commissioners to watch very closely and he would continue to protest with the Department of Tax and Revenue and to the Property Valuation Training and Committee Procedure and anyone else that will listen.

Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners they will assist in anyway they can and he knows the representative from the State will do everything in their power to try and get these values as close to correct as they can.

Mr. Aiello told the Commissioners he just wanted this to go on record.

The State Tax Department and Bill Keeney informed the Commissioners they were ready to make recommendations.

Mr. Keeney informed the Commissioners they discussed the four biggest parcels, one for Midvale Colliery Company and three for Imperial Colliery Company. Core drill and maps have been provided to the State Tax Department.

Dick Martin, City Manager for the City of Oak Hill appeared before the Commission to request that the Commissioners sign an order to take William Clagget Price out of the city limits.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she talked with John Witt and he informed her he could get it cheaper, all he needs was the model number. Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she did tell Judge Hatcher's secretary to pass this information to Judge Hatcher. Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that the Judge needs to get with Mr. Witt to discuss.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that John Witt replaces the microphone in the courtroom amount not to exceed \$500.00. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Sheriff Bill Laird appeared before the Commission to discuss the Deputies back pay.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners the cost would be \$49,000,

and he would pay \$19,000 from the Concealed Weapon fund and \$30,000 from the Excess Levy Fund.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners no matters have been filed before the Civil Service Commission and he proposed to the Commissioners that in the best interest of the taxpayers to release to the individual deputies the back pay owed.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to pay the back pay to the deputies, amount \$49,000; \$30,000 to be paid from the Excess Levy Fund, and \$19,000 to be paid from the Concealed Weapon Fund, and the Prosecuting Attorney to draft a release for each individual deputy to sign, this is to be paid the second half of March. The Commissioners received and reviewed from the County Commissioners' Association of WV updates and Legislative Line-up Final Bills introduced.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a check from the West Virginia Development Office for Legislative Digest Grant 02-474, Fayette County Sheriff's Department, amount \$1,856.00. The Commissioners received and reviewed from Charter Communications franchise tax remittance covering the period from January 1, 2002 to December 31, 2002, amount \$1,551.99.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners he has included the PERS increase, requesting the mandatory longevity increase for Law Enforcement, five vehicles will work with Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent to address the motor fleet needs under the Surplus Contract bid fleet less than \$20,000.00, request to continue Hepatis B vaccination, requests roof replacement at Road Office, additional funding for the Animal Shelter.

Sheriff Laird talked to the Commissioners about the Regional Jail Expenses, Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners since 1994 the per diem rate has had four increases over the past nine years.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners in Fiscal Year 2002 the actual expense for the housing of Fayette County inmates at the Southern Regional Jail totaled \$725,257.25 or a 33% increase in expenses over the prior Fiscal Year, in Fiscal Year 2003, current projection will likely total \$784, 080.00 by the end of the year.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners they should consider an alternative program.

Sheriff Laird discussed with the Commissioners the Home Confinement program.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that in seeking to determine what responsible options may be available for the stabilization and reduction of the growing expenditures, he presented to the Commissioners a report. Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that one option that may be available for our county would be the possible establishment of a Community Corrections Program.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners they need to move forward with this program.

The Commissioners asked Sheriff Laird to draft a letter to the Judges, Magistrates and the Prosecuting Attorney and inform them of the increase cost for the confinement of inmates at the Southern Regional Jail and ask that they review the report for purposes of providing the Commission with their thoughts and ideas concerning the possible establishment of a community correction program in Fayette County and in the next few days, the Commission would like to schedule a meeting to fully review and discuss the potential of establishing such a program.

The Commissioners thanked Sheriff Laird for his cooperation and asked for his continued support.

Tom Aiello, Assessor, appeared before the Commission to discuss his budget for the Fiscal Year 2003-2004.

Larry Parsons, Dave Wood, Bill Toney, Don Plumley, members of the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority and Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney was present to discuss the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority plans for enforcing Mandatory Garbage Disposal.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Parsons to give an update.

Mr. Parsons told the Commissioners he was here for guidance.

Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney told the Commissioners he has gone through the draft of the Mandatory Garbage Enforcement Plan and has made some changes. Mr. Harris told the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority members and the Commission that he has reviewed the Code and in the Regulations there is no mention that the County Commission has to regulate the Mandatory Garbage Guidelines it's all up to the Solid Waste Authority.

Commissioner Wender asked that this be taken out of the C-PAC allocations they receive from the Commission.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and authorize C-PAC to take out of their allotment provided it's within their budget for Stacy Workman to attend the National Animal Control Association Academy Training. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she talked with Earl Pauley,

Park Superintendent regarding recommendations of whether to saw the logs on-site or off-site and regarding the contractor providing a valid business/contractor license and proof of workers compensation but she has not heard from Mr. Pauley.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the St. Paul's Property and Liability informing the claim received on April 22, 2002 (Kenneth Young and Stephanie Young) involving Officer Mark Webb has been concluded.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the West Virginia Development Office informing they are unable to accommodate the request from the 2002 allocations for the application regarding Page-Kincaid Public Service District Ingram Branch Sewer Extension-SALS Dormitory Annex/Courthouse Elevator.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a fax from Commissioner Wender to Ronald Elliot requesting information on how he could contact Chuck Kurzna to prepare a property description for the property at Minden bottom that would be used for a park.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Committee to Commemorate the Annual Children's Memorial Flag Day

Ms. Holly asked the Commission if they wanted to discuss the Memorial Building Committee or the Park and Recreation Committee. Commissioner Wender suggested holding until Commission Lopez can get a person from the Valley District to be appointed.

Discussion was held regarding hiring Allan Ballard as Memorial Building Manager to handle all scheduling and taking care of the Memorial Building. Commissioner Wender told the Commission he would talk with Gary Hough and coordinator with Mr. Ballard. The Commissioners discussed a salary of \$1,500 a month.

The Commissioners received and reviewed from the County Commissioners' Association of West Virginia the results of the 2003 Legislative Session.

The Commissioners signed a letter to Shannon Estep, President, Fayette County Firemen's Association requesting that he meet with the members of the Fayette County Fire Chiefs Association and ask them to intervene in the matter to resolve the complaints alleged by Ken Roop regarding the Gauley River Volunteer Fire Department.

Commissioner Wender signed a letter to Jerry Keffer, President Arbuckle Public Service District informing that the Commission is

committed to doing all possible to see that solutions are reached which enable Arbukle Public Service District to move forward with the expenditures of Governor's Contingency Fund.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commission has scheduled an April 8 sit-down for the parties (time as yet undetermined) and would appreciate your input on anyone you think should be involved and requesting that your engineering firm send all reports and plans it has gathered on the short-term and long-term project to Pio Lombardo and Associates.

The Commissioners signed a letter to Senator Love thanking him and Delegates David Perry and John Pino for their work in securing Governor's Contingency Fund dollars to assist the Arbuckle Public Service District and informing they has scheduled a sit-down with Arbuckle Public Service District and a consortium of engineers to make certain that the decision reached to solve the immediate problem is one that will also benefit the Arbuckle Public Service District and its customers in the long-term.

The Commissioners recessed for lunch at 12:20 p.m.

Upon returning from lunch Commissioner Lopez offered a motion that the County Commission meeting be adjourned. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners reconvened at 1:40 p.m. as a Budget Work Session to work on Budget for Fiscal Year 2003-2004. The secretary was excused.

FAYETTE COUNTY COMMISSION SPECIAL SESSION MARCH 14, 2003 COURTHOUSE FAYETTEVILLE, WV 25840 MEMBERS Present: Matthew D. Wender, John H. Lopez, Kenneth L. Eskew

The Fayette County Commission met in a special session on this 14th day of March 2003.

Commissioner Wender called the meeting to order at 9:25 a.m. Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve outstanding bills. Commissioner Lopez seconded. All approved.

The Commissioners signed a letter to Sandra Squire, Executive Secretary with the West Virginia Public Service Commission informing they support the agreement made between the Danese and Meadow Bridge Public Service Districts in regard to providing water service to the Beelick Knob area of Fayette County and concur with the agreement to provide a master meter connection between Danese and Meadow Bridge in order to secure a second water source.

The Commissioners discussed the type of letterhead to be used for the County Commission office.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent, appeared before the Commission to discuss his Budget for Fiscal Year 2003-2004.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners of the cut backs made to his Budget, Certified Pool Operations (CPO's) changed from 12 weeks to 10 weeks, lifeguards from 10 at \$5.15 to 8 at \$6.15, Athleyne Grimmett part-time at \$6.15, \$10,712.00 to full-time for \$10,792.00 only during the season, raising the four part-time employees from \$5.15 an hour to \$6.15 an hour, two cash registers, one with a scanner at \$2,085.00.

Commissioner Wender suggested changing the four part-time

positions to four full-time positions plus benefits, and hiring one CPO instead of two.

The Commissioners told Mr. Pauley they would work on. Steve Cruikshank, OES Director, appeared before the Commission. Discussion was held regarding the complaints against the Gauley River Volunteer Fire Department alleged by Ken Roop.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Cruikshank if this was a matter that should be addressed in the by-laws.

Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners if a complaint is made to a Fire Department that has existing by-laws the Fayette county Commission is not qualified to do anything, it's up to that Fire Department.

Mr. Cruikshank asked the Commissioners if they would consider giving Lynn Holstine a raise for this Fiscal Year Budget 2003-2004.

The Commissioners told Mr. Cruikshank they were not giving raises this year.

Commissioner Wender asked Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer, if there were anything in the unified development code concerning "special event/mass gatherings."

Mr. Richardson told the Commissioners that there was nothing in the unified development code addressing this matter, but told the Commissioners that back in July 2001 they had requested that Sheriff William Laird draft a document to address these needs, and out of this request an amendment to the zoning ordinance which was titled "Zoning Ordinance Amendment, Special Event/Mass Gatherings, Article XIV, Section 1424."

Mr. Richardson told the Commissioners they could make a request

to the Planning and Zoning Commission to amend the unified development code to include this document "Special Events/Mass Gatherings" in its entirety, thus covering any concerns for Fayette County in respect to functions of this time.

The Commissioners asked Mr. Richardson to draft the letter to the Planning and Zoning Commission requesting they address an amendment concerning "special event/mass gatherings" existing at this time in RA zones is the need to apply for a special use permit, approved by the Board of Zoning appeals and they feel that it would be appropriate that our present unified development code is amended to include this document "special event/mass gatherings" in its entirety, this covering any concerns for Fayette County in respect to functions of this time.

The Commissioners signed a letter to the West Virginia Housing Development Fund requesting assistance for a \$75,000 grant from the West Virginia Housing Development Fund regarding the implementation of building codes.

The Commission meeting was adjourned at 10:36 a.m.

Commissioner Wender asked that the secretary be excused.

The Commissioners reconvened as a Budget Work Session to work on the Budget for Fiscal Year 2003-2004.

FAYETTE COUNTY COMMISSION REGULAR SESSION MARCH 24, 2003 COURTHOUSE FAYETTEVILLE, WV 25840 MEMBERS Present: Matthew D. Wender, John H. Lopez, Kenneth L. Eskew

The Fayette County Commission met in a regular session on this 24^{th} day of March 2003.

Commissioner Wender called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. Commissioner Wender informed they were here today to adopt the Budget for Fiscal Year 2003-2004.

Commissioner Wender gave a summary of last year's Budget compared to this year's budget. Commissioner Wender informed that there is an increase in revenue this year.

Present for the adoption of the Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Budget were Sheriff William Laird, Paul Blake, Prosecuting Attorney, Thelma Kincaid, Circuit Clerk, Thomas Aiello, Assessor and Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk.

Ms. Holly reviewed and explained to each individual elected official their budget of what was approved for this Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Budget.

Tom Aiello, Assessor appeared before the Commission to get the final results of his Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Budget request.

Ms. Holly told Mr. Aiello that the Commissioners is picking up the PEIA increase and the increase of PERS employers' contribution, and employees' salaries the same, total Assessor's budget \$355,000. The Commissioners asked Mr. Aiello if he had any problem with this budget. Mr. Aiello replied no.

Thelma Kincaid, Circuit Clerk appeared before the Commission to get the final results of her Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Budget request.

Ms. Holly told Ms. Kincaid that the Commissioners is picking up the PEIA increase and the increase of PERS employers' contribution, employees' salaries the same, Ms. Holly told Ms. Kincaid that her PEIA decreased from \$37,000 to \$27,000 from last year; total Circuit Clerk's budget \$263,000. The Commissioners asked Ms. Kincaid if she had any problem with this budget. Ms. Kincaid replied no.

Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk appeared before the Commission to get the final results of his Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Budget request.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Holliday that the Commission did not address funding for the record's management proposal and suggested to Mr. Holliday to get information on what the State will propose. Commissioner Wender told Mr. Holliday the Commission is picking up the PEIA increase and the increase of PERS employers' contribution, increased his book line to \$13,250.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Holliday that his employee's salaries were reduced as a result of him transferring the payroll clerk to the County Commission budget, total County Clerk's budget is \$267,226. The Commissioners asked Mr. Holliday if he had any problem with this budget. Mr. Holliday informed the Commission he was disappointed that the Commission did not consider funding the record back up proposal.

Paul Blake, Prosecuting Attorney appeared before the Commission to get the final results of his Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Budget request.

Ms. Holly told Mr. Blake that the Commission is picking up the

PEIA increase and the increase of PERS employers' contribution, eliminated the investigator position and added a position for an assistant. The Commissioners told Mr. Blake that his total budget is \$487,711.

William Laird, Sheriff appeared before the Commission to get the final results of his Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Budget request.

Ms. Holly told Sheriff Laird that the Commission is picking up the PEIA increase and the increase of PERS employers' contribution, increases in longevity pay, plugged in three new cruisers.

Ms. Holly told Sheriff Laird that the Tax Office total is \$295,532, Law Enforcement is \$355,793, Transportation Officers, \$83,044, Regional Jail \$763,320, Dog Warden's same, Coal Severance \$64,188, Lawn Enforcement Levy \$619,905.

Paul Blake, Prosecuting Attorney expressed his appreciation to the Commissioners and informed the Commissioners the Prosecuting Attorney Office would continue to work with the Commission.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to adopt the Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Budget. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners signed a letter to the West Virginia Auditor certifying that the elected officials are in agreement that for cost/savings and efficiency purposes, the policy for the purchase of commodities for various Fayette County Departments has been that the Office of the County Commission is the central purchasing office.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that for the next Fiscal Year Fayette County classification would change from Class 4 to Class 3.

The Commissioners approved to meet the third Tuesday in April to

lay the Levy.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve outstanding bills and payrolls. The payroll is to be released on March 28. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve the revised minutes of February 5, 10, and 14, 2003. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners due to the death of Sam Dorado, a member of the Planning and Zoning Commission a vacancy exists on the Planning and Zoning Commission. Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners he would like to appoint George Smith to fill the vacancy.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to appoint George Smith to the Planing and Zoning Commission. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to appoint John Witt, Ray Londeree, Charlie Jones, Carl Harris and Brad Carelli to the Fayette County Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Board for a four-year term.

Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners he met with Chuck Kurzyna, PE, PS, New River Engineering, Inc. to discuss the Minden Community Park project.

Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners he has nothing in writing, but Berwind Land Company said they will give the property to the County for the Minden Community Park project.

Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners he would like to request that the Commission approve a quote from New River

Engineering, Inc. to survey the Minden property. The cost for the survey is \$3,375 to include the topographical survey and mapping the cost would be increased by \$855, total amount \$4,230.

Commissioner Lopez told the Commission he thinks that cost is too high. Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners he has no problem with getting the property surveyed and suggested asking Leon Spencer.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to allow New River Engineering, Inc. to proceed with topographical survey and mapping work for the Minden Community Park project, cost \$4,230. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners that something needs to be done regarding the houses that the County purchased in the buy-out. People are still living in the houses. Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners that one of the houses that was bought in the buy-out teenagers is living in.

Commissioner Wender suggested asking Steve Cruikshank, OES Director to give a status on the twenty-eight properties and ask Mr. Cruikshank what steps are being taken to moving the people out of these houses.

Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer appeared before the Commission to present a zoning hearing. Commissioner Wender informed that this hearing is being recorded.

Mr. Richardson presented Case #Z-494-03-1: Request of Charles F. and Brenda G. DeBord, owners, for a change in land classification from B-2 (Business Local District) to B-3 (Business, Tourism District) on Surf. Dogwood Ridge 45.89 ac, Route 60, New Have District.

Mr. Richardson told the Commissioners that the Planning Commission approved the request by a vote of 11-0.

The DeBord's were present, stating they currently operate a bed and breakfast and would request this rezoning to accommodate construction of quality, upscale cabins containing cedar and stone finish. Mr. DeBord informed the Commissioners the cabins would be built for rental units and could be sold as a single family dwelling if necessary. Mr. DeBord told the Commissioners his plans are to construct up to 12 of these units, and cost per unit construction will be approximately \$100,000.

The Commissioners asked if there were any opposition on this request. Mr. Richardson replied no.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to accept recommendation of the Planning Commission to approve request to change land classification from B-2 (Business Local District) to B-3 (Business, Tourism District). Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

No other business, the zoning portion of the County Commission meeting was adjourned.

Jenny Woodson, Program Coordinator and Robert Logus, Director with the Project Community Access appeared before the Commission to introduce this Agency that's new to the Fayette County area.

Ms. Woodson told the Commissioners the Community Access, Inc. is a non-profit Agency based in Charleston, devoted primarily to job placement and training for individuals with disabilities.

Ms. Woodson told the Commissioners that the purpose of Project Community Access is to assist Temporary Assistance to Needy Families

(TANF) recipients who have mental, physical or emotional challenges or those who present with multiple barriers to finding and maintaining employment.

Ms. Woodson told the Commissioners they are serving 22 cases in the Fayette and Raleigh Counties areas.

Mr. Woodson introduced Robert Logus, Director of Project Community Access for Fayette County.

Commissioner Wender told Ms. Woodson that this program is similar to the Multi-Cap program. Commissioner Wender suggested to Ms. Woodson to talk with Multi-Cap.

Discussion was held regarding Robert Williams, janitor for the County Commission.

Ms. Holly presented a claim from the Workers' Compensation Division that Mr. Williams had filed to the Commissioners.

The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to have James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor to put in writing the days he missed, how long he stayed and days he didn't call in.

The Commissioners told Ms. Holly to protest the Worker's Compensation claim.

The Commissioners told Ms. Holly that since Robert Williams is on a 6-month probationary period have James Perdue to make recommendation regarding whether or not to keep as an employee.

The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to talk with Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney or Paul Blake, Prosecuting Attorney regarding this matter.

The Commissioners asked James Perdue how much it would cost for

him and Allan Ballard to scrap and paint windows around the Courthouse.

Mr. Perdue told the Commissioners they would work 10 to 12 hours a day plus Saturday at \$25.00 an hour, the equipment would cost \$4,399 plus another \$10,000 total approximate cost would be \$17,999.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners when they advertised for bids two years ago they received a bid of \$13,875.00.

The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to contact 1st bidders and asked Commissioner Eskew to check with Steve Pilato to see if he would send a bid.

The Commissioners approved purchase of two cast aluminum fixtures for the courthouse sidewalk lights, cost \$178.76.

The Commissioners adjourned for lunch at 12:00 noon.

The Commissioners reconvened County Commission meeting at 1:05 p.m.

Commissioner Lopez asked Ms. Holly to check into changing boundaries of Chimney Corner from the New Haven District back to Valley District and put Beckwith back in the New Haven District.

Ms. Holly told Commissioner Lopez she will be taking the budget down to Charleston and she will talk with someone in the Redistricting Office regarding this matter.

The Commissioners received and reviewed the Annual Cost Allocation for the Fayette County Memorial Building. Commissioner Wender asked that a copy be forwarded to Carl Harris, Eddie Young, and Tim Richardson.

The Commissioners signed order and appointment letters appointing

John L. Witt, Ray Londeree, Charlie Jones, Carl Harris and Brad Carelli to the Fayette County Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Board.

The Commissioners signed order and appointment letter appointing George Smith a member of the Planning and Zoning Commission.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a fax from the Southern Appalachian Labor School asking that the Commission send a letter of support for the plans to seek a Housing Preservation Grant from USDA Rural Development.

The Commissioners signed a letter to the Southern Appalachian Labor School expressing their support of the plans to seek a Housing Preservation Grant for USDA Rural Development.

The Commissioners signed a letter to the Fayette County Planning and Zoning Commission asking that the present unified development code is amended to include the document "Special Events/Mass Gatherings" in its entirety.

The Commissioners signed invoices for the confinement of inmates at the Southern Region Jail for the City of Mount Hope (\$180.00), Town of Fayetteville (\$90.00), and the City of Oak Hill (\$225.00).

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that the West Virginia Association of Counties Spring Board is being held June 1 through June 3.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she received a check for \$4,500.00 from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that the checks for the Deputy Sheriff's back wages are included in today's invoices.

The Commissioners approved overtime for James Perdue, Maintenance

Supervisor.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that Virgil Berry, American Red Cross Chairman had called, wanted to know what information was received from Jim Lively Insurance regarding county owning the American Red Cross vehicle.

Commissioner Wender suggested that the Commissioners write a letter to Jim Lively Insurance to inquire on what it would cost the County to add one more vehicle to their policy if the American Red Cross be responsible for the maintenance.

Commissioner Lopez suggested setting down and talking with Virgil Berry regarding this matter.

Commissioner Wender informed if the Commission gets word back from Jim Lively Insurance saying the County can own and insure the vehicle for the American Red Cross, the American Red Cross would be responsible for paying the deductible.

The Commissioners received a letter from Sheriff William Laird forwarding a letter he received from Ronnie Booker, Coordinator for TRIDENT Drug Task Force offering to contribute \$11,000 toward the purchase of a new vehicle for Fayette County Deputy Denny Bennett, who is currently assigned to this Task Force. The Commissioners approved.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners this would be ½ cost of one of the three new vehicles they approved for Fiscal Year 2004. Sheriff Laird approved.

The Commissioners received a letter from Sheriff Laird informing he has been contacted by TRIDENT Drug Task Force advising him of their interest and desire to sell the 1987 Jeep at a public auction.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that this vehicle was titled in the name of the Fayette County Sheriff's Department to be used in the TRIDENT Drug Task Force.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners to proceed with this sale, he would ask that the original title to this vehicle be forwarded to his office so that it may be made available for endorsement to the purchaser. The Commissioners approved.

The Commissioners signed camp letters from the Fayette County Park to Graydon Baptist, Fayette County 4-H Camp, Tom Cashen, Camp Kismet, Black Diamond Girl Scouts, and Boy Scouts.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the West Virginia Housing Development Fund informing that Governor Wise announced the new Employer Assisted Mortgage program sponsored by the West Virginia Housing Development Fund in August 2002. The program is designed to allow employers in the public and private sector to participate in providing affordable housing opportunities for their employees.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a report from Randy Housh, Housing Consultant giving an update regarding the current allocation and disbursement of Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funds in Fayette County, by Multi-Cap, Inc. and to report the content and outcome of a recent meeting he attended with Lloyd Casto, Interim Executive Director of Multi-Cap and Bob Carleton, Interim Financier

Director of Multi-Cap, Inc.

The Fayette County Commission met in a regular session on this 15th day of April 2003.

Commissioner Wender called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. Commissioner Lopez made a motion that payroll and outstanding bills are approved. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Beldon Lafferty and wife Melanie appeared before the Commission to informed them that they had talked with Tom Aiello, Assessor regarding their property taxes and he informed them that they were due a tax credit.

Eddie Young informed the Commissioners that when their tax ticket came out the property was classified as Class 4. Mr. Lafferty bought property after the assessment date.

Mr. Young informed the Commissioners that the Assessor's Office will exonerate the whole amount. Property will be changed from Class 4 to Class 2.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve recommendation of the Assessor's Office to exonerate and change Mr. Lafferty's property from Class 4 to Class 2. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Exonerations were approved and signed.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners he received a letter from Philip Tissue, attorney for the New Haven Public Service District informing that the terms of Loren Fox and Roma Lively expire

on June 3, 2003 and the members are requesting that the Commission reappoint Loren Fox and Roma Lively to new terms on the New Haven Public Service District.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that the Fayette County Historic Landmark Commission is requesting that the Commission advance the \$10,000 to the Fayette County Historic Landmark Commission and send a letter to the West Virginia Development Office on behalf of the Fayette County Historic Landmark Commission requesting a first and final drawdown for the Marquis De LaFayette statue for reimbursement for contractual services, amount \$10,000.

Angie Sleeth, with Region 4 Planning and Development Council presented a request for payment for the New Haven Public Service District Water Extension project Contract #13, amount \$3,983.72 and Contract #12, amount \$12, 795.04 to the Commission.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and authorize the payment of services for Contracts #12 and #13. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous. Resolution signed.

Ms. Holly introduced the new Dog Warden, Stacy Workman to the Commissioners.

Brent Clark, 4-H Youth Development Instructor, Diane Meadows, Family and Consumer Science Agent appeared before the Commissioners.

Mr. Clark informed the Commissioners that before he discusses the

camp fees he would like to inform them that the Fayette County Extension Office has the opportunity to purchase a Dell Opti-Plex computer for half price at a discounted cost. Mr. Clark informed the Commissioners that the WVU Extension has received matching money for technology equipment to be purchased on a cost-share basis. Mr. Clark told the Commissioners that their share of the cost is \$700.00.

Mr. Clark told the Commissioners they are requesting that the \$700.00 needed to match be made available through the WVU Extension Office budget that funds be redirected from the Travel line item to Capital Outlay and Equipment line item of the 2002-2003 Memorandum of Agreement.

Mr. Clark told the Commissioners that the travel account had an ending balance of \$2,501.63 as of March 2003.

Ms. Holliday asked the Commissioners if they would be in favor of purchasing in the next fiscal year a minimum one device (a touchscreen) per precinct for the elections plus one for absentee voting to be secured through State bids.

Mr. Holliday told the Commissioners he had forwarded a letter from Joe Manchin, Secretary of State detailing new legislation requirements.

Mr. Holliday asked about purchasing a TV and microwave for lounge No decision made.

Ms. Holly reviewed with Commissioners invoices from Data Design. The Commissioners approved to pay to Data Design four of the invoices, amount \$918.75.

Commissioner Wender suggested discussing the Data Design invoices further on April 28, 2003.

John Harper, member of the Arbuckle Public Service District, Bob Zimmerman, Plant Manager, Fred Hypes and a representative with Dunn Engineers, Inc. appeared before the Commission to give a summary of what's been requested for the Arbuckle Public Service District wastewater treatment plant.

Fred Hypes told the Commissioners that Arbuckle Public Service District has received a grant of \$67,000 toward the improvement of the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Fred Hypes told the Commissioners they're here today to request matching funds for the near-term improvements to the Arbuckle Public Service District Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Mr. Hypes informed the Commissioners that Arbuckle Public Service District will be able to obtain a used belt filter press from a neighboring public service district for salvage cost and that only a minimal amount of construction work, will require the use of outside

contractors.

Mr. Hypes told the Commissioners he would prefer the better used belt filter press from Cheylan, Kanawha Falls is a light duty machine that was purchased five years ago, need refurbishing.

Mr. Hypes told the Commissioners that Arbuckle Public Service District has applied for an emergency rate increase with the Public Service Commission.

Commissioner Wender informed Mr. Hypes that the Commission is going to make the contribution of \$28,00 so that Arbuckle Public Service District won't lose their grant.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Hypes to discuss this with Dave Pollard our County Resource Coordinator.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion that the Commission makes a cash contribution of \$28,00 or an in-kind match of equal or greater value based on the decision of the discussion of Fred Hypes, Dunn Engineer and Dave Pollard. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners that he had been contacted by the Town of Gauley Bridge informing they are in need of a cruiser and want to know if the County has any available cruisers they would like to donate.

Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners he had Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer to check to see what was available and he informed Commissioner Wender that a 1991 Chevy Caprice and a 1994 Chevy Caprice are available.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that the Commission donates the 1991 Chevy Caprice or the 1994 Chevy Caprice to the Town of Gauley

Bridge. Commissioner Eskew seconded. The Commissioners approved leaving lights on vehicles.

Commissioner Wender voiced his dissatisfaction with Multi-Cap, Inc. to the Commissioners and suggested that a letter be sent to resolve the situation.

Commissioner Wender asked that a letter be written to Multi-Cap informing that the Commission have not received a response to the memorandum of understanding (MOU) submitted to them for review on February 13, 2003, regarding the establishment of a sub-contract agency relationship with Fayette County to better serve the individual living below the poverty level in Fayette County.

Commissioner Wender suggested that the Commission request that Essa Howard, Director, Office of Economic Opportunity and Damron Bradshaw, Board President of Multi-Cap attend the Commission meeting to be held Monday, April 28, 2003 at 11:00 a.m. to vote on Fayette County's withdrawal from Multi-Cap.

The Commissioners adjourned for lunch at 12:10 p.m..

The Commissioners reconvened as County Commission meeting at 1:45 p.m.

The Commissioners signed Contract for Services with Terrell Ellis and Associates, Inc, Flex-E-Grant.

The Commissioners approved an invoice received from Terrell Ellis and Associates, amount \$478.72.

The Commissioners signed a letter to Randall Boyd, Executive Director informing that they have been advised of his announcement to leave the Upper Kanawha Valley Economic Development Corporation at the

end of April, and wish to express their gratitude for his years of services to the citizens of Fayette County.

Commissioner Wender suggested a letter be sent to Allan Ballard to inform him of the Fayetteville Heritage Festival Craft Fair and to inform him that the custodial fees are to be paid to the Fayette County Commission, all other events prior to July 1 go to Gary Hough, Principal, Fayetteville Middle School.

Sheriff Laird appeared before the Commission to discuss the leaking roof in the Road Office. Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners he had talked with Senator Shirley Love concerning the serious need to

replace the current roof.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners the cost would be \$10,400 after the required wage standard is included.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners he called the West Virginia Development Office and asked if the County can fix the Sheriff's roof on an emergency basis and be reimbursed in July.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioner he would work with Ms. Holly.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she would get in touch with Ricky Myles and asks him to give an estimate on the Sheriff's Road Office roof.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commissioners that the Secretary of Homeland Security Tom Ridge announced today that nearly \$600 million has been made available to the states and U. S. territories to better assist state and local public safety and law enforcement personnel to help them prevent, prepare and respond to terrorism.

Sheriff Laird presented a letter to the Commissioners requesting their authority and approval to expend \$1,878.00 from the Home Confinement Fund for the purchase of a laptop computer to be used by Home Confinement Supervisor James Fitzwater.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to approve purchase of a laptop computer for the Home Confinement Supervisor James Fitzwater, amount \$1,878.00. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Sheriff Laird presented a copy of a letter he addressed to Deputy Sheriff Shawn Campbell regarding guidelines and restrictions that apply when installation work is done on County-owned vehicles to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners that he had talked with Ruby Winebrenner and she informed him that the Gauley Bridge Senior Citizens Center needs funding prior to July 1 and asked the Commissioners if they would consider funding an additional amount to the Gauley Bridge Senior Citizens Center.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that an additional \$500.00 is paid to the Gauley Bridge Community Center for floor covering and a steam table to be paid immediately. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender asked that the Commission meeting be rescheduled for May 16.

The Commissioners approved to change the May 12 County Commission meeting to May 16.

Mr. Fast informed the Commissioners that the legal advertisement provides no information to allow citizens to make any type of informed decision as to whether one should be concerned and appear at this particular meeting.

postponed and not taken up until proper and sufficient notice is made by way of publication.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she talked with Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer and had gotten additional information from Page-Kincaid Public Service District regarding Southern Appalachian

Labor School request for the County to abandon their access road and donate it to Southern Appalachian Labor School for their housing project.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Mr. Richardson told her that the County does not own the road and that Southern Appalachian Labor School would have to contact the Division of Highways.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent, appeared before the Commission to give an update on the animal shelter.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that two concrete slabs completed, one is to be poured tomorrow, the doors and the porch have to be poured, picking up mortar sand today from Shamblin Stone, septic system ordered from Princeton Precast, will be starting to dig for the water line and also the gas line today, waiting for a trencher from Beckley Rent-alls, have blocks ordered from Houchins Block, delivery date is for Wednesday, April 30, 2003.

Commissioner Wender suggested having Allan Ballard do the dry wall on the building.

Commissioner Wender suggested that Dee Lively from the Fayette County Park come up and substitute for Mr. Ballard within the next couple of weeks.

Mr. Pauley asked if he should get a drawdown from FEMA.

The Commissioners suggested that Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent, Charlotte Holly, County Administrator, and Steve Cruikshank, OES Director have a conference call or meet to discuss the drawdowns.

Brent Clark, 4-H Project Coordinator appeared before the

Commission to discuss the 4-H camp fees.

Ms. Meadows informed the Commissioners that David Snively, WVU Assistant Director of County Operations, will review the amount of the contributions WVU received from Fayette County in the fiscal year 2002-2003 to verify that their records are in accordance to the Commission records. Ms. Meadows told the Commissioners if there is a discrepancy, Mr. Snively will contact the Commission to resolve the matter.

Mr. Watkins told the Commissioners that they do a customer service report, review 46 different items, money comes direct to the Fayette County Commission, Fayette County Commission pays G. E. Watkins and Associates 50% of the money that is recovered; it takes about three months, 50% of what the Fayette County Commission plans to do with recommendation and Fayette County Commission would have 50% savings over the next two years.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Watkins to send a complete copy of the contract and documents for Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney to review and make recommendation to the Commission.

Angie Sleeth with Region 4 Planning and Development Council appeared before the Commission to conduct a public meeting for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant for Page-Kincaid Public

Service District-Ingram Branch Wastewater Extension.

Ms. Sleeth called the public meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

Ms. Sleeth informed the Commissioners the purpose of the public meeting is to discuss an application with the West Virginia Development Office for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant for the Page-Kincaid Public Service District-Ingram Branch Wastewater Extension Phase I.

Ms. Sleeth presented a request for payment for the New Haven Public Service District Water Extension Project, Contract #13, amount \$3,623.57

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve and authorize the payment of services for Contract 13, amount \$3,623.57. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous. Resolution signed.

Ms. Holly told Ms. Sleeth that Tom Woodrum, Chief Tax Deputy told her that Branch Banking & Trust (BB&T) had closed the Small Cities Block Grant account due to lack of funds. Ms. Holly asked Ms. Sleeth if she would write a letter to Branch Banking and Trust (BB&T) asking that they reopen the account. Ms. Sleeth informed she would write the letter.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners that the Commission has acquired from Berwind Land Company two acres of land to build Minden Community Park. Commissioner Wender told Mr. Caudill that the County can address the trash and the abandoned cars. Commissioner Wender told Mr. Caudill he would ask Larry Parsons to go down and issue tickets.

The Commissioners recessed for lunch at 12:10 p.m.

The Commissioners reconvened at 1:20 p.m.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to approve outstanding bills. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved.

Commissioner Lopez made a request to address a letter to the Governor advising them of the need for the parking areas at the museum and overlook areas of Hawks Nest State Park located in Fayette County to be resurfaced and request that on behalf of Hawks's Nest State Park they consider and approve for the Division of Highways to resurface their parking areas.

Commissioner Lopez told the Commissioners he was told by Tom Shriner, Superintendent at the Park that these areas have not been overlaid since the park was built.

The Commissioners approved writing the letter to the Governor.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion that Kenneth Eskew is reappointed a member of the Coal Heritage Highway Authority. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous. Order and an appointment letter signed.

Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk appeared before the Commissioners with Matt Miller with Complete System Support, Inc. (CSSI) to discuss conversion of the Data Design voter's information and history to their system.

Mr. Miller told the Commissioners it would take no more than 20 minutes to convert the voter's information and history to CSSI; Mr. Miller told the Commissioners that this doesn't include digitized signatures, conversion, on-site training should be done in one week at \$640.00, no hardware purchase would be needed; offer a standard 48 hour turn around hardware contract; software program cost governed by the Secretary of State.

Mr. Miller told the Commissioners that he reviewed the hardware, existing hardware not needed the CSSI System completely support, excluding signature scanning space, operating the system is not a problem.

Mr. Miller told the Commissioners that CSSI System is not windows based, they would develop for the future but it depends on the type of specs the Secretary of State offer, if they buy software any upgrades

or updates required by the Secretary of State would be free of charge. Mr. Miller told the Commissioners the Secretary of State controls changes to the voter's registration system excluding signature scanning.

Mr. Miller told the Commissioners CSSI would install software free of charge.

Mr. Miller told the Commissioners that the signature scanning application is separate from the voters registration; CSSI scans one card at a time at 3-5 seconds per card.

Mr. Miller told the Commissioners that CSSI has never converted Data Design signature scanning application for CSSI to convert the signature scanning application this includes an absentee module the cost would be \$3,500 this includes software, installation, and training.

Steve Cruikshank, OES Director, appeared before the Commission to discuss FEMA drawdown for the Animal Shelter and boarding up houses from the buyout.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Cruikshank to get in contact with Larry Parsons regarding boarding up houses.

In the letter dated February 4, 2003 from Randall Boyd, a request was made of the Fayette County Commission to give consideration to providing additional funding to the Upper Kanawha Valley Economic Development Corporation ("UKVEDC") in the amount of \$4,606 to help cover the projected deficiency in project funds (of \$24,606.38) necessary to complete the Upper Kanawha Valley Technology Community office building located in Montgomery, Fayette County, WV. As you are aware, pursuant to a similar request, the Kanawha County Commission provided the UKVEDC with additional funding of \$25,000 for completion of the project.

The initial projected deficiency of \$24,606.38 consisted of the "deduct" for finishing's (flooring, plumbing fixtures, toilet compartments and accessories) relating to the 1st and 3rd floor bathrooms in the amount of \$17,527 and the overall shortfall of project funds in the amount of \$7,079.38. The "deduct" for the bathrooms was one of four alternate deductions totaling \$106,740 that were removed from the initial construction contract in order to bring the project costs, including a contingency allowance, in line with the available funding. The UKVEDC intentions were to bring this "deduct" back into the project once the project was "out of the ground" and a sufficient contingency was still available. As mentioned in the February 4th letter, the project encountered several issues requiring further "scale backs" of the project to bring the project in within budget.

Since the February 4th letter, the overall shortfall of project funds in the amount of \$7,079.38 has increased by approximately \$8,500 relating primarily to "reimburseables" under the architect and engineering contract that were inadvertently overlooked in the previous projected deficiency. Additionally, the general contractor has informed us that the \$17,527 allowance for finishing the bathrooms, in all likelihood, will not be sufficient. Apparently, the subcontractor that originally bid the job miscalculated, and because it was deducted from the project and is being finished outside of the revised project, the subcontractor would no longer be obligated at this price. We are currently soliciting bids for this work and are expecting such bids to exceed the original estimate by a considerable amount.

Accordingly, even though we received an additional \$5,000 from the Kanawha County Commission over and above the amount we were initially asking (from the Kanawha County Commission), we are still in need of the funds requested from the Fayette County Commission to help meet the project deficiency. Depending upon the bid amounts received with respect to completing the bathrooms, available alternatives within our financial means will then be evaluated for the most viable means of completing this project.

Finally, as I am sure you are aware based on recent newspaper articles, the proposed tenants for the building are unable to take occupancy at this time and thus we have the additional challenge of meeting the debt service requirements and on-going operating costs associated with the building without the benefit of any lease income for the immediate future. While we have initiated actions that should allow us to meet our obligations during the projected "lease-up" phase (provided we meet our targets), it is incumbent upon us to manage our available operating funds in the most prudent manner available. Accordingly, your consideration and approval of the February 4th funding request would be greatly appreciated.

Please accept my apology for not being able to personally attend the Commissioners' Meeting, as I had previously scheduled another commitment. If you should desire additional information, please let me know.

The Fayette County Commission met in a special session on this 23^{rd} day of June 2003.

Commissioner Wender called the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m. Steve Cruishank, OES Director appeared before the Commission to discuss the FEMA claims.

Mr. Cruikshank presented a list of FEMA reimbursements to the Commissioners.

Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners that he has requested \$6,000 for rent and \$2,600 for supplies for the temporary animal shelter and requested and additional amount of \$16,000 for rent.

Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners he has submitted \$15,000 for the permanent animal shelter.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Cruikshank to submit a chronological report listing the costs that were allowed and the costs that were disallowed and submit to the Commission by June 30.

Jennifer Melesky and Virginia Melesky appeared before the Commission.

Ms. Jennifer Melesky told the Commissioners that since the flood and the buyout of the house next door to her mother's property, the grass needs to be mowed. Ms. Melesky told the Commissioners that the property belonged to the Whitlow's.

Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners that the Whitlow's property was in the first buyout.

The Commissioners asked Mr. Cruikshank to contact Larry Parsons and asks him to cut the grass.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent appeared before the Commissioners to discuss the Fayette County Park and the Animal Shelter.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners as of today \$69,192.52 have been spent for the Animal Shelter.

Mr. Pauley presented a drawdown for the Animal Shelter to the Commissioners. Copies given to Ms. Holly and Steve Cruikshank.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that he has \$480 in shelter money in the safe and he needed shelter rental agreements back.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to work with Mr. Pauley regarding the cash on hand.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners they would have to do some paving next year, a 10" drain stopped up at the baby pool and flooded, they did reroute the drain; Cabinet #3 to be turned into a nurse quarter; Mr. Pauley asked about another camp for boys and girls.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Pauley to ask Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney for an update on the gas line with Equitable Gas and they will discuss on June 30.

Commissioner Wender called the meeting to order at 9:09 a.m. Exonerations were approved and signed.

Angie Sleeth with Region 4 Planning and Development Council appeared before the Commission to conduct a public meeting for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (SCBG) for the Courthouse Elevator/SALS Dormitory.

Ms. Sleeth called the public meeting to order at 9:11 a.m.

Ms. Sleeth told the Commissioners the purpose of the public meeting is to discuss an application with the West Virginia Development Office for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant for the Courthouse Elevator/SALS Dormitory.

Ms. Sleeth told the Commissioners that the grant application request is \$258,535 from the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (\$108,535 for courthouse elevator and \$150,000 for SALS dorm).

No other comments were received, Commissioner Wender closed the public hearing at 9:13 a.m.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to approve payrolls and outstanding bills, payroll to be released on Wednesday. Commissioner Eskew Seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Syner to give the Commission something in writing saying that the Syner Foundation approve future use by the Commission, 911 Center, amateur radio association and other the use of the tower, 911 to install a repeater/antenna to the tower.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that the check has been prepared for the Upper Kanawha Valley Little League. Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners before releasing the check she would have to receive a request from the Upper Kanawha Valley Little League. Commissioner Lopez suggesting holding until a letter of request is received.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she reviewed a request from

the Pax Regional Community Center for the Fiscal Year allotment of \$1,500 also included in the request was a request for allotment of \$500.00 for the Pax Watershed. The Commissioners approved allotment for the Pax Regional Community Center but told Ms. Holly the Pax Watershed would have to submit a separate request.

informing them of the funds spent each year for the management and operation of the Fayette County Animal Shelter and funding for animal control services throughout the County and invited the municipalities to attend a meeting in the office of the Fayette County Commission at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, October 3, 2003 to discuss animal control services, and ask that prior to the meeting they complete a survey.

The Commissioners received and reviewed from Senator Shirley love a list of the 2003 Budget Digest Requests approved for Fayette County a total of \$339,250.00.

Senator Shirley Love, Susan Chernenko, Director West Virginia Aeronautics Commission, Larry Clark, Federal Aeronautics Commission and Charles Tanner appeared before the Commission to give status of possible funding relating to a Regional Airport.

Ms. Chernenko told the Commissioners that the Aeronautics Commission is planning a statewide system plan update study.

Larry Clark told the Commissioners that the County has to be in the state system plan and that they need to do a study within the County to show there's a need for an airport and to get letters of intent from rafting companies saying they would use the airport.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Chernenko what would be the cost for the County. Ms. Chernenko replied she would have to check don't have figures with her.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Chernenko to schedule a meeting with the Commission around mid-October to show what's available.

Dr. Donald Newell gave reasons to the Commissioners why a Public Airport would be useful for Fayette County (See attached).

The Importance of a Public Airport for Fayette County

1. General Aviation: There are 635,000 pilots in the US and 500,000 of these pilots fly general aviation aircraft.

General aviation includes all flying except passenger airline service and military.

The following are examples of general aviation activities:

- 1. Pleasure
- 2. Education and training
- 3. Firefighting
- 4. Rescue and medivac
- 5. Transporting goods such as flowers, fish, food, medicines and vaccines
- 6. Law enforcement
- 7. Business (65% of GA is for business and public services)
 - a. Executive travel (ex. Long Airdox)
 - b. Sales trips
 - c. Parts delivery

All of the above examples are being done now from Beckley Airport and Charleston airport.

An airport in Fayette County would serve business, medical needs (vaccine/medication shipments and medivac), and Tourism. We think of flying tourists in on charter aircraft for Fayette County activities, but there is another dimension:

Pilots are required to keep proficient. Many combine this proficiency training with travel to new destinations. A local example is Rainelle Airport. On any Friday, Saturday or Sunday (the only days open) there will be 10-50 airplanes parked at Rainelle "International" Airport with their pilots getting one of their famous hamburgers. These pilots fly to Rainelle from many states and land on this grass runway just for the food and comraderie. Think how many GA planes would fly into Fayette County for the many activities that we offer?

Flying magazines monthly, run articles about fly-in destinations for their readers. Rainelle, to my knowledge, Has been the only WV airport profiled by these articles.

The Commissioners signed letters to the West Virginia Development Office for second drawdown for the Upper Kanawha Valley Community Center, amount \$11,200.00, second and final drawdown for Gauneka Ruritan Community Center, amount \$831.00, and first drawdown for the Courtroom Chairs, amount \$9,765.00.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she sent out letters too various agency's that received the 2004 Legislative Digest Grant asking that they complete information sheet and return back to the office no later than October 10, 2003.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners Resolutions to be signed for the Southern Appalachian Labor School, the Upper Kanawha Valley Little league Ballfield Lights, the Fayette County REACT Communication System and the Upper Kanawha Valley Community Center.

Commissioner Lopez made a motion to approve and authorize the adoption of the Resolutions for Southern Appalachian Labor School, the Upper Kanawha Valley Little League Ballfield Lights, the Fayette County REACT Communication System and the Upper Kanawha Valley Community Center. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous. Resolutions signed.

The Commissioners recess at 2:35 p.m. for a Work Session with Senators Shirley Love and Randy White to discuss Multi-Cap matter.

The Commissioners reconvened at 4:06 p.m.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the 4-C Economic Development Authority requesting that the Commission sign a

Resolution to be submitted to the West Virginia Development Office along with the Local Economic Development Grant for Fiscal Year 2003-2004.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion that the Commission approves and authorizes the adoption of the Resolution for the Local Economic Development Grant Fiscal year 2003-2004. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners approved and signed a Letter of Credit Payment Request for the third phase of funding for the Hazard Mitigation 322 Plan. The total authorized payment amount is \$2,272.00.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Sheriff William Laird regarding the Asset Forfeiture Donation from TRIDENT Task Force to help offset the increased costs associated with the Calloway murder investigation.

asked that cookies and coffee be served.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Sheriff Bill Laird requesting the approval of a purchase order for the purchase of an updated Computer Voice Stress Analyzer (CVSA) for the use by the Fayette County Sheriff's Department, amount \$9,760.00. The Sheriff informed the Commissioners that the funds requested for this expenditure are from the Equitable Sharing and Asset Forfeiture Fund which has been earmarked for the purchase of law enforcement equipment.

Chris Callas of Jackson-Kelly, PLLC representative for the West Virginia American Water Company, Steve Chambers, General Council and Bill Hardy, Operations with the West Virginia American Water Company appeared before the Commission to present a Resolution regarding a Partial Redemption of an Industrial Development Bond, the Commission will transfer the Ansted property to the West Virginia American Water Company, and the principal of the bond will be reduced by the value of the property conveyed. Also present was Carl Harris, Assistant

Prosecuting Attorney.

Mr. Callas presented to the Commissioners the proposed Resolution, Order and the Deed.

Mr. Harris informed the Commissioners he has reviewed okay to sign.

that is authorized to talk on the radio and the only that can use the radio.

Commissioner Eskew made a motion to approve and sign exonerations. Commissioner Lopez seconded. All approved.



Mr. David thanked the Commissioners for their renewed and continual support and presented to the Commission his request for

funding for the Fiscal year 2005 budget; for the Group Workcamp, amount \$10,000.00, Energy Express, amount \$3,000.00, and the Beards Fork/SALS Community Center, amount \$5,000.00.

Re: Mapping and Addressing Update

As requested, the following is a brief summary of the Mapping and Addressing project in Fayette County. The data collected is obtained via the vehicle mounted computed global positioning satellite receivers and mapping software. This equipment gathers information regarding street centerline as well as structure location and type. In conjunction with the West Virginia State Addressing and Mapping Board (SAMB), the Postal Service, Division of Highways and Verizon, all data is exchanged and compiled into actual location addresses and street names.

Currently we have collected, (locally), the data as follows;

Street naming	70-75%
Street Centerline mapping	85-90%
Structure locations	65-70%
Address range calculation	5-10%

All data must be submitted and reviewed by the SAMB, forwarded to the remaining agencies and upon approval addresses will then be assigned.

Due to the flooding that occurred November 19, 2003 we were not able to attend the SAMB workshop scheduled on that date. The workshop has been re-scheduled in January 2004 to bring us "up to speed" with the SAMB contractor and their processes.

In closing, I can not offer a projected completion date for this project at this time, however, you can be sure that our desire is to provide the best possible service to the citizens of Fayette County.

Mr. Neal told the Commissioners he had talked with B. J. Willis, representative West Virginia Emergency Medical Services Tech Support Network regarding the ambulance services in the Meadow Bridge/Danese area and he recommended that the Commission contract a legal RPM/RFP with the Danese Volunteer Fire Department.

Mr. Neal presented an invoice from the City Wrecker requesting that he paid \$450.00 to the Commissioners.

Mr. Neal told the Commissioners that Paul Washington Owner/Operator of City Wrecker submitted this invoice in protest to the fact that his service was not dispatched to an incident involving a tractor trailer accident on U S Route 19 at the Glen Jean intersection.

Mr. Neal told the Commissioners he had contacted Bob Morris of the West Virginia Public Service Commission Motor Carrier Division to inquire if the invoice should be paid.

Mr. Morris stated that the Commission had no responsibility to

pay this type of invoice and since Mr. Washington was not dispatched, did not tow a vehicle he is not entitled to submit an invoice to anyone.

The Commissioners asked that a letter be written to the City Wrecker denying payment of the invoice.

The Commissioners recessed for lunch at 1:00 p.m.

The Commission reconvened at 1:45 p.m.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve and adopt the revised Records Retention and Release Policy for the E911 Center. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners asked that a copy of this policy be forwarded to Judge John Hatcher.

J. Dan Snead appeared before the Commission to discuss the Courthouse windows.
