Sirs:

I am submitting for your consideration further information relating to my budget request for fiscal year 2005-2006.

The Office of Homeland Security has delivered funding for FFY 05 to the State. Once again guidance has been changed. While some changes will hurt our funding other changes may bring new opportunities. Basically funding for allowable management and administrative costs will be capped at 2.5% of the total budget. This means how much funding for items under this heading are directly related to the amount of funding I receive. However, I may be able to receive more funding for personnel costs. FFY 06 is half over and I am being required to submit a new budget request to the State for the entire year. This includes nine months of our current county fiscal year. I will be requesting 50% reimbursal for Thresa White's position which if granted, will give me four and one-half months of additional funds in our county fiscal year 05-06. As the grant continues through September, there is another one and one-half months for reimbursement. If this funding request is granted by the State, and Federal funding is not decreased in FFY 07, I should continue to get 50% reimbursment in that grant period. I also intend to apply for reimbursement of 20% of David Neal's salary at 50% (equaling 10% of his salary). What this equals if granted, would amount to funds to fund fully Thresa's position for six months of our FY 05-06 and 50% funding for the remaining six months. This funding includes all benefits paid by the County. What this boils down to, if funded by the State, is the County only paying 25% of the position costs for FFY 05-06 and 50% funding in future years if the funding stream continues.

I believe that we also have a balance in the DMA2K SECTION 322 ALL HAZARDS MITIGATION PLAN. My records show expenditures of \$11,981.16. Since our plan was approved, the balance of this fund in discretionary and obviously should be dedicated to plan maintenance. This task would be part of Thresa's duties also.

In conclusion, if my EMPG funding is approved, we will have practically covered the entire amount necessary for this position and at the same time increased the further amount gained through the 2.5% M & A costs.

I believed I have made good on my pledge of March 9th to pursue any and all funding streams to relieve you of the financial burden of your commitment, even without a commitment. The matter now rests in your capable hands.

Sirs:

I am submitting for your approval my budget request for fiscal year 2005-2006. You will find enclosed my worksheet for the Fayette County Fire Levy account. I have included in the budget a raise for Lynn Holstine and myself. I was not given any guidance as to raises, however there have not been raises received in this office for three years, so It is included if you are planning such an action. I am still operating without access to the WVU wage study, so I am basing my request on Raleigh County.

As you are aware all of the wages for the Office of Emergency Services come out of the Fire Levy and Federal grants. My grant for Federal Fiscal year 2004 covered reimbursement for one half of my salary and all benefits for my position, plus related administrative costs paid from the levy and also reimbursed the general fund for allowable expenses. Although no county has been approved for FFY 05 the State has indicated they will fund one half of salary and benefits for the directors from all eligible counties, and then distribute any remaining funds. The only expenses to the general fund for the program are in the County Commission budget, traditionally under \$5,000 per year. I am requesting that the County Commission fund a full time position under Emergency Services with an annual salary of \$17,680. Benefits would amount to an additional \$3,209. Thresa White would fill this slot and already has health insurance coverage under her spouse.

I am also requesting the annual amount of \$5,000 as an emergency fund. This money has traditionally come from the Coal Severance Account. If no money is used during the year, up to \$2,000 is to be available to buy emergency supplies for the county in June.

There are a lot of opportunities for grants right now, with the emphasis on Homeland Security. Right now I am working on at least \$30,000 in equipment for the EOC to increase interoperability and coordination. I fear we will lose opportunities for additional grant monies simply due to a lack of time with all the increased demands. I will also have responsibilities on any Homeland Security funding for Law Enforcement and Fire Services, certifying training, keeping databases on the equipment and getting MOU's. Losing a position will not save us money; it will cost us money I fear

Sirs:

Per your request I am submitting additional information relating to my budget request for fiscal year 2005-2006. In reviewing my request for funding a position in Emergency Services out of the General Fund, I am asking you to consider the following.

Twenty years ago the County Commission agreed to the proposal to abolish the volunteer position of Emergency Services Director and create a paid, full-time position of Emergency Services Director/Fire Coordinator. This position was funded fully by the Fire Levy. Since that time many additional duties have come under this office. Hazardous Materials have grown greatly, necessitating the development of a response capability, including the federally mandated Local Emergency Planning Committee. Disasters have come at a greater impact and frequency than ever imagined when this program was instituted. Now, we face the additional burdens of Homeland Security with the chemical, biological, radiological and explosive preparedness requirements. With these challenges come opportunities with new funding streams. In order to meet these challenges, a great deal of time must be dedicated to meeting the ever increasing Federal mandates of planning, preparedness and mitigation. All these demands require time and effort unimagined previously. In the interest of Public Safety we must make every effort to be prepared, to respond and to capture funding opportunities as they present themselves.

I have become increasing frustrated since 2001 with my inability to meet all the demands of this office. I could totally spend my time on either fire or emergency services and not meet every need or respond to every request. This has affected my health and caused me to look to the future. If I were to suddenly become unable to function as before, have I created an organization that could quickly move on? The time has come in Fayette County to take the next step and respond to the demands of the times.

I fully appreciate the demands upon you as County Commissioners and the constraints of the budget. However I am also fully confident that the importance of this request will compare favorably with others you receive. Public Safety must be at the forefront of our responsibilities.

In closing, I pledge to pursue any and all funding streams to assist in providing relief from this financial obligation. I have several ideas which I would be more than willing to share at your convenience

January 2002 I started volunteering with Fayette County Flood Recovery, doing casework, follow up calls, making appointments for home visits and creating a database for all flood victims in the computer. I continued volunteering until April at which time I was hired full time. I then assisted in taking loan applications for the WV Housing & Development Fund for volunteer groups to do work on flooded homes. I also was acting treasurer handling purchase orders disbursing orders and what money we received from the WV Gives funds. I helped compile estimates on each home for flood related damages, find out the amount of money received by each household, and see how they had used their money if not for repairs.

I was offered a job with Steve Cruikshank and the Office of Emergency Services in August 2002. The position would be Hazard Mitigation Officer, working with residents who have been flooded continually and were interested in selling their home to the county in the Buyout program. The grant-based program was already in motion when I began work for Steve. The application had been approved already but notification had not been given to the recipients yet. I worked getting appraisals of properties with homes still located on the property and tax records of the ones that had been destroyed. After this, I sent out offer letters to each property owner. There were contractor meetings that had to be held along with detailed files including pictures and directions to be given out for bid consideration. I then had to take prospective contractors to each site for review. I then had to oversee the work that was done demolishing, grading and inspecting the sites along with FEMA and Steve. While this process was happening, we were still having disasters. The application that we were granted was Disaster Number 1378, FEMA uses numbers to recognize each disaster as a separate event instead of dates. We then had flooding events and winter storms that caused major damages in each of the next 3 years. During each disaster I worked as the liaison for the American Red Cross within the OES expressing where and when shelters would be needed along with water needs, basic hygiene needs, clothing or housing need, as they became known to us. I have completed grant applications for the HMGP (Buyout Program) for disaster number 1410, 1455, 1474, 1500, and most recently 1522. We received approval for the 1455 grant but await paperwork from FEMA and the State to move forward. While working on the grant process the Fayette County Firefighters Association needed Identification tags to go along with their Accountability System they use on fire calls. I designed and enacted the tags for each of the departments in the county along with Rainelle for a total of over 300 firefighters. The tags also were needed for the equipment that each department uses. I made tags for each truck, boat, engine, and squad vehicle located at each department totaling over 80 vehicles.

The assessor's office contacted me about ID badges for their field workers. I created a badge for their need and distributed them. Larry Parsons contacted me about an ID badge for himself; I made him one for litter control officer.

I have within the past year gotten back into the flood recovery scene by request of specific VOAD organizations. They felt there was no other contact person with which they could contact about Fayette county residents needs. I have been part of a coordinated effort with FEMA, Project Recovery II - IV, Catholic Community Services and other faith based organizations to get help to people suffering in Fayette County. We meet in Princeton once a month to look at cases of individuals who have been dropped by the

system for one reason or another, or missed the deadline for application and are now having serious problems. There have been 50 cases who have received help from the groups since my involvement. I have been able to develop a line of communication with FEMA representatives sent to aid in the disaster registration to be able to find information that we normally would not receive. I try to follow up with each of the registrants to find out if their needs have been taken care of or if they are still in need of assistance. I do information gathering for Steve when needed. I help with the Fire School held in June and with Fire Prevention week in October. When needed, I fill in at the 911 center answering administrative calls and courthouse transfers. I handle all of the mail for the 911 center and Emergency Services on a daily basis. I request all supplies needed for both offices.

I have been working with Tim Richardson, Region 1 Planning and Development Council and FEMA representatives for the National Flood Insurance Program throughout the county on updated Flood Maps. I work with all Public Service Districts along with Mayors and Town Councils providing help with Public assistance paperwork, preliminary damage assessments, and invoicing of the State OES. I also helped coordinate and oversee debris removal for the last two disasters. I have held interviews sent out press releases and fielded reporter's questions on Disaster Response. I have done group events with the local and regional Girl Scout Troops for "What to do in an emergency" and "How to pack an emergency kit".

Unanimous.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve the refunds for George L. Shuck, George Salmons dba Steve's Excavating and Linda Grimmett Aguilar. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve vouchers and payrolls, payrolls to be released to day. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Discussion was held with James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor regarding the duties of the employees in the maintenance Department.

Commissioner Wender proposed to Mr. Perdue that he make weekly visits to each office and see if anyone has problems. Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Perdue to prepare a form.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Perdue to give the Commissioners feedback on what's going on.

The Commissioners asked Mr. Perdue to come back at 11:30 a.m. to discuss.

Floyd McKnight appeared before the Commission with a complaint that John David, member of the Page-Kincaid Public Service District is no longer a resident in this district and asked the Commission if they would check into.

Discussion was held, the Commissioners told Mr. McKnight that they cannot make a decision today they would check into this matter and get back with him.

Arnold Whitlow appeared before the Commission to discuss the Gauley Mountain Fire Tower.

Commissioner Eskew informed the Commissioners that Mr. Whitlow

paid the \$50.00 lease to the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources.

Mr. Whitlow requested that the Commission do a lease for the tower, County pay the \$50.00 and give the Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) permission to use the tower and the camera.

Mr. Whitlow told the Commissioners he would purchase the concrete.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that the Commission enters into an agreement with RACES to lease the Gauley Mountain Fire Tower. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that the County reimbursement Mr. Whitlow the \$50.00 he paid to the WV Division of Natural Resources. Commissioner Lopez asked to include concrete payment with reimbursement. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney informed the Commissioners that John David owns property in Page-Kincaid and South Hill in Oak Hill.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners they need to write a letter to Mr. David requesting he declare what his residency is.

Tara McDonald, Mountain Cap appeared before the Commissioners to discuss a Business Loan Program.

Ms. McDonald told the Commissioners that this Program has a 75% relending fund, but \$150,000 is the limit.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. McDonald if she had contacted 4-C Economic Development Authority regarding this program. Commissioner Wender also told Ms. McDonald she should contact Ben Newhouse, Rob

Neal and Anne Cavalier. Ms. McDonald told the Commissioner she would get in touch with them to discuss the Program.

Sheriff William Laird delivered to the Commissioners copies of the Fayette County Community Criminal Justice Program.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners he was going to try and set up a meeting on Monday, May 2, 2005.

The Commissioners informed the Sheriff that they had appointed R. A. "Pete" Hobbs and Selena Vickers to fill the two vacancies.

Commissioner Wender asked Sheriff Laird about By-Laws for the Fayette County Community Criminal Justice Program. Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners he would check.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she has prepared an Order establishing and appointing members to the Fayette County Community Criminal Justice Board.

Commissioner Eskew read the Order.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to sign Order establishing and appointing members to the Fayette County Community Criminal Justice Board. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners signed letters to Selena Vickers and R. A. "Pete" Hobbs requesting that they accept an appointment to serve as members of the Fayette County Community Criminal Justice Board.

The Commissioners signed thank-you letters to Sheriff William
Laird, Paul M. Blake, Jr. Prosecuting, J. B. Rees, Public Defender
Corporation, Helen Whitehair, Board of Education, Phillip Sundstrom,
Mental Health Care, Kathy Jones and Selena Vickers, Advocate from
Organization for Right of Victims of Crimes, Michael Martin, At Large-

Member Plateau, Judson, At Large-Member Valley, R. A. "Pete" Hobbs, At Large-Member New Haven, Judge John Hatcher, Michael parson,
Magistrate, and Tim Erwin, Probation Officer for accepting their appointment to serve as members of the Fayette County Community
Criminal Justice Board.

Ms. Holly presented application to the Commissioners for Request for Inmate Labor beginning April 1, 2005.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion that Joseph Carelli, Litter Control Officer is approved to supervise inmate labor from the Southern Regional Jail. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received from Charter Communication VI, LLC application for assignment of three Franchises from Charter Communications VI, LLC (formerly Helicon Group) to Rapid Communications, LLC serving the unincorporated areas contiguous to Ansted, Page, and Scarbro, West Virginia. The Commissioners accepted the transfer application for filing.

The Commissioners will conduct a public hearing on the transfer application at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, May 16, 2005. Decision will be made on or before May 24, 2005.

The Commissioners changed the County Commission meeting from May 13th to May 16th and asked that the Payroll Clerk prepare payrolls for first half of May on April 29 to be approved.

The Commissioners changed the County Commission meeting from May $27^{\rm th}$ to May $31^{\rm st}$ and asked that the Payroll Clerk prepare payrolls for second half of May on May 16 to be approved.

Angie Groves, Region 4 Planning and Development Council appeared

before the Commission to present a drawdown for the Page-Kincaid-Ingram Branch Wastewater project-#04SCBG0057 in the amount of \$13,206.00.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and authorize the payment of services for a drawdown for the Page-Kincaid Public Service District-Ingram Branch Wastewater Project, amount \$13,206.00.

Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Attorney Philip Tissue appeared before the Commission with a Petition of Pauline Davidson to close the Estate of Richard E. Wingrove.

Mr. Tissue told the Commissioners that J. C. Penney filed a claim in said estate in the amount of \$2,003.92. Mr. Tissue told the Commissioners that there are insufficient assets in the estate to pay this claim.

Mr. Tissue told the Commissioners that the Administrix has attempted to make contact with J. C. Penney to settle the claim by using her own funds but J. C. Penney has been unresponsive.

Mr. Tissue is requesting that a Final Settlement be published again and the claim of J. C. Penney be dismissed.

Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney told Mr. Tissue that he would have to prepare an Order.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to dismiss the claim against the Estate of Richard Wingrove and publish the Final Settlement again.

Commissioner Lopez seconded. The County Clerk Office will publish Final Settlement. Mr. Tissue to prepare order.

The Commissioners recessed the County Commission meeting for five

minutes.

The Commission reconvened the County Commission meeting.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners he will call Selena Vickers to see if she would like to be appointed a member of the Fayette County Community Criminal Justice Board.

Commissioner Eskew informed he would call R. A. "Pete" Hobbs to see if he would like to be appointed a member of the Fayette County Community Criminal Justice Board.

James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor appeared before the Commission to give a summary of REIC, Inc. Mold sampling/inspection of the Courthouse Annex Ground Floor (See attached)

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to check with the insurance to see if they will cover the problem. Commissioner Wender asked if the Commission should get a contractor or have Mr. Perdue do the job.

Ms. Holly suggested to the Commissioners to get a couple of estimates and include the estimates in the insurance claim.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a response from Jesse Bane, III regarding the petition filed by Fayetteville in the year 1990.

The Commissioners signed letter enclosing the information Mr. Bane requested and informed Mr. Bane that this is being provided on a one time only basis at no charge. RE: Results of April 1, 2005 Follow-up Mold Sampling/Inspection, Courthouse Annex Ground Floor

Dear Ms. Holly;

This letter and the enclosed laboratory report present the findings of the follow-up mold sampling and inspection on the ground floor of the Fayette County Courthouse Annex Building, performed by REI Consultants, Inc. (REIC) on April 1, 2005. The additional mold sampling and inspection was requested by the Fayette County Commission on March 25, 2005 due to potential issues requiring additional investigation as identified during the original mold sampling event of February 28, 2005, and by concerns from employees on the ground floor of the Annex Building. Specifically, three areas were requested to be investigated: the office of Eddie Young, due to elevated mold spore levels in the air sample collected in this area; the rear emergency stairwell, which employees suspected had visible mold growth; and carpet that had been removed from the ground floor.

In Eddie Young's office, the wood baseboard, paneling, and chair rail were removed from the area to the right of the door inside the office. Visible mold growth was observed on the drywall near the floor behind the paneling/baseboard. Outside Eddie Young's office, the drywall was inspected behind the rubber baseboard along the hallway. Visible mold was noted on the drywall behind the baseboard. Subsequently, areas behind the rubber baseboards were spot-checked throughout the ground floor. In many areas, no



visible mold was observed; however, mold growth was noted sporadically throughout the ground floor behind the baseboards. No samples were collected from any of the areas of visible mold growth, since the presence of mold was obvious. All visible mold that was observed appeared to be historical, i.e., the growth appeared dry and inactive. Note, however, that inactive mold material still has the potential to release spores.

The rear emergency stairwell was inspected for evidence of visible mold growth. One area of the concrete block wall, on the wall left of the door, was discolored from peeling paint that had been scraped down to primer; however, no visible mold growth was observed. One discolored area on the back wall of the stairwell, a gray spot on a mortar joint, was sampled via tape lift; this sample is identified as T-1 on the attached results. No mold was identified in this sample.

REIC obtained carpet that had been removed from under a shelf in the tax office and from areas in the assessor's office. Bulk samples of this carpet from each office were analyzed for the presence of mold. These samples are identified as C-1 and C-2 on the attached results. Note that only trace ascospores and basidiospores were identified in the two carpet samples. These types and levels of spores are not an indication of mold growth on the carpet, but of residual spores from the air.

In conclusion, visible mold was observed behind the wood paneling in Eddie Young's office, and in several areas throughout the ground floor on drywall behind the rubber baseboards. No mold was identified in the rear stairwell. No mold growth was identified in the samples of carpet that were analyzed.

It is recommended that all of the wood paneling, chair rail, and baseboards be removed from the office of Eddie Young. Mold impacted drywall behind the paneled area should be replaced. REIC does not recommend reinstalling paneling in this office due to the potential for future mold growth.

In addition, it is recommended that all rubber baseboards in contact with drywall throughout the ground floor be removed. This does not include rubber baseboard that has recently been installed due to tile replacement, provided that no visible mold was observed during the installation. Mold impacted drywall behind the removed baseboards should be cleaned with a detergent/water solution (containing bleach, if desired). After cleaning, the drywall should be allowed to dry thoroughly prior to installing new baseboard.

The Fayette County Commission met in a special session on this $19^{\rm th}$ day of April 2005.

Commissioner Eskew called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners they are here today to consider any objections and to officially adopt the levy rates for property taxation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and presented a notice of conditional approval of the levy estimated (budget) from the West Virginia State Auditor.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners of the comments made by the State Auditor's Office based on an audit and review of the Budget.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners the Auditor's Office wants an explanation of the reduction in account #413 Elections - County Clerk, #414 Elections - Circuit Clerk and #702 Sheriff - Jail and the amount that should be budgeted for the Statewide Computer Network, Account #408 is \$49,425.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that in Fiscal Year 2005, the budget for the account #413-Elections County Clerk and #414-Elections Circuit Clerk was for two elections (General Election November 2, 2004 and Special Levy Election February 5, 2005). The budget for Fiscal Year 2006 is for only one election; therefore, the budget amounts for these accounts were reduced accordingly in Fiscal Year 2006.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners and as a result of the retirement of an employee included in account #702-Sheriff-Jail, the

Sheriff hired a retired deputy sheriff at a lower salary (\$3,156 less annually) and who is not eligible for PERS (\$2,549 reduction) and is not enrolled in PEIA (\$8,564 reduction). Therefore, account #702 was reduced according to these reduced wages and benefits in Fiscal Year 2006.

Ms. Holly presented a letter dated March 15, 2005 from the West Virginia State Tax Department informing that Fayette County Fiscal Year 2006 budget for account #408-Statewide Computer Network is \$45,107.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she will respond to the Auditor's letter.

There was nobody in attendance with objections to the levy rates. Commissioner Lopez read the Order.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve the County
Commission Levy Order and Rate Sheet for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.
Commissioner Eskew seconded. County Clerk Kelvin Holliday signed Levy
Rate Sheet. The Commissioners signed an Order laying the Levy to be
used in Fayette County for Fiscal Year 2205-2006.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve vouchers and invoices as submitted. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Gorge Connection West Virginia Rural Health Education Partnership requesting the use of the Memorial Building for the purpose of having a community health promotional event on June 19 and June 20, 2005. The Commission approved to waive the rental fee, all other rules applicable.

Commissioner Eskew stated that the Commission needs to get with Helen Whitehair, Superintendent of the Fayette County Board of

Education and the Board Members to discuss the rent and their use of the Memorial Building. The Commissioners decided to have Commissioner Wender get with Ms. Whitehair and the Board Members to discuss this matter.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Earl Pauley, Park
Superintendent informed her that State Farm had totaled Charlie
Bryant's vehicle. Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners the title
to be signed.

Ms. Paden told the Commissioners that this Act authorized the creation of county farmland protection boards and county farmland protection programs and allows each county to enact an additional tax on the privilege of transferring real estate to be solely used to fund the county's farmland protection program.

Mr. Bibb told the Commissioners that Senator Love suggested that the Minden Community Center return the original check to him, he would reissue the \$5,000.00 to the Fayette County Commission they would be the sponsors that would be responsible for purchasing and developing the playground.

Commissioner Wender suggested including playground equipment.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that the Fayette County

Commission will accept check from the Governor's Office to develop a

park in the Minden Community under the conditions that if the money is

not used in a period of five (5) years that money could be used for

any park improvements in the County. Commissioner Eskew seconded.

Unanimous.

Richard Day and Robert Vandall appeared before the Commission to request money for funding four programs (soccer, little league, fencing, and dugouts).

Mr. Day told the Commissioners they are using 5 acres of land owned by the Fayette County Board of Education.

Mr. Day told the commissioners that with the donations from the Community they have installed pipes on the property.

Mr. Day told the Commissioners they requested assistance from the Fayette County Board of Education, but they would not help.

Mr. Day told the Commissioners that right now they are at a

standstill.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Day the estimate on the project.

Mr. Day replied the estimated cost is about \$150,000.00

Mr. Day told the Commissioners to finish the two dugouts the estimated cost would be \$6,000.00 for concrete, labor and materials.

Commissioner Wender asked if the Commission appropriate \$3,000 could they get someone to do the labor for free on the dugouts.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that the Commission commits to a \$3,000.00 grant for the Meadow Bridge Baseball Program for concrete and roof materials will look to the future for the Meadow Bridge Baseball Program. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous. The \$3,000.00 is to be paid to the Meadow Bridge Baseball Program.

Delegate John Pino appeared before the Commission to present certificates from the Governor's Office for the 2004 Digest Grant for the Fayette County Park Poll-ramp (\$5,000), the Fayette County Multi-Cap Watch Me Grow (\$2,500), Gauneka-Ruritans Community Center-roof (\$5,000) on behalf of Senators Shirley Love, Randy White and Delegates Tom Louisos and David Perry.

The Commissioners signed a letter to Michael Proop, Controller, Family Law Masters requesting reimbursement for rent in the amount of \$2,025.00 for the month of September 2005.

The Commissioners received and reviewed notice from Sheriff
William Laird of Garland Burke's retirement as a Fayette County Deputy
from the Sheriff Department effective July 28, 2005.

The Commissioners signed a letter to Garland Burke informing they have been advised of his retirement from employment as a Fayette

County Deputy effective July 28, 2005. The Commissioners offered their sincere appreciation for his 21 years of service to Fayette County and our citizens.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that John David sent final preliminary drawings for the Southern Appalachian labor School Dorm Project for the Commissioners to review.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that Alice King, Region 4
Planning and Development Council has several questions regarding the preliminary drawings.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Division of Criminal Justice Service informing the Commission that the resolutions that were mailed with the grant contracts were for the JAIBG program not the Justice Assistance Grant Program (JAG). Commissioner Wender suggested having Mr. Pauley come in to discuss the invoice.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners from Allen Ballard,
Fayette County Building Inspector signed Inspection Agreements from
Stone Inspection Services, LLC and Appalachian Inspection Services.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve and sign Inspection Agreements from Stone Inspection Services, LLC and Appalachian Inspection Services as presented by the Building Inspector. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners recessed the County Commission meeting for five minutes (10:02).

The Commissioners reconvened the Commission meeting at 10:14 a.m.

Bob Honaker, WV Rural Community Assistance Program appeared before the Commission to provide \$10,000 for the SHIPO investigation and requesting \$30,000 for the State Historical Preservation Investigation.

Mr. Honaker informed the Commissioners that John Housh has agreed to pay the upfront cost of the engineering study.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Honaker if he had a cost on the engineering study. Mr. Honaker replied the cost would be approximately \$30,000 to \$40,000.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Honaker that the Commission did previously approve an amount of \$10,000 to the Kanawha Falls Public Service District as a local funding match toward the project in 1998.

The Commissioners agreed to release the \$10,000 to assist in the cost to extend water from the Kanawha Falls Public Service District to the Kanawha Falls and Boonesborough communities.

The Commissioners informed they look for Mr. Housh to pay the difference.

Sheriff William Laird, Tim Hannah and Joe Carelli appeared before the Commission to discuss the Community Corrections Program.

Sheriff Laird updated the Commissioners on the \$89,000 he received from the Division of Criminal Justice Services for the community corrections program.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that the contracts have been signed and the Commission needs to select a site for a day reporting center, advertise for a project director, and a day reporting manager.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that currently the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority has a work program.

Sheriff Laird told the commissioners they need to decide on whether to advertise the positions, decide on whether to continue operating the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority prisoner release program or to combine the programs together.

Tim Hannah, Chairman of the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority told the Commissioners that they are willing to do whatever they can to help the Sheriff but the Solid Waste Authority needs the prisoners.

Mr. Hannah told the Commissioners that the Fayette County
Beautification Committee will meet at 3:00 p.m. and the Fayette County
Solid Waste Authority will meet at 4:00 p.m. on August 25, 2005.

Commissioner Wender suggested that the Commission and the Sheriff

meet with the Fayette County Beautification Committee and the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority to discuss further. Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Hickman to post a notice of the meeting for the Commission.

Commissioner Wender called to order the hearing for the Annexation for the Town of Fayetteville. Present were Graydon Ooten, attorney for the Town, Thomas Michael representing the National Parks Conservation Association, and others (see attached).

The first order of business was the approval of the March 21, 2005 minutes. Motion by Debbie Sizemore to accept as presented, second by Al Gannon. Vote 13-0.

Next order of business:

Z-502-05-1 Request of LRC Holdings, LLC, owner, for a change in land classification from R-R (Rural Residence District) and LC-1 (Public Land Conservation District) to R-R (Rural Residence District) with PRD (Planned Residential District) overlay on

property legally described as MIN 4465.83 / Rush Run & Surf 4 & New R and 592/96.93 594/74, Cunard and Brooklyn area, Plateau District.

Planning Commission member Gene Kistler, made a motion to grant this request by LRC. Inc. to change the zoning from LC-1 (Land Conservation 1) to RR (Rural Residential) on approximately 3,680 acres of the Rush Creek Tract lying entirely outside of the National Park Boundary. The approximately 613 acres of this tract lying within the National Park Service Boundary shall remain LC-1.

Grant approval of a PRD (Planned Residential Development-Section 8- Article 8000 of the UDC (Unified Development Code) on these 3,680 acres and approval of the "Preliminary Layout" as defined in -Section 7 Article 7- Subdivision Regulations- UDC. This approval shall be conditioned by the following requirements in accordance with the Subdivision Regulations and the process for obtaining Subdivision Plat approval:

- 1. Completion of the Wolf Creek access road connecting Route 19 with the Cunard Road within 5 years.
- 2. County approval of a comprehensive Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions for the PRD that is attached to the individual lot deeds and recorded with the county; addressing lighting, building color, tree cutting, etc. ...
- 3. Application of deed restrictions to insure the integrity of the 100 ft. setback/ buffer zone and the 50 ft. no cut zones on individual lots.
- 4. Application of an acceptable conservation easement to all buffer zones, common areas, green space, etc. ... in order to insure that these areas stay forested in perpetuity.
- 5. Adoption of the West Virginia DNR recommended buffer zone to protect the sensitive rim rock pine communities.
- 6. Protection of the New River Gorge view shed by insuring "that the development is not visible from any ground level vantage point" (LRC quote) and continue to work with the National Park Service staff to address areas of concern and insure that this development will not impair the scenic views of the gorge.
- 7. Assumption by LRC of the county government's responsibilities associated with the leachate and land management of the old Fayette County Dump (lanfill).
- 8. Approval of an erosion control and storm water management plan during and after construction.
- 9. Approval of plans to install a centralized geoflow or comparable sewage treatment system for the PRD with ample additional capacity to accommodate the reasonable inclusion of additional customers in the Brooklyn, Cunard, Gatewood and adjacent areas. Connection to the system shall be at the customers expense.
- 10. Approval of plans to install underground utilities, including a centralized water distribution, phone, electricity, etc...

Second to this motion by Guy Dooley Representing this application, Mike Basille, presentation of LRC application team, Larry Courtney, Tom Wagner, Doug McKinsey, Fred Hypes, Mike Miller, Greg Nunn and Mark Shamblin. LRC appeared before the Fayette County Transition Team, these are the first steps of an entire process depending on Section 7 of the UDC. Plans are to install a septic plant and helipads on this property. LRC is involved in development throughout the south east and has developed historical sites and been presented the HFTV award twice. This will be a phased development with 50 % greenspace. In specific areas there will be no development (613 ac in park boundary). This 613 acres was included in the application to secure the density sought for development. This land has been mined and timbered. The original application was not prepared with infrastructure concerns. LRC has listened to area concerns and wants responsible development, infrastructure in conjunction with the counties comp plan and the UDC. We have addressed transportation issues, water issues and there will be no development within the National Park. There will be a 100 foot buffer, deed restrictions to observe setbacks, also covenant restrictions and homeowner restrictions. We have complied with Section 7 of the UDC in providing a Transportation study (Wilbur, Smith and Co.) DOH approval (Paul Mattox) committed to the improvement of the highway system. A water layout presentation and provisions of connection to existing service and extending service to the Brooklyn and Cunard areas. Addressed waste water and the leachate problem with the old land fill is to betaken care of by the proposed waste water system. Electrical main line service is already in place on this property. Emergency services reference Section 7, helipads, fire training center is to be located on property. Wolf Creek (phase 2) and Roaring River will join public and private projects. This is urban development dealing with blighted property. An Economic Impact Study (Paul Whitt) indicates tax revenues will increase for Fayette County. And this project will help fight irresponsible development.

Chairman, questions from the planning commission? None at this time.

Cal Hite, representing the National Park Service presented a power point presentation and two books of reference for the record. Noted the history of the New River Gorge National River. Concern of impacts of development in the gorge, impairment of scenic areas. Modification of the application is appreciated by the park service. Covenants are important for long term impact. Development will be twice the size of Fayetteville. Areas of concern(2,336 lots) noted, compared to (2,136) which is accurate? Lots being located close to the gorge need to be relocated or eliminated. The gorge is a special place. 81 % of visitors reflect the view of the gorge. Deed restrictions and protective covenants are needed. Eliminate lots on the rim, lighting restrictions and no tree cut zones. Management plans for green spaces and DEP buffer zones. Attributes at the park are seen throughout the gorge.

Public comment.

Allen Wickline, family has lived in Fayette County over 80 years and I am opposed to this development, no benefits for the residences of Gatewood. Sewage plant too close to my home. Question of water service. Traffic increase concerns.

Ernest Wickline, owner and operator of ACE Adventure Center, a local point of view. This project will not affect the gorge area, this is a great opportunity. Will provide

sewage service to the Brooklyn and Cunard area. The landfill will be recovered. Will eliminate sewage in the New River. Provide opportunities for road development and jobs for development.

Casey Whitaker. I feel this application is incomplete (road impact study) not presented until August 19. Have speed concerns on Gatewood Road. Concern of access roads, funding for road improvements. This is the wrong location for this development.

Erik Hydell, representing New River Watershed Association. This is a pivotal decision for Fayette County. Concern of covenant restrictions.

Joe Stone, member of the Urban Renewal Authority, this project attached to the Wolf Creek project (stage 1 development) LRC has proposed road development to Gatewood Road. This is partnership of development.

Jennifer Ducee, concern of economic impact study, I am a CPA and in reference to a 10 year build out road study compared to a 20 year buildout. Tourism is sustaining the county. LRC has only been in business since 1997, concern of this. Concern of property tax increases. Be good stewards of the county.

Jennifer Boyd, County resident, concern of town houses being placed along the rim as indicated by the park service presentation. Natural beauty concerns, workforce concerns. Be guardians of Fayette County.

Jo Ann Garvin. Do you want to loose the beauty of Fayette County for 2,000 homes? This is too many. Concern of services rendered to inhabitants.

Gary Lilly. Resident of Gatewood Road. Concern of traffic. This 8-9 miles of road (Oak Hill -Fayetteville) and traffic will increase. Concern of safety of roads. Want the best for Fayette County.

Helen Hamilton (representing Pat Hamilton) I hope the beauty of the New River gorge is not killed today. Protect this gorge. Roads and infrastructure don't always work out. Protection of the land in its natural state.

Norma Lavender, a Fayetteville native, left area because of financial reasons, now reside on Elverton Road, 3 caviates, economic reasons, provide jobs for county, work with DOH to control road access and sewage treatment plant and helipads need to be relocated. Economic impact will be positive.

T. D. Holster, objection to septic plant location close to my home. View shed concerns and traffic concerns.

Maude Brunstetter, not against economic development, but concern of impact overnight, please make careful considerations.

Thomas Michael, representing National Parks Conservation Association, concern of motion to approve this request and recommend to follow the guidelines of Section 7 of the UDC. Concern of layout on gorge rim. Impose requirements of view shed, 1st application did not meet density. 3 years 8 months ago, LC-1 was designated in this area. You must meet the guidelines of the comp plan. Major changes that would substancially provide for changes.

10 minute break.

Bill Borg, this project will bring value. In support of opportunities for Fayette County.

Dave Arnold, Class VI River runners, member of the state tourism commission. This is a good process. Do the right thing. Chance for change and opportunity. The gorge area is a National River and not a national park, a recreational area. Some developments are spontaneous, this is being done by a professional company. They have worked hard to develop a good product. Marketing of business in homes is the future. Preserve, protect, but do not prohibit.

Janice Pearl, absent.

Jerry Cook, my business shares common borders with this project. This property has been deep mined, strip mined, and timbered. Responsible development is needed on this property. Have view shed concerns. Am in support of this project.

Erin Haddicks, member National Parks Conservation Association. Impact of development concerns. Protect resources of gorge. Concern of restrictions and future development. Please deny LRC's plan.

Lynn Pearson, This is intrusion of this prestine area. Do not scar this area again.

Liz Garland, representing West Virginia Rivers Coalition. 3 key resource components to be observed. LRC has given some considerations. Provide adequate water services. Especially storm water concerns. Will LRC accept burden of responsibility of higher land development? Needs to be healthy development off of the rim of the gorge. Revisit the process.

Randy Boyd, Pan Board member, Inappropriate development proposed in the 1970's (Booklet given to Chair) on this history. Present visual locations need to be preserved. 500 foot buffer needs to be observed as in the 1970's. Specific language on development in the gorge. LRC are good developers, very respectful. But they are developers. Need economic opportunities, but not in the gorge. Let us all be friends and the community come back together.

David Dobbins, I am an archeologist. Please investigate the property for prehistoric significance.

Mark Ehrnschwender, absent.

Ann Ziegler, Opposed to development, view needs to be preserved. Concern of covenants, concern of environment due to development (runoff). Infastructure, is LRC picking up these costs? If this is rejected a compromise plan could be submitted. A smaller development.

Jeff Proctor, Class VI. Concern of Fayette County. Have toured this property. No view shed concerns, looking into the gorge. Give LRC the opportunity to move ahead.

LRC Rebuttal.

Mike Basille, Protect, preserve the area. Infrastructure issues will be addressed. Concern of false information being presented, 500 foot setback wasn't law. Protect, preserve, but don't prohibit, as Dave Arnold stated. LC designation was defined in this area primarily because of infrastructure concerns, these issues have been addressed in this presentation. Return to original request, the nature of the property is blighted. The view shed will be protected.

Public Comment.

Lynn Pearson, What about when the leaves are off the trees? Mike Basille, no change in the view shed. What about across the river? Still, no change.

Casey Whitaker, LRC website says, coming soon. Neighbors concerned about recent road impact study. Why did your numbers change on the development. Larry Courtney, the numbers changed because developments are usually 80 % projections. This location will project approximately 200 homes per year. Whitaker, what is LRC's commitment to roads. We are now addressing the zoning issues. Mike Basille Section 7 will address these issues.

Alan Wickline, With these homes Gatewood will be the biggest community in Fayette County. I ask the commission to delay their decision.

Randy Boyd, concern of depiction of NPS pictures. Doug Maddy.

Maude Branstetter, concern of tree view shed. Mike Basille, Section 7 review will address these issues.

Disposition: Motion to table by Doug Maddy, second by Debbie Sizemore.

Discussion, Gene Kistler, rezoning needs to happen first, then PRD for density. PRD residential.

Subdivision 2 phases of approval (2,365 lots) a 765 home difference, refer to procedure section. Subdivision regulations enforced by zoning enforcement officer, planning commission places conditions. Rezone RR with PRD overlay with conditions.

Guy Dooley, I challenged LRC to not be intrusive on the park. There is economic opportunity and support for this project.

Leon Cooper, the Comprehensive Plan and the Unified Development Code were designed for plans for the future and development designation areas change as infrastructure changes, such as 8" water lines, 2 major road extensions, septic services.

Sherman Bobbitt, motion to recend Gene Kistler's original motion.

Gene Kistler, R-R & PRD request will not come back to the planning commission.

Pat Day motion to amend original motion (remove conditions). Second by Jessie Bibb. Vote 7-5 against.

Doug Maddy moved to table the motion, second by Jessie Bibb. Vote 11-2 against.

Chairman Cooper called for a vote on the original motion to approve as requested with 10 conditions. Vote 12-1 to approve request with conditions. Chairman abstained.

in this together with Fayette County and we understand that this is but the beginning. The Ordinance lays out the process and this is the early step of an entire process depending on Section 7 of the Unified Development Code this is when they collectively roll up their sleeves.

Mr. Basile told the Commissioners that Water River Project phase development destination is tourism to include clubhouses, swimming pools, walking and hiking trails, test facility, homes of the highest quality and development of the highest quality.

Mr. Basile told the Commissioners that they will provide a comprehensive plan to the Fayette Transition Team and the Fayette County Planning Commission.

Mr. Basile told the Commissioners that during this process they studied many things, the Fayette County Comprehensive Plan, the Ordinance, your views, the procedures, the process and the property as those of you who have traveled with him to tour the property.

Mr. Basile told the Commissioners they studied the transportation issues and submitted the report to the Division of Highways.

Mr. Basile told the Commissioners they worked with the West Virginia American Water and there is more than adequate capacity in the region.

Mr. Basile told the Commissioners they have appeared before the Fayette County Urban Renewal Authority.

Mr. Basile thanked the Commission and the Chairman for the opportunity to appear here today. Mr. Basile told the Commissioners he gave them a slim down virgin of his comments from the other night and he will be pleased to answer any questions.

Commissioner Wender suggested holding questions for the later part of the meeting.

Commissioner Wender asked Cal Hite to speak on behalf of the National Park Service.

Mr. Hite presented a power point presentation and maps that show specific areas of the revised plan for the record.

Mr. Hite presented the ten conditions they presented to the Planning Commission on Monday, August 22, 2005.

Mr. Hite told the Commissioners that the Legislation established part of the New River Gorge River in 1978.

Mr. Hite said one of their concerns was with the current plan is an area that proposes cowl like structures near the top of one of the ridge lines.

Mr. Hite talked about the impact of the development. The lots being located close to the Gorge need to be relocated or eliminated.

Mr. Hite told the Commissioners that if this is the decision of the Fayette County Commission to adopt the recommendation of the Planning Commission he would respectfully request that they adopt the ten conditions that were presented in the public meeting held on Monday, August 22, 2005.

Mr. Hite asked the Commission to do all they can to continue to safeguarding the New River Gorge and the National Rivers that run through it.

Mr. Hite thanked the Commission for the opportunity to speak on regarding this project.

Commissioner Wender asked for public commit.

Commissioner Wender asked that everyone who signed up to address the Commission with their concerns on the project that if you are perhaps repeating a position that someone has expressed prior to you and in general they have said the comments that you wished to make please state your position but if you do in fact agree with them please just make reference perhaps to their comments.

Commissioner Wender informed he do not by any means intend to limit anyone the opportunity to speak to the Commission but some folks may want to address the same similar issues, but please do speak, but abbreviate your remarks to additional comments on the same subject if possible.

Commissioner Wender informed the first person for public commits is Helen Hamilton.

Ms. Hamilton told the Commissioners that she did not intend to come to this meeting today yet along to speak. Ms. Hamilton told the Commissioners she spoke on behalf of her husband (Pat Hamilton) Monday and we were so overwhelmingly defeated.

Ms. Hamilton told the Commissioners she haven't heard whether or not the Developers have okayed the ten requirements presented to the Fayette County Planning Commission.

Ms. Hamilton told the Commissioners that she would like to hear that addressed, Ms. Hamilton told the Commissioners that all ten requirements were definitely needed.

Ms. Hamilton asked why the rush, need to slow down, put the brakes on and do more studies, let the Park Service work with these people.

Ms. Hamilton asked the Commission not to rush into this maybe delay this for a while some impact studies are made. Let's not give up on the Gorge right now.

Commissioner Wender asked that Ernest Kincaid make his comments.

Mr. Kincaid told the Commissioners that he is a life time resident of Fayette County and owner of Ace Adventures Center in Minden.

Mr. Kincaid told the Commissioner that he is in favor of the project, but he was against the ten stipulations that has been added to the project.

Mr. Kincaid asked that the stipulation that a road be built across land that is not even owned by the developer be deleted.

Eric Hiegl appeared on behalf of the National Parks Conservation
Association located in North Carolina.

Mr. Hiegl told the Commissioners he truly feels they can preserve the Gorge and at the same time have a healthy economy.

Mr. Hiegl told the commissioners that if they do vote yes on this recommendation only approve the zoning change on the 3,680 acres outside the National Park boundaries and that all the ten conditions be included.

Mr. Hiegl asked the Commission to have LRC pay a performance bond.

Commissioner Wender informed that after the next speaker the Commission will take a ten minute break.

Pat Spangler appeared before the Commission to ask that they protect the New River Gorge, do not approve the developer's request

for rezoning.

Ms. Spangler asked the Commission if they prepared a parallel impact or an independent impact studies such as the ones they are using now as guidelines that LRC has prepared for us?

Commissioner Wender replied he thinks it's the responsibility of all parties to address their concerns although he feels the principal party responsible for this would be the National Park Service.

Ms. Spangler asked the Commission because of the huge implication of the decision the Commission has to make today, they should slow down and table this decision until they could be certain without a shadow of doubt that this is the right and correct thing to do.

Commissioner Wender called for a ten minute break at 12:00 p.m. The Commission reconvened the hearing at 12:15 p.m.

Jennifer Dusic appeared before the Commission to ask that they do not act in haste on their decision to the rezoning.

Ms. Dusic asked the Commissioners to table this decision until they have done the research. Ms. Dusic told the Commissioners they owe this to the people of Fayette County who entrusted them to care for their heritage.

Ms. Dusic told the Commissioners that the citizens here love their land, and asked the Commission please don't make the same mistakes that have been made in other parts of this country, preserve this beautiful Gorge for all to enjoy.

Norman Steenstra, Director of the West Virginia Citizen in
Action appeared before the Commission to ask that they slow the
project down, asked that the Commission do their diligence and let's

all take a long look at it.

Mr. Steenstra urged the Commission to do their diligence and to make sure the Park Services is satisfied in the end.

Erin Haddix, member of the National Parks Conservation

Association appeared before the Commission to express her comments regarding the rezoning.

Ms. Haddix told the Commissioners of the impact that this rezong will have on the park.

Ms. Haddix asked the Commission to not move forward with this plan until they have adequate information.

Tom Michael, attorney representing the National Parks

Conservation Association, wants to address some of the legal issues

that the Commission is faced her with today.

Mr. Michael questioned the procedural problem with the application (WV Code 8A-7-9).

Mr. Michael question the motion the Planning Commission made to approve this request and recommend following the guidelines of Section 7 of the Unified Development Code.

Mr. Michael questions the ten conditions that were added and asked that the Commission send this back to the Fayette County Planning Commission.

David Chamberlin appeared before the Commission to voice his support for the project.

Mr. Chamberlin told the Commissioners that this project is prudent for the Commission to approve this change to allow LRC to develop this roaring river project.

Mr. Chamberlin asked the Commission to not let this opportunity go by. This is a tremendous opportunity for Fayette County.

Jack Lund appeared before the Commission to voice his support for the project.

Teresa Bowyer appeared before the Commission on behalf of the residents of Cunard to present a proposal for the Zoning Commission and the County Commission to review some of their concerns regarding this rezoning (See attached).

Commissioner Wender informed the Commission has heard everyone who signed up to speak today, there were some individuals who raised questions they should have the opportunity to be addressed.

Commissioner Wender asked Michael Basile if he would address some of the comments heard this afternoon.

Mr. Basile informed he had heard several request to slow down on this project. Mr. Basile informed they agree with that and Fayette County agree with that.

Mr. Basile informed this is but a first step, the next step is for this company and interested parties in this very room to work together pursuant to Section 7 of your Ordinance this Company can't as a matter of West Constitution write the law.

Mr. Basile informed that there is no rush this a process.

Mr. Basile asked that the Commission take them through the next step today.

Commissioner Wender asked if there were any other questions.

Commissioner Wender asked Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting
Attorney to outline what the County Commission is allowed to do today.

PROPOSAL TO OFFER CONCERNS ON THE ZONING OF THE LAND RESOURCE COMPANY

The residents of Cunard would appreciate the Zoning Committee and County Commission looking at and reviewing some of our concerns and enter into records the following:

- 1. There are many historical sites on this land
 - A) Rush Run mines: The entrance to the mine and the supply building.
 - B) The natural caves that were once inhabited by the Native Americans who lived in this area
 - C) Snake town: The cemetery and buildings that are still standing in the area.
- 2. The wildlife: The cutting of trees will decrease the food source that they depend upon for their survival.
 - 3. Businesses: There are currently two horseback riding stables in this area. Both of these Businesses provide vital tourist revenue for our state.
 - 4. Cunard Cemetery: It is to provide burial for the residents of Cunard and Brooklyn
 - 5. Employment opportunities: This is a good time to ensure that the revenue stays in Fayettte County and we all can benefit from the development.

There are concerns in all of the above, for the generation to come: preserved historical sites, they are a part of the history.

The decrease of wildlife: Will it have a negative impact on hunting in this area? Therefore, lowering the revenue on hunting license.

Horseback riding and recreation: Will it be limited? Causing an impact on tourists that come to see the beauty of our state.

Cunard Cemetery cannot supply the burial for this big a project. It is very small and reserved for those who live and have lived in Cunard and Brooklyn.

Upon the approval for a change in land classification for LRC Holding, LLC, owner and the purchase of property legally described as MIN4465.83/Rush Run & Surf 4 & new R and 592/06.03/74, Cunard and Brooklyn area, Plateau District. We propose that historical sites be preserved. Cunard Cemetery will not provide burial for families living on the land as described above. Employments are only for businesses and residents of Fayette County limited to there trade.

The residents of Cunard and Brooklyn

Mr. Harris informed that the Commission adopted the Unified Development Code. Mr. Harris informed that he and another attorney looked at the West Virginia Code and the Unified Development Code to determine if it was possible for the Planning Commission to attach an addition to the change they had recommended to the Commission.

Mr. Harris informed they have determined that it is not appropriate or possible for them to attach additions to the Zoning change.

Mr. Harris recommended to the Commission that if they desire to approve what the planning commission adopted they can do so without the conditions being attached.

Mr. Harris informed the question is whether this goes back to the planning commission to decide whether they agree with the Commission or not at this point based on a brief research this morning Mr. Harris informed the Commission that he first concluded we didn't, then concluded we did they would have to look at again this afternoon and over the weekend to be sure that it goes or doesn't go back, but without question the Commission cannot adopt with the conditions attached.

Mr. Harris informed the Commission if it is their desire to approve the change in zoning they can do so but without the conditions.

Commissioner Wender asked Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer to give a brief description on what Section 7 covers and what the governing policy would be as you work through with the Land Resource Company.

Mr. Richardson read a brief description of what Section 7 covers

under the Unified Development Code.

Commissioner Wender asked if any other questions.

Commissioner Eskew informed the Commission that he would like to make a statement concerning this project and the process they have been through. (See attached)

Fayette County Urban Renewal Authority for the West Virginia Division Highways road access grant for the Wolf Creek park project.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners they received a letter from the Fayette County National Bank informing that the request that the bank act as surety for the West Virginia Division of Highways road access grant for the Wolf Creek project was approved.

Third, most of the overrides simply replaced the original 2005 RCVM value with the 2004 RCVM value. Why do this on 650 parcels and not on all parcels?

Randy Robertson, question of why he was not notified of this application, he owns adjoining property?

Tim Richardson, zoning officer, the Unified Development Code states that property owners within 250 feet will be notified of applications even though Mr. Robertson's property is adjoining he is not within 250 feet of the 75 acres advertised for rezoning.

Gene Kistler, take politics out of this process. Base your decision on the merits of the application, sewage treatment, water service, these are the concerns that need to be addressed.

Mr. Harris told the Commissioners that on behalf of the State Tax

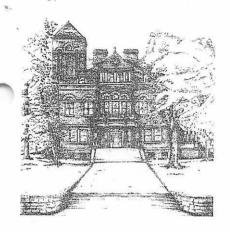
Department and the Assessor they did what they were supposed to do.

The Fayette County Commission finds that the State Tax Department revalued the property after reviewing the documentation submitted by the Meadow River Coal Company.

SOUTHERN CONSERVATION DISTRICT 463 RAGLAND ROAD BECKLEY, WV 25801 304-253-0261

The Southern Conservation District was formed in 1944 for the purpose of promoting soil and water conservation. We are directed to provide for the conservation of the soil and soil resources of WV, for the control and prevention of soil erosion, for the prevention of floodwater and sediment damage, and to further the conservation, development, utilization and disposal of water.

We review plans of contractors, developers and landowners when they do any earth disturbance and we encourage the use of sediment and erosion control measures. We supervise the conservation activities in Fayette, Raleigh, Mercer, Wyoming, McDowell and Summers counties. We are one of fourteen conservation districts in WV.

We give priority to flood control and emergency flood clean-up over all other operations. We have our own crew and equipment that we us to build ponds, clean waterways, and maintain dams. We help FEMA and other Federal and State agencies during emergency situations such as floods, hurricanes, etc. Currently we have three dozers, an excavator, a track loader, loader with backhoe, two farm tractors, three dump trucks, a lime truck, hydro-seeder, tractor trailer (auto car), seven pick up trucks, and numerous pieces of small equipment including welders, pumps, sprayers, chippers, chain saws, fertilize spreaders and air compressors. We currently have a maintenance crew of five employees who utilize this equipment on a daily basis.

The following equipment is available:

Excavators available for pond work and stream cleaning

Straw mulcher available for reclaiming critical areas

Dozers and endloaders available for land clearing, grading, building farm ponds and flood work

Hydro-seeder available to seed, fertilize and mulch critical areas

Deliver and spread lime upon request

The District crew is available to assist cooperators with spring developments, fencing and building farm roads.

There are twelve Supervisors on the Southern Conservation Board authorized to execute agreements for the District under approved programs of the various federal and state farm agencies.

Congress set up the Conservation Districts in 1935 and they were enacted by FDR in 1937. All states now have the districts; about 3,000 local districts throughout the U. S.

We are a legal sub-division of state government covered by Chapter 19-21A of the West Virginia Code. It identifies our responsibilities as:

Identify local conservation needs and develop, implement, and evaluate programs to meet identified needs

Educate and inform landowners and operators, the general public and local, state and federal legislators on conservation issues and programs.

Administer the District, raise and budget District funds and report District activities to the public.

Coordinate assistance and funding from federal, state and local government, district association and private groups.

Supervise paid staff and volunteers working with our District.

Landowners can call the Southern Conservation District office at 304-253-0261 to schedule work or to request a cost estimate for farm work.

The Southern Conservation District office is open Monday thru Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Executive Assistant is Becky Floyd.

Commissioner Wender thanked everyone for coming.

Dear Commissioners,

In response of your request for information concerning building permits issued in regard to nonprofit organizations. The Zoning Office, Building Safety Department, Assessor's Office and Prosecuting Attorney's office has compiled the following information.

A flow of information derived from building permits issued by the county is essential to the Assessor's Office to continue the ever changing assessments throughout the county in regard to residential housing and commercial construction.

Information contained in the building permit process such as zoning classification and flood plain information is necessary to all financial institutions and insurance companies in regard to their client's liabilities and in most situations is a part of their criteria.

The inspection process insures the home or business owner that the construction that they have invested in is indeed a quality product as inspected by the building safety department through the different phases of construction.

In discussions with West Virginia Housing it was revealed that they do final, on site inspections only. No footer, rough in of plumbing or electrical on site. This does not meet the ICC guidelines for inspection and the opinion of the prosecuting attorney's office is if we differentiate in our inspection process other than what has been adopted as ordinance we incur liability concerns.

The fee structure for building permits will be 1% of the cost of construction as calculated by the building safety office by a formula derived from the ICC. The minimal cost of the inspection process from beginning to end is estimated by the building safety office to be

\$400.00 per project. This figure is derived from the cost of paying contractual inspector fees and the average mileage incurred to the project sites.

Any change in the fee schedule would have to be action by the commission as an amendment to the adoption of the building safety office and its guidelines.

Upon consideration of all the foregoing information, it is recommended that the Commission rescind its previous directive to allow nonprofit organizations to opt out of the ICC inspection process of the County and require all construction to be inspected for ICC compliance as the Ordinance was originally adopted. In the event the Commission desires to give the nonprofit entities some relief from the cost of the inspections, it is recommended that the minimum amount of \$400.00 be charged to prevent the County from losing any money for the inspections.

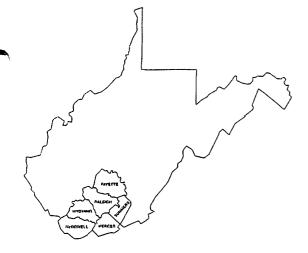

The Commissioners approved and signed exonerations as submitted by the Assessor's Office.

John David and Kathy South with Southern Appalachian Labor School appeared before the Commission with a proposal to seek funding for the Group Work Camps, Energy Express, and SALS Beards Fork for the Fiscal Year Budget 2005-2006.

Mr. David told the Commissioners that the Group Work Camp has 800 volunteers coming this spring.

Mr. David is requesting \$10,000.00 for the Group Work Camp project.

Mr. David is told the Commissioners that he had applied matching funds with the Benedum Foundation.

Mr. David presented a letter to the Commissioner asking the City of Montgomery to support.

Mr. David is requesting \$3,000.00 for the Energy Express Program and \$5,000.00 for the Community Center/beards Fork Clinic and Health Project.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. David the Commissioners appreciate presentation and appreciate everything that SALS has done.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent appeared before the Commission to discuss his budget for the Park and Central Garage for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.

Mr. Pauley is requesting that Donna Cooper hourly rate increase from \$5.15 to \$6.15 current salary \$10,712.00 proposed salary \$12,792.00 would like to make her a full time employee with no benefits.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioner that 90% Richard Dix time is spent helping Dan Pauley in the garage.

Mr. Pauley is asking that Mr. Dix be transferred from the parks budget to the Garage budget asking for an increase in salary from \$6.15 to \$6.75.

Mr. Pauley is proposing raises for extra help.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that his budget proposal is \$287, 215.07.

Mr. Pauley presented the Camp and FOOTMAD schedule for 2005.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioners that he has two employees (Kristin Lilly and Richard Dix) is interested in becoming Certified Pool Operators (CPO).

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley to cut back on anything he can without interrupting services.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners the Contractual Services totaled \$41,919.00.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that the cost for maintenance on the copier is \$900.00, needs to replace cost would be \$2,945.00.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley to find maintenance agreement for the copier.

Commissioner Lopez told Mr. Pauley he will check with Judson Wallace to see how often the Civitan building is being used.

Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners that the Personnel Services totaled \$287,215.00, salary and wages from \$116,977.44 to \$143,699.20.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that there would be an increase in the Garage Expenses, requesting a new assistant for Dan Pauley, asking for a budget revision for this year to transfer Richard Dix to the Garage Expense, Dan Pauley salary the same.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioner that maintenance and repairs current amount budgeted \$75,000, for Fiscal Year now it's at \$58,000.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley to look at his numbers again.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Pauley to talk about the Central Garage budget sometime next week.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Pauley he will do some studying and get back with him.

Kelvin Holliday, County Clerk, appeared before the Commission to discuss his budget for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.

Mr. Holliday is requesting an additional employee; \$1400 a year for Linda Johnson and Judy Hess; other employees \$800 per year. Mr. Holliday told the Commissioners that the increase requested do not include any across the board raises; overtime for Linda Johnson \$2,000; \$4,000 extra help, travel \$2,500; dues \$200 and books \$13,250 total cost of budget requested \$309,621.00.

The Commissioners told Mr. Holliday they would review and get back with him.

Eddie Young, Assessor appeared before the Commission to discuss his budget for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Young if the PVC budget was okay.
Mr. Young replied yes.

Mr. Young told the Commissioners that everything stays the same, requesting \$100.00 raise for his employees.

Mr. Young informed the Commissioners that one employee picked up insurance this year, adjusted FICA and insurance, no other changes from last year.

The Commissioners told Mr. Young the Commission would review and get back with him.

Paul Blake, Prosecuting Attorney appeared before the Commission to discuss his budget for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.

Mr. Blake is requesting a \$100.00 per month raise for each secretary and attorney, requesting that the Fayette County Commission pick up any PEIA annual increase, would take the Commission to give serious consideration for the dental insurance package plan advocated by the West Virginia of Counties, total budget \$535,563.53.

Discussion was held regarding the Regional Jail cost. Mr. Blake told the Commissioners they need to go to the Legislature to get changed.

Carl Harris, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney informed the Commissioners that the Sheriff had received an invoice from C-PAC requesting that this bill be paid by the County.

Mr. Harris told the Commissioners that this bill was where Stacy Workman, Dog Warden purchased food for the animals with her own money. She should be reimbursed by C-PAC.

Mr. Harris told the Commissioners that he and the Sheriff feel C-PAC should reimburse Ms. Workman.

The Commissioners approved for C-PAC to reimburse Ms. Workman and Mr. Harris to inform C-PAC of their decision.

Daniel Wright, Circuit Clerk appeared before the Commission to discuss his budget for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.

Mr. Wright total budget request is \$262,086.40.

Mr. Wright told the Commissioners that he reduced his travel from \$2,500 to \$1,000.

Mr. Wright told the Commissioners that his plans are to install a new counter for the front office. Mr. Wright told the Commissioner he received two estimates one for \$11,000 and one for \$2,500. Mr. Wright presented a drawing of the counter to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Wright to check on ADA accessibility. Mr. Wright told the Commissioners he would.

Ms. Holly asked Mr. Wright about the entrance to the Circuit Clerk's Office once the elevator is installed and also asked Mr. Wright if the bids included state labor wages.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Wright to get good drawings.

Mr. Wright told the Commissioners that Dan Snead with J. Dan Snead Associates will be looking over the plans.

The Commissioners recessed for lunch at 12:00 p.m.

The Commissioners reconvened the County Commission meeting at 1:30 p.m.

Diane Meadows, WVU Extension Agent appeared before the Commission to discuss her budget for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.

Ms. Meadows is asking the Commission to restore County's portion of the 4-H Agent's salary, (\$7,234); to increase travel (\$1,000); to increase the county's portion of the Agriculture Agent's salary via agreement reached in 2002 (\$3,500); to increase Capital Outlay and

Equipment for the replacement of an old computer for an agent and a much needed LCD projector for educational programming; to increase dues/subscriptions and program supplies (\$900.00).

Debbie Tate, 4-H Agent presented her budget request to the commissioners.

Ms. Tate told the Commissioners she is expecting 150 campers this year.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Meadows to show a breakdown of Agents salaries for the past two years.

The Elected Officials met with the Commissioners to discuss and review the Fayette County Personnel Policy.

Discussion was held regarding the overtime pay and how it's paid.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to adopt the Fayette County
Personnel Policy today make effective March 15, 2005. Commissioner
Lopez seconded. Unanimous. The Commissioners asked that copies be made available to all the employees.

Commissioner Wender asked the Elected Officials if they wanted to sign the Policy.

The Elected Officials told the Commissioners that since they were here during the discussion of the policy with them they would be satisfied with the three Commissioners' signatures on the policy.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that all three Commissioners sign the Policy. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Mr. Cruikshank informed the Commissioners that there are a lot of grants with the emphasis on Homeland Security. Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners he is working on a grant for \$30,000 for equipment.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Cruikshank to write a letter to the Firefighters Association urging them to pick up the salary for Theresa White.

David Neal, E911 Coordinator appeared before the Commission to discuss his Fiscal Year 2005-2006 budget.

Mr. Neal told the Commissioners that the 911 Center is 100% self sufficient, currently in the process of trying to take over the home confinement program. Mr. Neal told the Commissioners that the home confinement program has been installed.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Neal to push the issue of the 911 to handle the home confinement program.

Mr. Neal is requesting a \$.50 raise for his employers. Mr. Neal presented to the Commissioners the pay scale he is suggesting.

Mr. Neal told the Commissioners he have two unfinished projects (radio upgrade, and Computer-Aided Dispatch System).

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Neal they will deal with these items after Legislative Session.

Ms. Holly told Mr. Neal she would not recommend taking all the monies to pay for projects.

Mr. Neal told the Commissioners he would contact REI Consultants to see how long he can hold that price for the projects.

Commissioner Eskew informed Mr. Neal the Commissioners would take under advisement and get back with him.

Arnold Whitlow appeared before the Commission to request that the Fayette County Commission secure the use of the Gauley Mountain Fire tower for Fayette County RACES, for use as a location for our Amateur Radio equipment, in order for RACES to continue to furnish emergency communication to local government and other agencies.

Give Fayette County National Bank a floppy disc or CD to send to our processor (CSI). This disc or CD must be in NACHA format. This means that your payroll program must be compatible with Direct Deposit. Debbie has checked on this and it is capable of producing a disc in NACHA format. Your S/W vendor will help Debbie set up and create a NACHA formatted file.

The Federal Reserve Bank charges \$50.00 per month processing fee and \$.10/ACH transaction and \$.10/ACH return item.

The Bank must have the disc three (3) business days prior to the pay date.

You would need to send a prenote of \$00.00 prior to the time you send an actual payroll with dollar amounts. This is to insure that all bank ABA's and all employee bank account numbers are correct. I would suggest you send your prenotes of \$00.00 to coinside with an actual payroll paid the existing way. Then, two weeks later you can send your first actual payroll using dollar amounts.

Not everyone has to sign up. However, you need to send a prenote on everyone that does want direct deposit. This would mean that new employees get their first payday by check (coinciding with the \$00.00 prenote) and their second payday may be by direct deposit.

You can pay the payroll any date you want to as long as you have the NACHA formatted disc to the bank three (3) business days prior to payday. However, you can not pay part at one time and the rest on the regular pay date. You also cannot allow your employees to switch back and forth.

The only minor problem some employers have had is with their hourly employees, but seem to work it out.

- 4. The Fayette County Assessor has used said appraisals and equalized them at 60% to assess the said property of "Taxpayer" for property tax purposes for the tax years in question.
- 5. Reliance by the State Tax Department and The Fayette County Assessor upon the erroneously filed property tax returns has resulted in the substantial underassessment for property tax purposes of said property. Petitioner is uncertain at this time as to whether such returns were occasioned by unintentional or inadvertent acts or by intentional refusal to make a proper return or by deliberate false answers to questions posed by the Assessor or the State Tax Commissioner.
- 6. West Virginia Code §11-3-27 provides the statutory basis for correction of the erroneous assessment, such clerical error or mistake having been discovered by the Assessor of Fayette County within one (1) year prior to the filing of this petition.

Therefore based upon the following, I, Paul M. Blake, Jr., Prosecuting Attorney of Fayette County, do hereby request, under provision of West Virginia Code §11-3-27, that the erroneously property tax assessments for Tax Year 1993 through Tax Year 2005, inclusive, be corrected and that all of the provisions in law relating to failure to list property for property tax purposes should be imposed.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve and sign agreement from the Fayette County Board of Health and Donald Newell, Jr. D. O. as part-time Fayette County Health Officer at \$2,000.00 per month. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Discussion was held regarding vacancy on the Planning Commission due to the death of Lee Massey. Commissioner Eskew informed he will thank about someone to replace in the New Haven District.

Commissioner Eskew informed the Commissioners that Sharon Hobbs or Katheryn Hoffman is willing to serve as a member on the Public Defenders Board to replace Ken Roop.

The Commissioners asked that these recommendations be held until the next meeting.

Allen Ballard, Building Code Inspector appeared before the Commission to discuss the inspection fees for nonprofit entities.

Mr. Ballard told the Commissioners that the Code allows exemption to fees, most cosmetic improvements exempt from fees, willing to waive 1% but not inspection fees, fill out a building permit, waive 1% for new home, but feels needs to be inspected.

The Commissioners asked Mr. Ballard to interview each applicant and make recommendations to them.

The Commissioners asked Mr. Ballard to submit a list of names to be appointed to the Building Inspector Appeals board.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Ballard if the municipalities were in favor of the Building Code Inspector.

Mr. Ballard told the Commissioners he has contacted the Town of Ansted, the City of Oak Hill, the Town of Fayetteville and the City of Mount Hope. Mr. Ballard told the Commissioner he has a meeting with the Town of Ansted and he will keep them informed.

Sheriff William Laird and Sergeant Ronnie Booker appeared before the Commission to discuss TRIDENT Program.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that the TRIDENT Program has been very beneficial to Fayette County, very active drug task force, financial support from grants, the grant has been annually reviewed the last four to five years.

Sergeant Booker told the Commissioners that they met a week ago.

Raleigh Counties Incident Based Reports (IBR) not in compliance, Grant application was rejected.

Sergeant Booker told the Commissioners that the remedy to get grant application approved is to have Fayette County Sheriff be the sponsor since they are in compliance. Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners they are here today for Fayette County Commission to agree to be the substitute sponsor.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that two deputies are assigned to the TRIDENT Program. Renewal application will supply funding for continuance.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that the application has to be submitted by June 2, 2005.

Sheriff Laird informed Raleigh County not in compliance to apply they have no funds. Fayette County is in compliance. Raleigh County will try to have decision overturned. Sergeant Booker will still be the overseer.

Commissioner Wender questioned about the drug problem in the Valley area of Fayette County.

Sergeant booker informed the Commissioners that 90% of the program in Fayette County goes to the penitentiary, in Raleigh County they are put on probation.

Sergeant Booker told the Commissioners that he and Sheriff Laird will take a closer look at the drug problem in the Valley.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion that Fayette County sponsor application for the TRIDENT Drug Task Force for a period of one year. Commissioner Eskew seconded. All approved.

Commissioner Eskew asked what if the decision for Raleigh County be overturned.

Sheriff Laird informed the Commission that Fayette County will still have to be the Agency.

Sergeant Booker will prepare the paperwork. The application

requires the County Administration signature. Copy of a pay stub to be mailed to the Division of Criminal Justice.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioner that drawdowns are usually signed by the President.

Sergeant Booker informed the Commissioners that expenses for office space and utilities will be paid by Raleigh County out of the Asset Forfeiture Funds.

Sheriff William Laird told the Commissioners that the Community Corrections grant submitted on Friday, May 27, 2005 will be reviewed, received favorable feedback. Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners he would keep them posted.

The Commission adjourned at 12:30 p.m. for lunch.

The Commission reconvened the County Commission meting at 1:45 p.m.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent and Peggy Bennet appeared before the Commission to discuss the ADA for the Fayette County Park grant for pool ramp, Danese step, and propane gas for the Fayette County Park.

Ms. Holly presented a copy of Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent Fiscal Year 2006 Budget.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that they had received a complaint back in July 2004 from Attorney Tom Fast.

Ms. Holly told the Commission that the National park Services is the oversight agency for any Park.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that the Budget Digest approved \$5,000.00 to install an access ramp into the pool at the Fayette

County Park.

Commissioner Eskew asked if the Fayette County Commission would be able to access the ADA Funds.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners they would have to request a change in scope for the Courthouse Digest Grant.

The Commissioners authorized Mr. Pauley to proceed with the paving and materials for the ramp, cost for the ramp would be \$6,967.98.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners the table with the umbrella is in, has cost for changing room, the sling is in place, working on the parking areas, floating devices has been taken care of.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners most of the inexpensive complaints can be corrected, the ramp would be the most expensive.

Commissioner Wender asked if they should pull an additional \$1,500.00 from Grant or should the County Commission pay.

Ms. Holly recommended to the Commissioners after the change of scope to include cost of all courthouse facility's accessibility.

Commissioner Wender asked if the Fayette County Commission can expend then take from the Grant?

Ms. Holly recommended to the Commission to go ahead and expend, feels the change of scope would be approved.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve paving, installation of a ramp, notifications, dressing room renovations, drawdown funds from ADA Grant to include cost of Independent Living Audit change in scope of the existing grant. Commissioner Wender seconded.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that the pool will be open June 4 or June 5, 2005.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that a breaking and entering at the Park, pump was stolen.

Ms. Holly asked Mr. Pauley to get quotes for insurance. The Commissioners asked Mr. Pauley to get back with Ms. Holly tomorrow.

Mr. Pauley questioned the Commissioners about paying \$6.50 an hour for a pool manager. The Commissioners asked Mr. Pauley to get with Ms. Holly to see if this was included in this year Fiscal Year 2006 budget.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Mark Campbell was transferred from the Fayette County Park Fund to the Sheriff Fund approximately one month ago.

Ms. Holly informed that Richard Dix is being paid full time out of the Fayette County Park Fund at \$1,066.00 a month. Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she would let Mr. Pauley know tomorrow.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that Peggy Bennett will be back as a CPO over the Fayette County Park Pool.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that the American Red Cross, Roseann Berry is having their 2006 concert with the Platters Show. Fayette County Park will furnish the concession. The American Red Cross will get the funds from the gate.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that he lost money last year because the ice machine stopped working. Mr. Pauley asked the Commission if he could purchase an ice machine and make their own ice. The cost to repair the ice machine is \$839.00. The Commissioners

approved for Mr. Pauley to get the ice machine fixed and bag own ice.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioners they are currently buying ice 500 bags at \$.60 each. The Commission approved for Mr. Pauley to buy bags of ice.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioners that the Dead Prophet Society Group from Fort Wayne, Indiana is donating a stove for the Dining hall.

Commissioner Wender informed Mr. Pauley that Kathy Shrider's husband has AmeriCorp workers, Commissioner Wender suggested that Mr. Pauley could use workers to work on grounds, paint, clearing debris etc. at the Fayette County Park.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley if steps have been completed at the Danese Detachment.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners everything has been done but the handrails. He will make sure that this is taken care of.

Commissioner Wender asked about the cost of propane for the Animal Shelter.

Mr. Pauley suggested going to landfill, propane is too expensive, cost would be \$2.35 a gallon.

Mr. Pauley suggested to the Commissioners to talk with Mark Lokant or Mr. Thurmond regarding this matter.

The Commissioners recommended that Mr. Pauley make contact regarding gas for Park and come back with what to do at the June 27, 2005 County Commission meeting.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley about the road going up to the Animal Shelter.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioners that everything is ready will take care of when time is right.

Ms. Holly asked Mr. Pauley if he would prepare a list of vehicles to be taken off the county's insurance. Ms. Holly asked the Commission if they wanted to have an auction.

Commissioner Wender replied yes, an auction by the end of the year possibly June 27, 2005.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley to get a list to Ms. Holly of everything to be auctioned off as soon as possible.

Ms. Holly requested that Mr. Pauley get an accurate list for publication.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that the change of scope will need an original signature. Commissioner Wender told Ms. Holly he would stop by and sign.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a check from the Town of Thurmond for contribution to the Dog Tax Fund, amount \$300.00.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners that David
Pollard, County Resource Coordinator is working on the Danese Public
Service District boundaries.

Matthew D. Wender, John H. Lopez, Kenneth L. Eskew MEMBERS Present:

The Fayette County Commission met in a regular session on this 28th day of November 2005.

Commissioner Wender called the meeting to order at 9:20 a.m.

Eddie Young, Assessor presented exonerations to be approved and signed to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that the exonerations are approved as presented by the Assessor. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve vouchers and payrolls, payrolls and vouchers to be released today. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners that Steve Cruikshank, OES Director will not be able to make his appointment this morning. Commissioner Wender told the Commissioners that Mr. Cruikshank will call.

Sheriff William Laird appeared before the Commission and presented to them a cop of the Fayette County Community Corrections Program Policy manual.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners invoices for approval from Debbie Berry, Bookkeeper she received last week while on vacation.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to authorize Ms. Berry to

issue checks and release today. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly presented a Petition to Combine or Divide and Segregate Land to be approved to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve the Petition to Combine or Divide and Segregate Land for Sona L. Watkins as presented by the Assessor. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners signed a letter to Michael Proops, Controller, Family Law Masters requesting reimbursement for rent in the amount of \$2,025.00 for the month of December 2005.

Ms. Holly presented overtime for James Perdue, Debbie Aliff and Jackie Hickman to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve overtime for James Perdue, Debbie Aliff, and Jackie Hickman. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners signed the Certificate of Buyer of Taxable Fuel for Use by a State or Non-Profit Educational Organization from Exxon Company for verification of Federal Identification Number.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that she went back and checked and the Commission did approve for Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent to purchase an air compressor at the Fayette County Park.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received an invoice from Means Lumber Company for supplies bought to hang a sign at the Wolf Creek Development Park.

Commissioner Eskew informed the Commissioners that this invoice

is given to Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator to be paid out of the Fayette County Urban Renewal Authority.

Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney appeared before the Commission to request purchase of an Elmo EV-2000AF High Performance Visual Presenter with 24 x Magnification and two Inspiron 600m laptops and a Dell 3400 MP Projector for his office.

Mr. Harris told the Commissioners that he has \$8,624 in his Asset Forfeiture Fund. The cost of the equipment is \$6,440.00.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve purchase of equipment for the Prosecuting Attorney's Office to be paid out of the Prosecuting Attorney's Asset Forfeiture Fund not to exceed \$6,500.00. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received an e-mail from David Neal, E911 Coordinator informing that lighting struck the 911 Center Friday evening and did some minor damage to their equipment.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners they lost one of the 911 ALI telephone computers, replacement for the 4 monitors would be approximately \$1,495.00 because the original style equipment is no longer available.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to authorize purchase and replace equipment from the 9-1-1 Fund not to exceed \$10,000 less the insurance. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners received and signed two originals each of the Purchasing Division Release Order (WV Form 39) and the Procurement and Delivery Acceptance Agreement from the Secretary of State Office.

These forms will complete the procurement procedure for the HAVA

voting equipment. These forms are to be completed in order to release each county's portion of funds against the state marker purchase order and to authorize delivery of the new voting system equipment.

Steve Cruikshank, OES Director appeared before the Commission to discuss the 2004/2005 Bridge Day reimbursement.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Cruikshank if our monies that were spent for 2004 Bridge Day recoverable.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Cruikshank that the amount of reimbursement due is \$4,479.40 for Law Enforcement plus others monies.

Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners that the State over spent the Homeland Security Fund they owe a lot of people money, they have not released anything yet.

Mr. Cruikshank told the Commissioners that all the expenses would be covered.

Commissioner Wender asked if all the documents were submitted on time. Mr. Cruikshank replied yes.

Sheriff William Laird suggested filing action with the Court of Claims.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Cruikshank to make some contact with someone at the Home Land Security to see where we stand on receiving our reimbursement.

The Commissioners suggested to Mr. Cruikshank to write a letter and ask why the State Agencies are getting reimbursed but the Counties are not.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Mr. Cruikshank to be scheduled for the next Commission meeting to give another update.

Maura Kistler appeared before the Commission to inform them of the Fayetteville Skate park Project.

Ms. Kistler told the Commissioners that she has not received her packets but once she receives the packets she would forward a copy to the Commission to review.

Ms. Kistler told the Commissioners the Park will be open from dawn to dusk. Police will be policing the area.

Ms. Kistler told the Commissioner she is in the process of reaching out to the civic groups for donations. Ms. Kistler told the Commissioners that their website is skatefayetteville.com.

Ms. Kistler told the Commissioners that she just came in to make the Commission aware of the project.

Commissioner Wender told Ms. Kistler that the Commission takes up budget matters in March.

Commissioner Wender suggested to Ms. Kistler to put her request in a letter.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received an e-mail from Jennifer Boyd regarding the New River Health Department.

Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners if they wanted too follow-up on the letter they received from A & W Sanitation.

Commissioner Lopez informed he feels the Commission should respond.

Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners if the Fayetteville Middle School Basketball Players Association could use the Memorial Building on December 16, 2005 for a dance for the Fayetteville Middle School Student Body.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve waivers of the rental fee and the custodial and trash services fees on the use of the Memorial Building on December 16 for a dance for the Fayetteville Middle School Student Body contingent upon receipt of the principal's written confirmation that the dance is a school function and covered under the certificate of insurance from the Board of Education.

Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous. A letter signed to Okey Skidmore, Manager of the Fayette County Memorial Building.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners he received an e-mail from Chris Dyer, Housing Consultant informing that the week of November 28 through December 2, 2005 will be the last week he will occupy the office space on the third floor.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to e-mail Mr. Dyer and inform him that the Commission would like to meet with him on December 9 to discuss the status of the Fayette County Housing-Economic Opportunity Council. Commissioner Wender asked that he call Jackie Hickman to schedule an appointment.

Commissioner Wender asked that James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor be put on the agenda December 9, 2005 to discuss the maintenance department schedule.

Commissioner Wender asked to put in the minutes the special meeting that was scheduled for November 18, 2005 was cancelled due to the Legislative Delegates was not available to attend.

Commissioner Wender approved to write the allocation check (\$500.00) today for the Fayette County Toy Fund.

The Commissioners adjourned the County Commission meeting at

12:00 noon for lunch.

The Commission reconvened the County Commission meeting at 1:45 p.m.

John Campbell and John Housh appeared before the Commission to give them an update on the River Ridge Project. Also present were Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney, Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer and Eddie Young, Assessor.

Mr. Housh told the Commissioners that Phase I of the project have begun.

Mr. Housh presented the sewer plans for the project to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Eskew asked what time line for the project.

Mr. Housh replied 45 to 60 days. Phase I is near closing.

The Commissioners thanked John Campbell and John Housh for their presentation.

The Commissioners asked Mr. Ballard to prepare estimates and submit with application.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion ordering the release of said securities provided that securities will be substituted simultaneously and that Fayette County funds deposited with said banking institution will not be unsecured. Commissioner Wender seconded. All approved. Order signed.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners the Fayetteville Fairs and Festival Committee is having a small celebration from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on the Courthouse lawn to honor the unveiling of the State quarter.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a request from the Fayetteville Fairs and Festival Committee requesting permission to use the Courthouse lawn/sidewalk for their annual Christmas Festival to be held on Saturday, December 10, 2005.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve the request of the

Fayetteville Fairs and Festival Committee permission to use the courthouse lawn/sidewalk for their annual Christmas Festival.

Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender asked that Debbie Aliff, Payroll Clerk get the cost of the software. Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Ms. Aliff was to get cost for the different funds.

Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney presented the Authorization for the Fire Departments to charge fees for Service Ordinance to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve Authorization for Fire Department to Charge Fees for Services Ordinance. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous. Ordinance signed.

Commissioner Wender informed that this item is on the Agenda and no one here to oppose the Ordinance. The Ordinance to be effective October 14, 2005.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that she talked with the contractor who will do the windows and was told they might start within a week.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to authorize request for contractor to do the window project for up to \$100,000. The Commission match would be 20% (\$20,000). Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that she received a letter from the Division of Highways regarding the repair and/or maintenance of the Gauley Mountain Tower road.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that a field investigation by their District nine staff revealed this road is not part of the State Highway System.

The Division of Highways informed they will be unable to comply with the Commission's request since they are prohibited from expending state highway funds for the repair of non-state roads.

Commissioner Eskew informed that this road is in need of urgent

repairs.

Commissioner Wender asked that a follow-up letter be sent regarding the Gauley Mountain Tower road.

Commissioner Wender asked to request that this road be included in the State Highway System and to inform them that as a result of the security implications of the 9-1-1 tower and other media tower, this road is critical to the safety and well being of a significant number of residents of Fayette County and the State of West Virginia.

Commissioner Wender asked to include in the letter that due to the urgency to provide immediate maintenance to the road prior to inclement winter weather the Commission would like the Division of Highways to provide an estimate for the minimal amount of repairs necessary to make the road accessible including a retaining wall.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners a request from Eddie young, Assessor for ST premier mapping Software, amount \$4,113.05.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to approve requisition from Eddie Young, Assessor for purchase of ST Premier mapping Software, amount \$4,113.05. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Sheriff William Laird requesting that a check be issued for the payment of travel expenses incurred by Kathy Jones to attend the Batters' Intervention Program (BIPS) training in Charleston on September 21-23, 2005, amount \$342.75.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to reimburse travel expenses to Kathy Jones, amount \$342.75 for attending the BIPS

Training/Community Corrections Program. Commissioner Wender seconded.

All approved.

Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney reviewed and approved the Agreed Order and Reference to Fiduciary Commissioner.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that based upon the announced agreement of the parties hereto, Rita L. Grabosky, petitioner, was married to the decedent, John Grabosky, Jr. At the time of his death the Commissioner Order that this matter shall be and is hereby referred to a fiduciary commissioner, Philip J. Tissue. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous. Order signed. (See attached)

The parties further announced that there is, at this point, a disagreement between the parties as to premartial will, probate estate assets, augmented estate and the values of assets included therein and, therefore, the parties agree that this matter should be referred to a fiduciary commissioner for the purposes of holding an evidentiary hearing on those matters that cannot be stipulated to and for a fiduciary commission to making purposed findings of fact and conclusions of law with recommendations to the County Commission for entry of a final order upon petitioner's petition.

ACCORDINGLY, it is the ORDER of this County Commission, based upon the announced agreement of the parties hereto, that Rita L. Grabosky, petitioner, was married to the decedent, John Grabosky, Jr., at the time of his death; and, that her Petition for Elective Share pursuant to West Virginia Code §42-3-1, et seq., was timely filed. It is the further **ORDER** of this County Commission that this matter shall be and is hereby referred to a fiduciary commissioner, namely Philip J. Tissue, who shall, upon a mutual time agreed to by the parties and said commissioner, conduct an evidentiary hearing for all purposes related to this matter and shall ultimately present unto this Commission proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law for its consideration toward entry of a final order by the Commission upon petitioner's petition. The expense of the fiduciary commissioner shall be an expense of the Estate of John Grabosky, Jr.

- b. A flat fee of \$50.00 for a building permit when the electrical power is required to be turned off and an inspection required before the power can be turned back on, if the project is within the jurisdiction of the County Building Code Department. Projects outside the jurisdiction must follow the guidelines of the utility company.
- c. Non-profits are exempt from the building permit fee for weatherization projects and for Group Work Camps unless the structural integrity of the dwelling is altered, then the project must be inspected.
- d. Non-profit organizations shall be exempt from a building permit fee for a period of one year for all rehab projects.

monitor this new guideline and in their interpretation in one year if

Ms. Adkins present spoke in regard to her application, stating she wanted to clarify the parking on the lot, stated parking was adequate for 30-50 cars as confirmed by an appraiser. Presented pictures of the location This was not presented to the planning commission.

Question, Ken Eskew, does the handicapped parking meet the federal guidelines? Adkins, yes it does. Eskew and have you met the health permit requirements? Adkins, yes I have.

Ken Eskew, is there a concern of flooding in this location. Adkins, flood waters did not reach the inside of the building in prior floods. Adkins, I have done everything by the law.

Question Matt Wender, you are requesting B-2 to have a restaurant, an ABC license for video lottery and a bar? Adkins, yes.

Matt Wender, what about B-2 for restaurant use only? Adkins, I want video lottery and a bar to go along with the restaurant. Question, John Lopez, was this a non-conforming compliance before?

Tim Richardson, ZEO, yes it was but the business was closed for longer than one year and lost it's non-conforming designation and reverted to R-R and they were required to reapply for the business zoned district.

Alan Whitt, the planning commission's recommendation was just. There is a concern of flooding in this location and of the septic system. I am certain that this business was closed before because of septic system failure over four years ago. I also have a petition with an additional 91 signatures against this request bringing the total against to 591. This will be a determent to the community. Their plans are for video lottery, a bar and liquor sales. We are representing the community and ask that you please honor the recommendation of the planning commission.

Question, John Lopez, is there any business located within 300 feet of this ?Alan Whitt, no. There is a sign for a Christian school close to this building, but not within 300 feet itself.

Ken Eskew, is there a problem of a restaurant only being operated? Alan Whitt, there is a concern of the property not being a desirable location and needs further investigation. This business was operating illegally against the county guidelines. We are not opposed to a business location.

Matt Wender, question, are there no health concerns? What about no alcohol or video lottery, a restaurant only? Any opposition to this? No opposition.

Cammy Adkins, the septic was approved, health department did a dye test.

Alan Whitt, there is no documentation to prove this. There were problems with the septic with prior businesses located here. Ken Eskew, this was closed because of health concerns? Tim Richardson, ZEO, explained B-2 zoning could be approved with no alcohol consumption on site, a bar with video lottery would have to approved by the BZA with application for a special use permit, but there would be package sales approved within B-2.

Debbie White, Cammy Adkins has worked hard to get this business going. Amanda Skaggs, from the health department approved the health department part of the business. Cammy Adkins was unaware of the zoning guidelines when opening the business. She needs a chance to prove the business. Parking is not a problem.

Connie Pennington, I work at a lottery video business, bar restaurant, they are monitored by the ABC commission. There is no problem with these establishments.

Alan Whitt, there are problems associated with these businesses, that's why there is a gamblers hotline.

Cammy Adkins, this is really no different than lottery ticket sales. Alan Whitt, I am in opposition of this also.

Deborah Taylor, I opened a restaurant business only at this location, March 1999 and there were no problems and closed due to other obligations.

Matt Wender, question, do you have to have video lottery and a bar ?

Cammy Adkins, I plan to apply for a special use permit for further use of the business.

Rev. Pope, my location is a few hundred feet from this location. The county commission has done good work for the communities here today. Do we need another location for alcohol? Need revenue for the county? Law enforcement, fire and EMS will have more calls because of this business. There will be domestic problems because of this. You have an opportunity to look out for the welfare of the county. You have to live with your decision. Some businesses don't serve alcohol, but most do. Make a difference in your decision.

Catleen White, there should not be a bar in Danese, we love these people, but we don't love what they want to do.

BreAnn Justice, please don't allow a bar in Danese, the community is bad enough. Please, no bar.

Don Ray Bragg, Church and God's people are too silent, it's time to stand up. God gave you the ability to make the right decision. Cynthia Jones, several restaurants have tried to make a go of it her, family restaurants, this location has sewer problems, you can't have carryout beer without a liquor license. This will compound problems, children will suffer. A hometown community is against alcohol.

Tim Richardson, ZEO, explained that B-2 would allow packaged sales of alcohol.

Deborah Taylor, stated that the prior business was not closed because of sewer problems.

Delores Berry, wished to speak but didn't because she had not previously signed to do so.

The Commissioners asked that Jim Lively Insurance review.

Commissioner Wender asked Jim Lively to review what the County's premium cost would be if the Commission was a party to the lease agreement.

The Commissioners adjourned for lunch at 12:30 p.m.

The Commissioners reconvened the Commission meeting at 1:20 p.m.

The Commissioners recessed to go into an Executive Session to discuss personnel matter with Daniel Wright, Circuit Clerk, to discuss attorney client matter relating to the Pocahontas Land Company with Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney, and to discuss personnel matter with David Neal, E911 Coordinator.

The Commissioners reconvened from the Executive Session at 2:35 p.m.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Pauley where he would get the \$4,000 from. Mr. Pauley replied not out of his budget.

Mr. Pauley asked the Commission about budgeting out of the \$4,407.67 donations the Fayette County Park receives to purchase a controller for the Christmas lights for next year. Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners the cost would be from \$65 to \$500.00.

Commissioner Wender asked that this be worked on in March.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that the City of Mount hope is

running a dog catcher facility.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that the facility is not properly equipped to house dogs.

The Commissioners asked to hold off discussion of this until Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney returns.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley about the steps at the Danese Volunteer Fire Department.

Mr. Pauley presented a break-down of the materials used for steps at the Danese Volunteer Fire Department to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Wender told the Commission that Chris Campbell is asking that the roof over the steps be redone.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion that Earl Pauley spends up to \$1,100.00 to complete the pavement at the Danese Fire Department and the Community Center. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion to spend up to \$300.00 using county equipment to redo the roof over the steps of the Danese Fire Department. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Upon the return of Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney the Commission asked him about the situation at Mount Hope regarding housing of dogs at their facility.

Mr. Harris suggested that a letter be sent to the City of Mount Hope informing them they are in violation of the Humane Society laws and also suggested to Mr. Pauley to ask that when delivering dogs to the Fayette County Animal Control Center all paperwork should be in order.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that they have received several

compliants on Mark Campbell the dog Warden.

Commissioner Lopez suggested that this be addressed on the October 14, agenda. Commissioner Lopez suggested discussing putting Russell Parker on as Dog Warden. Commissioners asked that Steve Kessler be present for this meeting.
