The Fayette County Commission met in a regular session on this $6^{\rm th}$ day of April 2007.

Commissioner Eskew called the meeting to order at 9:25 a.m.

Eddie Young, Assessor presented exonerations to be approved and signed to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve real property tax for Lester and Evelyn R. Hanshew, Paul and Margueritte Boyd, Rex Allen Crouse, Kenneth R. and Patsy A. Horrocks. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve and sign personal property tax for Derrick Ramsey, Matt Claypool, Jonathan Wilson, and Jessica Sowder and Jetta A. Mahood. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve vouchers, invoices and payrolls, payrolls to be released today. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve and sign TRIDENT

Grant Application to the West Virginia Division of Criminal Justice

Services. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and sign Just For Kids Grant Application to the West Virginia Division of Criminal Justice Services. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she feels the Commission should pay Election Systems and Software (ES&S) invoices.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to pay the invoices of the Election Systems and Software (ES&S). Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Discussion was held regarding the Regional jail Expenses.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that the Commission will keep the billing rates effective June 1, 2006 through the current rate at \$45.00 a day understanding that the Commission has not paid the Regional Jail bill since June 2006, the credit that the Commission is entitled to through some date in September 2006. From September 2006 the Commission will pay bills based on the \$45.00 per diem.

Commission Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners approved to write checks for part of September 2006 through the current rate at \$45.00.

Commissioner Wender asked if the Commission should write a letter to the Regional jail to give an explanation? Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney told the Commissioners they did not need to write a letter.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to continue to pay the Regional Jail bills based on the \$45.00 per diem. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commission they need to join with NaCo and take another look at discounts based on pharmacy's giving a discount Prescription Card for citizens of the County.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners that nothing happened in 2006-2007 legislative sessions.

Commissioner Wender suggested setting a meeting to discuss and invite Wood Pharmacy, Main Street Pharmacy, Zimm's Pharmacy, NaCo representative and Tim McCormick from Ohio County to attend.

Commissioner Wender informed that this is not a benefit to anyone with insurance, only if you don't have insurance.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to set up for April 17th if possible. Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to contact the three pharmacies, NaCo Representative and Tim McCormick.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent appeared before the Commission to inform them that a couple of years ago the Town of Fayetteville had given them an excavator. The machine has never been used.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners the Town is asking that this equipment be moved.

Ms. Holly asked Mr. Pauley if he had an estimate on what the cost of the maintenance would be on the equipment. Mr. Pauley replied no.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to authorize Earl Pauley to move the County excavator to the Fayette County Park. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender asked to put Earl Pauley on the agenda for April 27th to discuss shooting range and Equitable Gas.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners they had advertised to receive bids for Mobile Radio.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she received only one (1) bid and it was from Motorola, amount \$43,466.40.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve the bid from Motorola contingent the Sheriff, David Neal, E911 Coordinator, Steve

Cruikshank, OES Director approves. Commissioner Lopez seconded.
Unanimous.

David Neal, E911 Coordinator and Kevin White, Telecommunications Specialist appeared before the Commission to give an update on the mapping/addressing project.

Mr. Neal told the Commissioners he received the first initial 10% disbursement of funds for the work plan that the County has submitted for the completion of the E911 addressing work, amount \$6,464.24.

Mr. Neal asked that this be deposited back into the 911 Fund account.

Kevin White told the Commissioners they are working on Phase 2-started on the postal conversion for Alloy, boomer, Charlton Heights.

Mr. White told the Commissioners this would be completed within a month or a month in a half.

Sheriff Laird presented a Resolution to the Commissioners informing they have been notified of the possible receipt of a grant award from the West Virginia Department of Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles, that will provide for the allocation of up to \$23,750 for the purchase of five (5) digital in-car cameras for use by the Fayette County Sheriff Department.

Sheriff Laird told the Commissioners that no local match is required.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to authorize Commissioner

Kenneth Eskew, President to act on behalf of the Fayette County

Commission in the making of the application for funding support made available through the West Virginia Department of Transportation,

Division of Motor Vehicles and to execute any and all documents that may be required for the proper submission of this application and agreement. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion for the Sheriff to purchase cruisers from the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 budget. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that the Commission goes into an Executive Session with Steve Cruikshank, OES Director to discuss personnel matter. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Eskew reconvened the Commission meeting at 11:23 a.m.

Commissioner Eskew informed the purpose of the Executive Session was to discuss Mr. Cruikshank's request to hire Theresa White as a full-time Hazard litigation Officer effective April 1, 2007.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to hire Theresa White as a full-time Hazard Mitigation Officer effective April 1, 2007, she will be continued as an employee for the next fiscal year, salary \$8.50 an hour, \$17,680 a year with benefits. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Attorney Phil Tissue appeared before the Commission with Petition to re-open the Estate of Francis White and Symantha Taylor.

Attorney Tissue told the Commissioners that the Estate of Francis White final settlement was filed on July 21, 2004.

Attorney Tissue told the Commissioners that after the closing of the Estate, the Executrix received information that the decedent was entitled to reimbursement in an undetermined amount from the Bureau of Workers' Compensation and in order to collect she would need a letter of administration indicating that she was the Executrix of said Estate.

Attorney Tissue told the Commissioners the policy of the County Clerk is to require a new estate administratrix. Attorney Tissue informed the Commissioners that the Petitioner would have to provide a letter of administration indicating that she is the Executrix of the Estate to the Bureau of Workers' Compensation.

Attorney Tissue is asking the Commission for an order requiring the County Clerk to re-open the estate of Francis White for the sole and only purpose of issuing a letter of administration, indicating that Nicole Granlund is the Executrix of said Estate.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to request that the County
Clerk draft a letter of administration on behalf of Nicole Granlund
indicating that she is the Executive. Commissioner Lopez seconded.
Unanimous.

Attorney Tissue told the Commissioners that the Estate of Symantha Taylor final settlement was filed on August 8, 2001.

Attorney Tissue told the Commissioners that after the closing of the Estate, the Executor received information that his wife was the sole owner of a retirement fund with the Kroger Company, and his name was not listed on said account, and that he would not withdraw the funds without a letter of administration, indicating that he was the Executor of the estate.

Attorney Tissue told the Commissioners the policy of the County Clerk is to require a new estate administration. Attorney Tissue

informed the Commissioners that the Petitioner would have to provide a letter of administration indicating that he is the Executor of the Estate to the Kroger Company.

Attorney Tissue is asking the Commission for an order requiring the County Clerk to re-open the estate of Symantha Taylor for the sole and only purpose of issuing a letter of administration, indicating that Glen R. Taylor is the Executor of said Estate.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to request that the County
Clerk draft a letter of administration on behalf of Glen R. Taylor
indicating that he is the Executor. Commissioner Lopez seconded.
Unanimous.

Ms. Holly presented a drawdown request for the Fayette County Commission-Page-Kincaid Public Service District Ingram Branch Wastewater Project #04SCBG0057, amount \$10,409.61.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve drawdown request contingent upon Page-Kincaid Public Service District approving invoices. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Leon Spencer appeared before the Commission to inform the Commission that he and his wife Effie Spencer received Recognition for their donation of the historical map of West Virginia.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion that Velma Newman be appointed a member of the Armstrong Public Service District.

Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous. Order and appointment to serve letter signed.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that the Fayette County

Commission would agree before hand to be the grantees for those monies

designated for the Armstrong Public Service District. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners signed Sales Tax Report for the first quarter (Jan. Feb. Mar.) for the Fayette County Park, amount \$155.35.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that there is an overdraft in the Dog Tax Fund and asked the Commission if they would sign an order transferring \$4,200.00 from the Fayette County General Fund to the Dog Tax Fund.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that \$4,200.00 be transferred from the Fayette County General Fund to the Dog Tax Fund to correct the overdraft. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners singed an Order to transfer funds to the Fayette County Dog Tax Fund (\$4,200.00) from the Fayette County General Fund.

The Commissioners signed Request for Reimbursement to the West Virginia Division of Criminal Justice Services for the Community Corrections Grant, amount \$7,045.45.

The Commissioners signed Request for Reimbursement to the West Virginia Division of Criminal Justice Services for TRIDENT Grant, amount \$1,239.50.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Region 4

Planning and Development Council informing that HUD has declared April
as "Fair Housing" month and enclosing a "Proclamation" to be adopted
by the Fayette County Commission at their next meeting.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion that the Fayette County

Commission proclaims April 2007 as "Fair Housing Month." Commissioner

Wender seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter and enclosures from the West Virginia Development Office encouraging the Commission to plan and implement appropriate activities in commemoration of fair housing during the month of April.

The Commissioners signed a letter of support of the plan by the Southern Appalachian Labor School plans to develop a low-income housing project as part of a YouthBuild project.

The Commissioners signed a letter of support regarding Southern Appalachian Labor School Home Rehabilitation Program.

The Commissioners signed a letter of support of the proposal for Housing Counseling Assistance submitted by Southern Appalachian Labor School.

The Commissioners signed a letter to David Jarroll, Executive
Director Nicholas County Community Action Partnership, Inc. regarding
the closure of the weatherization warehouse in Fayette County.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Department of Military Affairs and Public Safety informing that the Homeland Security Subgrant to the Fayette County Commission is delinquent for submitting January and February 2007 monthly reports.

The commissioners signed a letter to Senator Shirley Love regarding the walkway underneath the New River Gorge Bridge.

They have the endorsement of both the West Virginia Association of Counties and the County Commissioners' Association of West Virginia.

The Commissioners recessed for lunch at 12:10 p.m.

The Commissioners reconvened the Commission meeting at 2:15 p.m.

The Commissioners approved to change the April 17, 2007 County Commission meeting from 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.

The Commissioners approved to pay Theresa White full-time pay from the Fire Levy Fund effective April 1, 2007, salary \$17,680.00 plus benefits, one half to be reimbursed from the grant, balance to be reimbursed from General County Fund after receiving grant payment.

Commissioner Wender informed he would prepare a letter to Ed Harper regarding the Weatherization Program.

Commissioner Wender asked to copy Mr. Harper's letter to David Jarroll and hold copy of the letter to David Jarroll to enclose with second letter to Mr. Harper.

The Commissioners asked to put on the agenda for May 11th Public Hearing to propose County Ordinance to increase hotel tax from 3% to 6% and put on the agenda for a May 25 final vote on a proposed ordinance to increase hotel tax from 3% to 6% effective July 1, 2007.

business Friday, and removed by the start of business on Monday.

Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly asked the Commissioners if they wanted her to write a letter to Arbuckle Public Service District to inform them that they are still waiting for the proposal from Mike Griffith. The Commissioners replied yes.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received a check from Delegate John Pino for Armstrong Public Service District, amount \$50,000.00.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Brad Carelli had called

The Fayette County Commission met in a special session on this 17th day of April 2007.

Commissioner Eskew called the meeting to order at 9:25 a.m.

Doug Arbogast with the EPA Grant Funding Environmental Improvement appeared before the Commission to give an update on the Fayette County Courthouse Lighting Audit Overview Summary.

Mr. Arbogast told the Commissioners that the total project cost could go up to \$40,000.00 with a match of \$20,000.00.

Mr. Arbogast told the Commissioners he would schedule the rest of the energy audit as soon as possible, could be the first week in May.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Arbogast to schedule an appointment on the agenda to meet with the Commissioners to discuss the grant after all facilities are audited.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Arbogast to find out all of the details of the grant.

Mr. Arbogast to get in touch with James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor, to schedule a walk through of the courthouse buildings.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners they are here today to consider any objections and to officially adopt the levy rates for property taxation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007 and presented a notice of conditional approval of the levy estimated (budget) from the West Virginia State Auditor.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve the County

Commission Levy Order and Rate Sheet for Fiscal Year 2007-2008 (rates
the same as last year). Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners signed the Order laying the levy to be used in
Fayette County for Fiscal Year 2007-2008. Kelvin Holliday, County

Clerk signed the Levy Rate Sheet.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve vouchers and invoices. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Ron Booker, Commander, TRIDENT Task Force appeared before the Commission to inform them that they are invited to a check presentation from Purdue Pharmacy settlement funds, which will be presented by the Attorney's General's Office on Wednesday, April 18, 2007 at 10:00 a.m. in the lobby of the Raleigh County Memorial Airport.

Mr. Booker told the Commissioners they will be receiving \$50,000 from the Oxycotin Award for TRIDENT.

Mr. Booker told the Commissioners he received a call from the Attorney General's Chief Financial Officer (CFO) informing that the check could not be written to TRIDENT because they don't have a Tax ID Number. Mr. Booker told the Commissioner he told the CFO to write the check to the Fayette County Commission since they are the grantees for TRIDENT.

Mr. Booker asked the Commissioners if they would approve recommendation that the check be issued to the Fayette County Commission as a pass-thru and the Fayette County Commission to issue the check to TRIDENT. Mr. Booker told the Commissioners these funds

would be used for operational purposes, purchase of vehicles, substance abuse education and prevention, financing criminal investigations, overtime and purchasing surveillance equipment.

seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to go into Executive Session to discuss the River Ridge housing project. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners reconvened the County Commission meeting at 11:30 a.m.

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Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners that the Urban Renewal authority is going to make application to the Americarp Vista to hire a person for a one-year contract to work directly for Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator to make calls to recruit companies for Wolf creek Park. The Commissioners match would be \$2,500.00, Americarp's match is \$7,500.00.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that the Fayette County

The Commissioners asked if they are allowed to expand the number of members on the Public Service District Board.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners according to the West Virginia

Code the Commission can only expand the number of members if the Public Service District merged with another Public Service District.

Commissioner Wender told the Commission he received a call from Ken Toney from Ponderosa Bed and Breakfast regarding the hotel tax. He already has reservation reserved made for 2008.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to extend exemption of increased bed tax to December 31, 2007. There were no second. Motion died.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to contact Dan Snead and inform him they need to bid as soon as possible.

Commissioner Wender feels this would penalize application if they have not completed.

Commissioner Wender requested that Ms. Holly ask Mr. Snead to

John Campbell and John Hosch appeared before the Commission to discuss the Petition for a Community Enhancement Act.

Mr. Campbell told the Commissioners that nothing they do here to day is binding. Fayette County Commission is not obligated to approve.

Mr. Hosch gave an explanation of the Community Enhancement Act.

Mr. Hosch told the Commissioners this allow them to borrow taxfree bonds to finance infrastructure, filed a preliminary Petition-Community Enhancement Act-River Ridge subdivision.

Mr. Hosch told the Commissioners they have sold 55 of 82 platted lots have been sold for single family detached housing.

Mr. Hosch told the Commissioners he never intended to put a sewer into the project, tried to get septic tank permits but have not received any permits. Mr. Hosch told the Commissioners he would have to pursue either a sewer or guit working on the project.

Eddie Young, Assessor asked Mr. Hosch how is bond paid back?

Commissioner Wender replied the County would put the assessment on each land owner, each individual lot owner would have to pay.

Commissioner Eskew suggested tabling and take under advisement August 17, 2007.

Commissioner Lopez asked Mr. Hosch if he is going to try to clean up the zoning issues.

Mr. Hosch replied he has tried all he is going to do.

Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney presented a copy of the memo

written to John Hosch regarding the River Ridge Petition for Community Enhancement District (See attached copy).

Commissioner Eskew told Eddie Young, Assessor that the Commission have received several request from River Ridge property owners requesting exonerations of their 2007 tax ticket.

TO: FAYETTE COUNTY COMMISSION

FROM: CARL L. HARRIS

The Community Enhancement District creation is governed by West Virginia Code § 16-13E-4, a copy of which is appended to the Petition filed by Three Rivers Companies, LLC.

After reviewing the Petition and comparing its contents to the requirements of the aforesaid statute I find the following matters which I believe are not covered or not adequately covered:

- 1) A consultant's study as required by § 16-13E-4 (b) (6). I believe the code envisions an independent consultant and not what is contained in this Petition.
- 2) I do not find a development schedule included within the Petition.
- 3) I do not find in the Petition I reviewed a certification as required by § 16-13E-4(b)(12), however, based upon the ownership analysis in the Petition, it would appear that this is easily correctible. With the caveat that I do not believe the Commission can address this issue, I believe litigation will ensue to determine if the current owners of property within the area described as the "Community Enhancement District" can be subjected to the cost by majority land owner of the "District".

The Commission must review the Petition for matters that are not legal considerations upon which I should express an opinion. However, I find the following language to be very troubling "As everyone now knows, Fayette County adopted a Unified Development Code governing conditions for development within the county. These requirements are not economically feasible for the development of River Ridge. In order for this project to go forward, a multitude of

variances and hardships would need to be granted in a blanket format and an ever continuing situation through out the development process." To begin with, anyone considering a development project, whether in Fayette County or elsewhere, should know the local zoning laws before taking the first step, i.e. purchase of the property. Fayette County's UDC has not been hidden under a barrel in some dark damp corner of the Courthouse. To say that "As everyone now knows…" begs the question.

This language is further trouble some from the standpoint that upon acceptance of this Petition by the Commission, are you then going to be told by the developer that you acknowledged that there must be a multitude of variances, etc., and therefore they are to be granted?

I do not believe any Petition should be granted with this type of language. It undermines the very substance of the UDC. I am not saying that variances should not be considered and granted, only that they must be done in conformity to the law, which does not contemplate blanket coverage of exceptions.

regarding the informational package he provided regarding a Community Enhancement District near Kanawha Falls in the Valley District of Fayette County without further correspondence from the Fayette County Commission.

Mr. Harris told the Commissioner he would tell Mr. Hosch that Fayette County is receptive to new ideas based on what was discussed today.

Mr. Harris told the Commissioners that Kanawha Falls Public Service District can only have three (3) board members not unless they merge with another Public Service District. Gauley Bridge don't have any way to increase members.

Marvin Zimmerman and Earl Woodson members of the Arbuckle Public Service District appeared before the Commission to discuss request of the City of Oak Hill for Arbuckle's Public Service District Belt Press.

Mr. Zimmerman told the Commissioners they have no money manpower to operate properly.

The GEO bag is sitting where the press belt is.

The Commissioners informed Mr. Zimmerman according to August 20, 2004 minutes Arbuckle Public Service District is the owner of the belt press. The Fayette County Commission really has no voice in the matter.

Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney told the Commissioners that Arbuckle Public Service District and the City of Oak Hill needs to work out transfer and notify him with the details.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to appoint and sign Petitions

to Combine or Divide and Segregate Land for Janice Dickerson, Woodrum E. Butcher, Jackie L. and Mary Horrocks, Donald W. or Denise Redman, Jr., Larry W. Tincher, Linda J. Jones, Lynne Autry Arrington, Ronald Lee, II, and Letishia Carte, Matthew and Jennifer Bowyer, Gail W. Williams, Dreama Adkins and Sam and Christine Smith. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that James Perdue sister passed away.

The Commissioners received/reviewed and signed the SPF-SIG Grant.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Wachovia Bank, N. A. advising the Commission of the need to substitute certain securities pledged on behalf of Branch Banking and Trust Company (BB&T).

The Commissioners signed an Order, ordering the release of said securities provided that securities will be substituted simultaneously and that Fayette County funds deposited with said banking institution will not be unsecured.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney regarding county depositories.

BYLAWS Fayette County Board of Health

Article I - Name and Authority

The name of the organization shall be the Fayette County Board of Health, here-in after referred to as the "Board". The board is a single county board of health of Fayette County, West Virginia, organized under *Chapter 16, Article 2, Section 10 of the West Virginia Code.*

Article II - Membership

Section I. Number of Members and Appointments

For a single county, the membership of the Board shall consist of, at least, five members. (A combined board shall have a minimum of one, but no more than three members from each appointing authority) Chapter 16.2.8 The board shall be comprised of five members appointed by the County Commission of Fayette County.

Section II. Qualifications (Terms of Appointment and Reappointment)

All members of the board of health shall be citizens and residents of Fayette County. (Single County) - No more than two members who reside in the same magisterial district may be appointed and no more than two members may be appointed who are personally licensed or certified in, engaged in, or actively participating in the same business, profession or occupation. No more than three members may belong to the same political party. (Article 2, 16-2-7) (Combined) - The number of members of the Board belonging to one (1) political party shall not exceed by more than one (1) the number of members of the Board belonging to any other political party. No more than two members shall be personally and individually licensed in, engaged in, or actively participating in or carrying on, the same business, profession, or occupation. No more than two members can live in the same magisterial and /or municipal ward or district (See Article 2. 16-2-8 for full explanation)

Section III. Tenure - Each member shall serve a five year term and shall be eligible for reappointment. Members shall serve until their duly qualified successor has been appointed. Members may be reappointed for additional terms of five years. (16-2-9)

Section IV. Compensation – Each member shall receive \$50.00 compensation to attend board of health meetings. (Regulations state that compensation may not exceed one hundred dollars per day.) 16-2-9 (d)

Section V. Oath of Office - Each member of the Board shall be administered an oath of office when duly appointed. The Oath may be administered by the County Clerk of Fayette County or a judge. Oath of office shall be duly recorded. 16-2-9 (a)

Section VI. Vacancies – Any vacancy on the Fayette County Board of Health shall be filled by the Fayette County Commission and the appointment shall be made for the unexpired term. Any vacancy on the board shall be filled by the original appointing authority and shall be for the unexpired term. (16-2-9 (c)

VII. Removal from Office - No member of the board may be removed from office during the term for which they are appointed, except for official misconduct, incompetence, neglect of duty or gross immorality. 16-2-9 (c)

Section IX. Expenses - members may receive reimbursement for travel and other reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. 16-2-9 (d)

Section X. Conflict of Interest – Each board member is required to sign a Conflict of Interest Statement.

Article III - Meetings

The Board of Health shall comply with the requirements of WV Code 6-9A-1 through 6-9A-8 regarding open governmental proceedings. http://www.legis.state.wv.us

Section I. Attendance, - No Fayette County Board of Health member shall miss more than two meetings during a fiscal year. If the third meeting is missed, the board member may be in jeopardy of being removed from the board. As an alternative to missing a meeting, Fayette County Board of Health members may participate in a meeting by conference call if arranged ahead of time.

Section II. Quorum A quorum of the Fayette County Board of Health for transacting business is a simple majority of the constituent membership established by the board and recorded in the minutes. A quorum of the board for transacting business is a simple majority of the constituent membership of the board. 16-2-10 (b)

Section III. Meeting Types and Frequency

A. Regular meetings shall be held at least four times a year for counties with a population less than 30,000 residents and six times a year for those counties with a population over 30,000 residents. 16-2-10 (a) Regular meetings shall be held at least six times a year and shall be scheduled in advance for the entire year at the meeting immediately following the beginning of the fiscal year. Board members shall receive written notice of the meeting at least fourteen days prior to the meeting. The board shall comply with the requirements of WV Code regarding open governmental proceedings. (Chapter 6-9A-3)

B. Special - Special meetings of the Board shall be called by the Chairperson, the Secretary, or by two members of the Board, upon written request to

the Secretary. Board members shall be provided in writing or in person, notice and the agenda for the meeting, at least five (5) days prior to the meeting date.

- C. Emergency Notice will be given to the public and to the news media as much in advance as possible of the meeting date.
- D. Written Consents or Meetings by Telephone: Any action required or permitted to be taken at any meeting of the Board may be taken without a meeting if all members of the Board consent thereto and the writing or writings are filed with the minutes of proceedings of the Board. Members of the Board may participate in a meeting by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and participation in a meeting pursuant to this method shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
- E. Public Hearing Thirty days notice will be given by public notice posted at the Fayette County Courthouse and published in the Fayette Tribune. Interested speakers are requested to contact the Physician/Director, who will determine who may speak and for how long. (Notice of a public hearing will be published as a Class I legal advertisement in the Fayette Tribune at least thirty days prior to the date of the public hearing)

Section IV. Meeting Methods and Procedures

- A. Public Notification Notices of all meetings shall be given to the public in writing by posting notices at the Fayette County Courthouse and publishing in the Fayette Tribune. All members of the Board shall be notified of the date, time, and place of each meeting at least fourteen days in advance of each scheduled meeting.
- B. Minutes and Records: The Board shall provide for the preparation of written minutes of all its meetings. Minutes shall be available to the public within a reasonable time after the meeting and shall include the following information:

The date, time, and place of the meeting
The name of each board member present or absent
All motions, proposals, resolutions, orders, ordinances, and
measures proposed, the name of the person proposing the same
and their disposition, and the result of all votes.
Minutes of the Executive Session may be limited to material which
is not inconsistent with the provisions of Chapter 6 Article 9A
Section 5 of the West Virginia Code.

- C. Executive Session Notwithstanding any other provision or law or regulation, all meetings of the Board shall be open to the public, excepting the provisions of Chapter 6, Article 9A, Section 4 of the West Virginia Code. An executive session may be held upon a majority affirmative vote of the members present to discuss such subjects as are covered under current law: Chapter 6-9A-4
- D. Agenda An agenda shall be prepared and be available to board members and the public at least one day prior to the meeting. An agenda shall include time and date of the meeting, approval of the minutes of the previous meeting, items to be discussed, and any actions to be considered by the board.
- E. Voting Each member shall have one vote including the Chairperson

Article IV. Powers and Authority

The board shall have the power and authority to adopt and promulgate, and amend such rules and regulations, consistent with the laws of the state of WV, as may be necessary and proper for the protection of the general health of the county or municipality, and the prevention of the introduction, propagation, and spread of disease. All rules and regulations shall be filed with the clerk of the county commission, and with clerk, recorder of the municipality as defined by Chapter 16, Article 2, Section 10 of the West Virginia Code.

Section I. The board of health shall have the authority to appoint a full or part-time physician/director to serve at the will and pleasure of the appointing authority for the term of one year and approval by the commissioner of the state Bureau of Health. Such physician/director shall be a physician, licensed or eligible for licensure as a physician in the state of West Virginia. Compensation for services provided by said health officer shall be established by the Board of Health. The health officer is to serve as the Secretary of the Board

Section II. Powers and Duties: (Refer to Article 2. Local Boards of Health, Section 16-2-11 for duties and Leg Rule 64-73-5) List, or refer to these sections and attach a copy to bylaws)

- A. Health Services and Programs
- B. General Administration
- D. Physical Facilities
- E. Program Plan

Section III. Election of Chairperson will be done annually at the first meeting of the fiscal year.

Section IV. The Board of Health shall employ an administrator or designate a staff member or shall contract for an administrator to manage day-to-day operations.

Section V. The Board of Health shall employee or contract with any administrative, clerical, or other persons, to serve as needed and at the will and pleasure of the local board of health. Staff and other contractors providing services to the board shall comply with applicable WV certification and licensure requirements. Eligible staff employed by the board shall be covered by the rules of the Division of Personnel under Section Six, Article Ten, Chapter 29 of this code. The Board of Health may develop and adopt a merit system for all employees of the county health department that shall be similar to the State Merit System. (Chapter 16-2-11, (10), (2) - Merit system)

Article V. Officers

Section I. Types of Officers

Chair Vice-Chair Secretary

Section II. Election and Term Officers shall be elected by the Board at the first meeting of the fiscal year. The term of office is one year and begins at the end of the meeting in which they are elected. An officer shall be eligible for reelection to the same office.

Section III. Duties of Officers

Chairman: The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board and shall perform duties as custom and parliamentary procedure may require; call special meetings as needed; appoint all members to standing or special committees; make and execute contracts in the ordinary course of business; execute other legal instruments when authorized by the Board; sign all official documents as required by the Code of West Virginia; and serve as the official spokesman for the board.

Vice-Chairman: The Vice Chairman shall assist the Chairman in the performance of the duties of the office and shall preside at meetings in the absence of the Chairman. The Vice Chairman shall have other duties as may be assigned by the Board.

Secretary: The Health Officer, or designee, shall serve as Secretary and shall record written minutes of all meetings and shall provide copies to each board member and to the office of Local Health and the Commissioner of the Bureau for Public Health.

Section IV. Vacancies of Officers

If a vacancy occurs in the office off Chairman, the Vice-Chairman shall become Chairman. If a vacancy occurs in the office of Vice Chairman, the Board shall, by majority vote, fill the vacancy until the next election.

Article VI. Financial Management (Reference to Legislative Rule 64-CSR 73 - 8. Financial Management) List these requirements as stated in Legislative Rule 8-1 through 8.7.

Article VII. Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of "Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised", shall govern the Board in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by laws and any special rule of order the Board may adopt.

Article VIII. Amendment to the By-laws

These bylaws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board, provided a quorum is present. Changes must be approved by a two-thirds vote of the Board members present, provided that each member has received written notice of the proposed amendments no less than 30 days prior to the vote.

§64-73-1. General.

- 1.1. Scope. This legislative rule establishes standards for the plans of operation, administration, fiscal reporting, quality assurance, and provision of public health services and programs by local boards of health.
 - 1.2. Authority. -- W. Va. Code §16-1-7.
 - 1.3. Filing Date. April 22, 1996.
 - 1.4. Effective Date. April 22, 1996.

§64-73-2. Application and Enforcement.

- 2.1. Application This rule applies to local boards of health.
- 2.2. Enforcement This rule is enforced by the director of the division of health.

§64-67-3. Definitions.

Health.

- 3.1. Department The state department of health and human resources.
- 3.2. Director The director¹ of the division of health and his or her designee.
 - 3.3. Division of Health or Division The

The Department of Health and Human Resources (DHHR) was created by the Legislature's reorganization of the executive branch of State government in 1989, and the Department of Health was renamed the Division of Health and made a part of the DHHR (W. Va. Code §5F-1-1 et seq.). Administratively within the DHHR the Bureau of Public Health through its Commissioner carries out the public health function of the Division of

division of health of the department of health and human resources.

- 3.4. Fiscal Year The twelve (12) month period beginning the first day of July and ending the thirtieth day of the following June.
- 3.5. Local Board of Health or Board A board of health serving one (1) or more counties, one (1) or more municipalities, or a combination thereof.
- 3.6. Local Health Department The staff of the local board of health.
- 3.7. Local Health Officer An individual physician with a current license to practice in West Virginia, who is knowledgeable of sanitary laws, and who shall supervise and direct the activities of county or municipal health services, employees and facilities.
- 3.8. State Aid Funds Funds appropriated annually by the legislature to provide financial aid to local boards of health.

§64-73-4. Organization.

- 4.1. A local board of health shall be organized in accordance with Chapter 16 of the W. Va. Code.
- 4.2. A local board of health in a county having a population greater than thirty thousand (30,000) shall meet no less than six (6) times a year. A local board of health in a county having a population less than thirty thousand (30,000) shall meet no less than four (4) times a year.
- 4.3. The board shall comply with the requirements of W. Va. Code §§6-9A-1 through 6-9A-6 regarding open governmental proceedings.

4.4. The by-laws of the board shall at a minimum include attendance requirements for board members, the number, duties, tenure and qualifications of members, a description of the process for filling vacancies on the board, requirements for written minutes and records of board actions, and a description of the duties and election process for officers. A quorum of the board for transacting business is a simple majority of the constituent membership of the board.

§64-73-5. Health Services and Programs.

- 5.1. The board shall provide the following public health services and programs:
- 5.1.1. Evaluation of the health needs of the community it serves using generally accepted professional health needs assessment techniques;
- 5.1.2. Efforts to prevent and control epidemics, and investigation and containment of diseases and injuries through compliance with the requirements of W. Va. Division of Health Administrative Rules, 64 CSR 7, Reportable Diseases, regarding disease surveillance and epidemiological reporting;
- 5.1.3. Promotion of a safe and healthy environment, and maintenance of clean and safe air, water, food and facilities through a program of routine public health environmental education and control:
- 5.1.4. Promotion of healthy lifestyles, including the provision of health education to individuals and communities;
- 5.1.5. Targeted outreach and the formation of partnerships with other community organizations; and
- 5.1.6. Initiation and participation in mobilization of the community for actions to improve the health and well-being of the population served.
- 5.2. The board shall administer public health sanitation rules as specified by the

director with regard to:

- 5.2.1. Public drinking water sanitation;
- 5.2.2. Sewage and wastewater sanitation;
 - 5.2.3. Food and milk sanitation;
- 5.2.4. Housing and institutional sanitation;
 - 5.2.5. Recreational sanitation; and
 - 5.2.6. General sanitation.
- 5.3. The board of health shall implement a program of immunizations according to the Standards for Pediatric Immunization Practices, as published by the U. S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- 5.4. The board shall conduct preventive health programs designed to promote healthy behaviors.
- 5.5. The board may provide individual health care services.
- 5.6. The board shall maintain and conform to its written policies and procedures governing patient or client referral, release of information, confidentiality, and the consent for staff to provide services to patients or clients which shall be consistent with applicable federal and State laws, rules and regulations.
- 5.7. Patient or client care protocols, including standing orders and medical directives shall be approved annually by the local health officer.
- 5.8. The board may charge fees for permits and services as authorized by the director, the State legislature and applicable State law and rules.

§64-73-6. Reports and Records.

The board shall in a timely manner submit reports and records in compliance with applicable State and federal rules and

regulations and departmental policies.

§64-73-7. General Administration of the Local Health Department.

- 7.1.1. The board may employ or contract for staff to carry out its duties and responsibilities within funding available.
- 7.1.2. The board shall have a written organizational chart for the local health department which indicates lines of authority and responsibility.
- 7.1.3. The board shall review the organizational chart annually and shall document the review in minutes of an official board meeting.
- 7.1.4. The board shall employ an administrator or designate a staff member or shall contract for an administrator to manage day-to-day operations.
- 7.1.5. Staff and consultants of the board and of any contractors providing services for the board shall be in compliance with applicable West Virginia licensure requirements.
- 7.1.6. The board shall have liability insurance at least equivalent to that available to local boards through the State board of risk management which includes all staff, board members, and contracted services.

7.2. Policies and Procedures

All administrative polices, procedures, rules, and instructions specifying the operations and activities of the staff, including patient- or client-related activities shall be written and readily available to relevant staff.

7.3. Personnel Management

- 7.3.1. The board shall keep a confidential personnel record for each staff member.
- 7.3.2. The board shall review and reapprove or revise functional job descriptions, including those performed

through contract, at least every two (2) years.

7.4. Staff Development

- 7.4.1. The board shall provide an orientation program for all new staff which shall include, at a minimum, introduction and discussion of all policies relating to the job, behavior expected, patient confidentiality, and individualized on-the-job training in specific functions.
- 7.4.2. The board shall provide training for staff who assume new functions or increased responsibilities or who experience other changes in their job responsibilities.
- 7.4.3. The board shall provide inservice and continuing education related to current responsibilities to staff on an ongoing basis.

§64-73-8. Financial Management.

- 8.1. The board shall participate in audits of and shall be in compliance with procedures required by the State tax commissioner. The board shall include a copy of the most recent audit report with the annual submission of the program plan required by Section 10.1.2 of this rule.
- 8.2. The board shall identify in writing staff or contract staff who have the authority to:

8.2.1. Handle cash;

- 8.2.2. Sign checks in accordance with W. Va. Code §16-2A-6; and
- 8.2.3. Approve or disapprove of expenditures.
- 8.3. The board should maintain a cash reserve equal to at least the past three (3) months' operating expenditures of the local health department.

- 8.4. The board shall establish a written schedule and procedures for reimbursement of employee travel and other expenditures.
- 8.5. Contracts, memoranda, or other forms of agreement between the board and other
- 8.7. No later than thirty (30) days prior to the first day of July, the board shall develop a budget for the coming fiscal year. The budget shall identify and provide details of the operating expenses needed for each individual program and other activities.

\$64-73-9. Physical Facilities.

- 9.1. The board shall provide facilities and equipment for the local health department.
- 9.2. The board should be able to provide evidence that the buildings and grounds of the local health department are in compliance with federal and State laws and regulations.
- 9.3. The buildings and grounds of the local health department shall have one (1) or more outside signs which clearly, identify the department.
- 9.4. The board shall promote the protection of patient or client privacy.
- 9.5. The board shall establish a policy prohibiting smoking or the use of smokeless tobacco in the local health department.

§64-73-10. Program Plan.

10.1. Program Plan

- 10.1.1. The plan shall be submitted on forms supplied or approved by the director which shall include:
- 10.1.1.a. A comparison of current year activities (year-to-date) and projections for the coming year;
- 10.1.1.b. A brief general mission statement;
 - 10.1.1.c. An overall general five

- 10.2.2. The board shall provide opportunities for and document citizen and staff participation in planning, developing, and implementing programs.

10.3. Evaluation

The director shall approve or disapprove the board's program plan based on compliance with this rule.

\$64-73-11. Penalties.

In the event that the director determines that a local board of health is not in compliance with this rule, the director may withhold State aid funds until such time as the board submits an acceptable plan to correct deficiencies in the program plan.

§64-73-12. Administrative Due Process.

Those local boards of health adversely affected by the enforcement of this rule who desire a contested case hearing to determine any rights, duties, interests, or privileges, shall do so in a manner prescribed in W. Va. Division of Health Administrative Rules, Rules of Procedure for Contested Case Hearings

and Declaratory Rulings, 64 CSR 1.

§64-73-13. Severability.

The provisions of this rule are severable. If any provisions of this rule are held invalid, the remaining provisions remain in effect.

FAYETTE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH

6-9A-3 Proceedings to be open; public notice of meetings.

Except as expressly and specifically otherwise provided by law, whether heretofore or hereinafter enacted, and except as provided in section four [6-9A-4] of this article, all meetings of the Fayette County Board of Health shall be open to the public. The Fayette County Board of Health may make and enforce reasonable rules and regulations for attendance at any meeting where there is not room enough for all members of the public who wish to attend, and this article shall not be construed to prohibit the removal from a meeting of any member of the public who is disrupting the meeting to the extent that orderly conduct of the meeting is compromised.

The Fayette County Board of Health shall promulgate rules by which the time and place of all regularly scheduled meetings and the time, place and purpose of all special meetings are made available, in advance, to the public and news media, except in the event of an emergency requiring immediate official action.

6-9A-4 Exceptions.

No provisions of this article shall be construed to prevent the Fayette County Board of Health from holding an executive session during a regular, special or emergency meeting, after the presiding officer has identified the authorization, under this article for the holding of such executive session and has presented it to the Fayette County Board of Health and to the general public, but no decision shall be made in such executive session.

An executive session may be held only upon a majority affirmative vote of the members present of the Fayette County Board of Health as defined in this article for the following:

- (2) The issuance, effecting, denial, suspension or revocation of a license, certificate or registration under the laws of this State or any political subdivision, unless the person seeking such license, certificate or registration or whose license, certificate or registration was denied, suspended or revoked requests an open meeting; or
- (3) The physical or mental health of any person, unless such person requests an open meeting; or
- (4) Matters which, if discussed in public, would be likely to affect adversely the reputation of any person; or
- (5) Matters of war, threatened attack from a foreigh power, civil insurrection or riot.

6-9A-5 Minutes.

The Fayette County Board of Health shall provide for the preparation of written minutes of all of its' meetings. All such minutes shall be available to the public within a reasonable time after the meeting and shall include, at least, the following information:

- (1) The date, time and place of the meeting;
- (2) The name of each member of the Fayette County Board of Health present and absent from the meeting;
- (3) All motions, proposals, resolutions, orders, ordinances and measures proposed, the name of the person proposing the same and their disposition; and
- (4) The results of all votes and, upon the request of a member, the vote of each member, by name.

Minutes of executive sessions may be limited to material the disclosure of which is not inconsistent with the provisions of section four [6-9A-4] of this article.

6-9A-6. Enforcement by injunction; actions in violation of article voidable.

The circuit court in the county where the Fayette County Board of Health regularly meets or the judge thereof in vacation shall have jurisdiction to issue an injunction to enforce the purposes of this section upon petition by any citizen of this State who can show a good faith and valid reason for making such application. No bond shall be required unless such petition appears to be without merit or made with the sole intent of harassing or delaying or avoiding return by the Fayette County Board of Health.

Any actions taken or decisions made in violation of this article may be voidable upon petition filed within thirty days after such actions or decisions to be aforesaid circuit court or the judge thereof in vacation and such court may order that such actions taken or decisions made be performed in compliance with the provisions of this article.

6-9A-7 Violation of article; penalties.

Any person who is a member of the Fayette County Board of Health required to conduct open meetings in compliance with the provisions of this article and who willfully and knowingly violates the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or imprisoned in the county jail not more than ten days, or both fined and imprisoned.

Commissioner Eskew called the meeting to order at 9:13 a.m.

Eddie Young, Assessor presented exonerations to be approved and signed.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and sign real property tax for Clarence Saunders, Don Lynn and Anita Kay Taylor and Carlos E. Adkins, Sr. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve and sign personal property tax for BTB Wrecker/Plateau Salvage. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve vouchers, invoices and payrolls, payrolls to be released today. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Tom Hughes with Hughes Supply Company appeared before the Commission to discuss the bid for the mobile radios.

Mr. Hughes told the Commissioners that Homeland Security specifications require AES software encryption to be installed.

Commissioner Eskew asked David Neal, E911 Coordinator if he new anything about these bids.

Mr. Neal told the Commissioners that Sheriff William Laird or

Steve Cruikshank, OES Director has not shared any of this with him.

Mr. Hughes told the Commissioners that Motorola specifications should be changed.

Mr. Neal recommended to the Commissioners to have Motorola (Two-Way Radio) to modify bid language and change the one spec. from ADP to AES.

David Neal appeared before the Commission to discuss a request of leave of absence for an employee at the 911 Center.

Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney suggested to the Commissioners to go into an Executive Session to discuss matter.

The Commissioners adjourned at 9:45 a.m. to go into an Executive Session with David Neal to discuss the request for leave of absence.

The Commissioners reconvened the County Commission meeting at 9:55 a.m.

Commissioner Eskew informed the issue regarding the request for leave of absence has been resolved.

The Commissioners approved overtime for James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor and Debbie Aliff, Payroll Clerk.

Fred Hypes, Attorney for the Arbuckle Public Service District appeared before the Commission to discuss a funding match. Also, present were David Duncan, Earl Woodson Arbuckle PSD Board members, bob Zimmerman, Nancy Humphreys, and Tom Wagner with Roaring River.

Mr. Hypes told the Commissioners that they have been working with the Division of Environmental Protection and the Public Service Commission.

Mr. Hypes told the Commissioners they would engage the services

of Michael Griffith, CPA to assist with this matter.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Hypes if Arbuckle had recently received a rate increase on their water and sewer. Mr. Hypes replied yes.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Hypes with the customer base that you have is Arbuckle making it.

Mr. Hypes told the Commissioners that their pumps are in the shop, don't have a back-up, with past debt they cannot get caught up.

Commissioner Wender told Mr. Hypes without making any decision today, Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Hypes to get with Michael Griffith prepare a list of the equipment that needs to be prepared, and legally advertise for an accountant to help with a long term financial dealings.

Commissioner Wender asked that Mr. Hypes and Mr. Wagner schedule another appointment with the Commission to discuss further.

The Commissioners scheduled Arbuckle Public Service District for February 16, 2007 at 11:00 a.m.

Tom Oxley, Manager City of Oak Hill, Bill Hannabass, Council member, Jim Hudson and Harold Simms with the Department of Transportation appeared before the Commission to discuss Phase II of the White Oak Rails to Trails Project.

Commissioner Wender informed that the Commission and the City of Oak Hill applied for paving grants for the Oak Hill Trail project.

The Commissioners applied for the Transportation Enhanced program, the City of Oak Hill applied for the Recreational Trail Program.

Commissioner Wender informed the portion of the trail go beyond

the city limits which are the south of the trail and that is the Commission's responsibility. The City is responsible for the area North of WV 16.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commission had accepted the grant with the understanding the Commission would have no dollars attached just an in-kind contribution and the City would cover the Fayette County Commission in-kind.

Commissioner Wender informed he hope we can figure out a solution to getting the County out of the \$15,000.00 obligation.

Harold Simmons with the Transportation Enhanced Program will try to work with the Commission regarding the pay as you go method.

Mr. Simmons told the Commissioners that he was under impression that the Commission would only have a cash match of \$2,300.00 after the Budge Digest money and the other sources paid the rest. These monies have not been received.

Mr. Simmons told the Commissioners that if they wanted the City or County employees to do the work on the project the Department of Transportation will reimburse 80% of the cost.

Mr. Simmons told the Commissioners that if they use City or County employees to do the work with whatever equipment they use, they should bill each month and they would be reimbursed.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Simmons if the County used City employees, the City would bill the Commission and the Commission would send reimbursement to the Transportation Enhancement Program and the Commission would reimburse the City.

Mr. Simmons told the Commissioners that Rhonda Brisendine is

their contact person.

Tom Oxley and Bill Hannabass are willing to work with the Commission

Commissioner Wender informed the Commission would proceed with everything that's in place sit down with the Oak Hill Rail to Trail and the Department of Transportation officials and try to work out some kine of budget, and see what is needed on each side of the trail.

Commissioner Wender informed if the Commission feels the work can get done without the County, they can get out of the second part.

Mr. Simmons told the Commissioners that his office needs to know something by May.

Commissioner Wender asked Debbie Berry to contact the Oak Hill officials (Tom Oxley and Bill Hannabass), and the Department of Transportation representatives (Harold Simmons and Rhonda Brisendine) with the intent of coordinating a budget, drafting an agreement, and decide whether the County's part of the \$15,000 grant can be covered with in-kind services.

Bill Hannabass told the Commissioners that a 3% Hotel/Motel Occupancy bill is in the legislation this bill will authorize the County Commission to allocate funds for different projects.

Mr. Hannabass told the Commissioners that Oak Hill doubled its tax and dedicated the additional revenue to the trail project. Mr. Hannabass suggested to the Commissioners they could do the same if the bill passed.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve appointing Tommy

R. Harris, a member of the Fayette County Beautification Committee and

a member of the Fayette County Solid Waste Authority. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners asked for a five (5) minute recess at 11:00 a.m.

The Commissioners reconvened the County Commission meeting at 11:15 a.m.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent, Peggy Bennett, Jodie Ward and Bob Meadows appeared before the Commission to give an update on the shooting range.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that the logs are being moved out. Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners they have eighteen (18) more trees to take down, waiting on weather to clear, sight prep for the water lines and power lines have to be put in.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Ward if they have decided on where the buildings would go.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Pauley to get some kind of time line on when this project would be completed. The traps have been ordered.

The Commissioners asked that they report back on February 13, 2007 at 11:30 a.m.

Attorney Fred Jesser appeared before the Commission to give an update on the Gary W. Johnson Estate.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve minutes of May 11, 2007. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Mr. Perdue told the Commissioners he received recycling bins today.

The Commissioners signed a memo to all elected officials and their employees informing that they voted unanimously to implement a paper recycling program in the Courthouse complex.

Mike Lively representative of BrickStreet Insurance appeared before the Commission to discuss the Workers' Compensation Program.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Lively if BrickStret has a program for (1) a return to work policy and (2) how promptly are they when claims are filed, does BrickStreet have a program for this. Mr. Lively replied yes. Mr. Lively told the Commissioners he can help the Payroll Clerk install the program on her computer.

Mr. Lively told the Commissioners he would get information for the program and will set-up, will go over employee classification with Debbie Aliff, Payroll Clerk.

Mr. Lively told the Commissioners that the total payroll figures have been reviewed, updated (pay increases) and policy job classification amended with Ms. Holly and the BrickStreet underwriters, the new policy term is annual from July 1, 2007 to July 1, 2008, County and Municipalities must stay with BrickStreet until July 1, 20012, Premium is \$96,399.00 plus insurance Commission Surcharge of \$5,287.00 and WV Deficit Reduction Surcharge of \$7,134.00, the county's EMOD (Experience Modifications) has been reduced from 1.99 to 1.59. This amounts to an annual premium savings of \$20,919.00. Mr. Lively told the Commissioners that overtime a continued reduction in claims can lead to an additional savings of \$30,856.00.

Jim Lively, Sr. appeared before the Commissioner to give the Commission the latest figures on insurance for the courthouse property.

Mr. Lively told the Commissioners he received building valuations from square footage and replacement costs as a result of the inspection by him, James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor, and the Engineer did on all the buildings.

Mr. Lively told the Commissioners there were several increases in aggregate limits, the premium is \$46,000 less than last year.

Mr. Lively told the Commissioners that the County's experience improved, worked out Deputy's Webb accident experience.

Mr. Lively told the Commissioners a \$1,000 deductible on any property loss, no deductible on liability if \$5,000 deductible another

\$3,000 if it's a \$10,000 deductible another \$4,600.

Commissioner Wender recommended that the County go to \$5,000 deductible on property. The Commissioners approved.

Mr. Lively told the Commissioners that this renewal excludes terrorism.

Mr. Lively told the Commissioners he will receive a detailed report. The Fayette County Commission signed the renewal contract.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she received six (6) applications for the clerical assistant for the Building Safety Officer.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she sent originals to Allen Ballard to review and make recommendations.

The Commissioners asked that the applications be forwarded to Dave Pollard and Allen Ballard to review and make recommendations.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly if she has heard anything back from NACo regarding the prescription discount cards.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners she sent the information to Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney to review but she has not received any comments or recommendations from Mr. Harris.

Amber Marstiller appeared before the Commission to give a report on the SPF-SIG grant.

Ms. Marstiller told the Commissioners that the Comprehensive Work Plan is due June 1st. Application is due by July 16, 2007.

Ms. Marstiller told the Commissioners she is applying for \$124,000 for the next three (3) years for the Strategic Prevention FrameWork State Incentive Grant Prevention Resource Center.

Ms. Marstiller told the Commissioners that five (5) different agencies throughout the counties have applied. There are ten (10) remaining counties applying.

Ms. Marstiller told the Commissioners she would know by the end of August if the grant is approved.

Attorney Grady Ooten appeared before the Commission to present a Petition for Annexation of certain additional territory into the municipality of Fayetteville, Fayette County, West Virginia.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve the annexation as requested by the Town of Fayetteville with those properties included within the Huse Memorial Park Cemetery contingent upon corrections of legal documents received by Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney.

Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Virgil Berry presented to the Commissioners' application for the Homeland Security Grant the Commission had previously agreed to Sponsor for the American Red Cross for the purchase of radios, cots, and other equipment, amount \$24,788. The Commissioners signed application.

Doug Arbogast appeared before the Commissioners to ask if the Fayette County Commission would agree to the formation of a committee for the green house emissions.

Mr. Arbogast told the Commission they would like for one of the Commissioners to be on the committee.

Commissioner Wender informed Mr. Arbogast the Commission is supportive of the concept but would like more details.

The Commissioners signed the Going Green Resolution.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Arbogast about the Lighting Grant application.

Commissioner Wender informed that part of the Fayette County Commission contribution will be in-kind for county labor.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to ask Earl Pauley, Park
Superintendent about the retired vehicles, and also ask Eddie Young,
Assessor before the next meeting if anything available regarding
retired county vehicles.

The Commissioners told Mr. Arbogast the next meeting is July 6, 2007.

The Commissioners put Mr. Arbogast on the agenda for 9:00 a.m. to discuss vehicles for the Sustainable Committee.

The Commission will talk with Earl Pauley. Commissioner Lopez informed he would talk with Eddie Young, Assessor regarding the vehicles.

William Shiffer appeared before the Commissioners to discuss his \$5,000.00 financial request for support for summer intern program for Western Greenbrier County Generation.

Mr. Shiffer told the Commissioners that Greenbrier County Commission has committed \$5,000.00 and the Greenbrier Board of Education has committed to \$5,000.00.

Mr. Shiffer told the Commissioners that he had talked with Chris Perkins, Acting Superintendent for the Fayette County Board of Education and he would be appearing before the Board to request funding.

Mr. Shiffer told the Commissioners that the Intern Program starts

Commissioner Wender informed he thinks the \$5,000 is excessive.

Commissioner Eskew asked if the students of Meadow Bridge will continue to participate whether Fayette County Commission contribute or not. Mr. Shiffer replied yes.

Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer appeared before the Commission with Case #Z-513-071: Request of Deborah Taylor, owner for a change in land classification from R-R (Residential Residence District) to B-2 (Business, Local District) on property legally described as 1.53 acres Glade Creek n/r Danese, New Haven District.

Mr. Richardson told the Commissioners that the Fayette County

motion and 4 against and 2 abstained (Leon Cooper & Gene Kistler).

Debbie Turner, Program Director and Seth Lewis, Account Executive with the Nationwide Retirement Solution appeared before the Commission to discuss a deferred compensation program (457) in West Virginia.

Ms. Turner gae a brief summary of the program.

Ms. Turner told the Commissioners that 457 is a pre-tax savings, will be pre-taxed while working, will be taxed when you decide to retire or take early distribution, no employer match, 100% employee contribution up to \$15,500 normal limit, after age 50 you are eligible to contribute an additional \$5,000, payroll deductible the minium amount is \$10.00 per check, no penalty for early withdrawal.

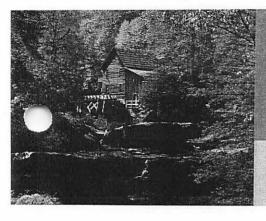
Ms. Turner told the Commissioners this program is endorsed by the National Association of Counties.

Subject: WSU Extension Agent Funding

The Fayette County Farmland Protection Board met last evening.

Alan Wickline proposed a funding method whereby Carl Thompson may remain as a FP Board member and additional funding can be made to WVSU to further subsidize Carl's salary as Extension Agent. The Board voted and approved the funding as follows:

- The proposal will provide for a \$10,000 per year payment to the Fayette Count Commission. The funding will be to partially pay the salary of the assistant on the 3rd floor, materials, and office space.
- In turn this will eliminate the need for the 4-C EDA payment (\$10,000 annually) to the County Commission
 which is now used to partially reimburse the Commission for the assistant's salary.
- This will allow 4-C EDA to direct the additional \$10,000 to WVSU. 4-C EDA will continue as WVSU's
 funding partner but at the higher rate of \$20,000 per year.
- Thus Carl's position continues with the original two funding sources WVSU and 4-C EDA (with the County Commission as in-kind support).
- This will free up \$10,000 of the funding now directed toward Carl's salary by WVSU.

(As a clean up matter; the FPB will make its contribution on a fiscal year basis - - July 1- June 30. Carl's contract with WVSU has an Oct.1st anniversary. Since we will be three months into the current fiscal year, the payment to the County Commission will be prorated to \$7,500 for the current fiscal year.)

The Fayette County Commission will meet on October 5th. I will request that the Commission consider paying the mileage associate with the duties of the WVSU Extension Agent (Carl). Carl estimates his annual mileage at less than 500 miles per month which should be something around \$2500 per year.

Hopefully this will be a satisfactory arrangement to resolving the funding shortfall and meet the objectives of all concerned.

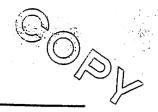
