The Fayette County Commission met in a special session on this  $31^{\rm st}$  day of January 2008.

Commissioner Eskew called the Board of Equalization and Review hearing to order at 9:12 a.m. Since there were no hearings scheduled, Commissioner Eskew asked that the Board of Equalization and Review be adjourned at 9:20 a.m.

Commissioners Eskew convened the County Commission meeting at 9:20 a.m.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Fayette County National Bank informing of the pledged securities that will not be available for pledge as of February 1, 2008.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to order the release of said securities provided that securities will be substituted simultaneously and that Fayette County funds deposited with said banking institution will not be unsecured. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Order signed.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that the Division of Culture and History did not approve record shelf storage for the jail but approved \$3,600.00 for the County Clerk to continue the map preservation project and to purchase map sleeves for the map cabinet in the records room.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to ask for a reason why they

did not approve the record's shelf storage.

Ms. Holly presented a letter for the Commissioners to sign informing the Division of Culture and History that it is their intent to proceed with the map preservation project and to purchase map sleeves for the map cabinet in the records room at the reduced funding level. The Commissioners signed the letter.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners that Arbuckle

Public Service District had received a citation from the Division of

Environmental Protection.

Discussion was held, and the Commission asked Dave Pollard,
County Resource Coordinator to talk to other Public Service District's
regarding Arbuckle Public Service District situations.

Ms. Holly presented to the Commissioners an Order designating the number and type of election boards for the various precincts for the Presidential Primary Election being held May 13, 2008.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve the Order designating the number and type of election boards for the executive committees of the democrat and republican parties. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous. Order signed.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to go into Executive Session to discuss personnel matter (9:50 a.m.). Commissioner Lopez seconded.

Upon returning from the Executive Session, Commissioner Eskew reconvened the County Commission meeting at 10:30 a.m.

Commissioner Eskew informed the Executive Session was to discuss a personnel matter no decision was made.

Mary Kees appeared before the Commission to discuss the

Collinsdale-Burnwell/Mossy Water Project.

Attached is a list of everyone who attended.

Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator informed the Commissioners that he talked to Angela Chestnut with AML. Ms. Chestnut informed him that AML is putting the project out for bids for engineering soon (\$300,000) plus. Mr. Pollard told the Commissioners there would probably be an additional cost of \$30,000 to \$40,000 additional cost for legal, account, and easements.

Mr. Pollard told the Commissioners that WV American Water has a tank about 2½ miles away that serves Cabin Creek they are willing to participate in this discussion. Mr. Pollard told the Commissioners he has not talked with the National Park Service.

Amy Swann with the West Virginia Public Service Commission informed the Commissioners they should urge AML to talk to the Department of Public Health and should look at existing entry.

The Commissioners asked Mr. Pollard to keep in touch with AML and e-mail updates with Lannie.

The Commissioners asked Dave Pollard to copy Ms. Kees on any correspondences he might receive.

Ms. Swann told the Commissioners that through the summer and past it would probably take up to one year for engineering study.

Commissioner Eskew informed, he hopes the group that has gathered here can solve the problem.

The Commissioners signed a letter approving the use of the Memorial Building for Craig Lee Loy, Principal Valley High School, to play two (2) A sectional boys' basketball tournament games.

The Commissioners signed renewal invoice for Sam's Club Business Member.

Ms. Holly reminded the Commissioners that they have scheduled a meeting on February 21 at 10:00 a.m. to met with Ed Harper, Economic Development Council to discuss the Fayette County Weatherization Program and to remind them that they have scheduled a Board of Equalization and Review hearing for 1:00 p. m. if necessary.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Debbie Tate, 4-H Agent County Program Coordinator requesting a transfer of

funds in the WVU Extension Service 2007/2008 Budget.

Ms. Tate is requesting that \$1,040.00 be transferred from travel to temporary help.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve this transfer contingent upon a receipt of the written approval of the Extension Service Board. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve and release vouchers and invoices. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender asked Ms. Holly to send him an e-mail to remind him of the date and time the Commission will discuss the election officials pay rate on February 12, 12008 at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to write a letter to our legislators informing them that Fayette County Commission needs to go on record that they oppose to splitting districts, needs to be kept as a whole 3-Delegate District. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Tom Hughes, Sheriff William Laird, Steve Cruikshank, David Neal and Mike Bates appeared before the Commission to discuss the radio bid.

Mr. Hughes told the Commissioners he was not pleased with the issue of Steve Cruiskahnk's letter of recommendation. Mr. Hughes questioned why should they stay with Motorola ADP encryption. The AES only encryption the Homeland Security recommends.

Mike Bates told the Commissioners that the Sheriff Office purchased back in 2004, 30-35 portable radios several standards.

Mr. Bates told the Commissioners that the Governor's Office must be a part of the interoperability radio project and it's not a requirement to have encryption to operate on IRP system, everything the Sheriff has is interoperable.

The ADP cost would be \$10 optional must be a digital trunk to be an IRP System.

Mr. Bates told the Commissioners that Motorola pricing comes from Harrison County prices.

Commissioner Eskew suggested getting together and talk about some of these issues, but the contract has been awarded.

The Fayette County Commission met in a regular session on this 7th day of April 2008.

Commissioner Eskew called the meeting to order at 9:15 p. m.

Mary K. Weatherford from the Assessor's office presented exonerations to be approved and signed to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and sign exonerations for personal property for Jack L. and Carol J. Wygal, Charles Buckland, Donna J. McCoy, Drema F. Taylor, Jessie Smith and Tillman and Stephanie Mooney. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve and sign exonerations for real property for Carmen Leigh Walton and Margaret Jacqueline Humphrey. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve first half payrolls, invoices and vouchers, payrolls to be released today. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve minutes of February 19 and March 10, 2008. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that Aletha Stolar be appointed a member of the Fayette County Beautification Committee. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous. Order and Appointment Letter to Serve signed.

The Commissioners signed invoice to the Fayette County Board of Education for rental of the Fayette County Soldiers and Sailors

Memorial Building, amounted \$2,916.66 for the month of April.

Commissioner Lopez asked about the Fayette County Board of Education sharing the expenses for the election since they are including their continuation of additional Fayette County Board of Education Levy on the ballot.

The Commissioners asked Ms. Holly to send a letter to the Fayette County Board of Education asking that they share in the costs associated with the conduct of the Primary Election for payment of all janitorial services in school facilities, payment of printing levy ballots, payment of legal publication of levy ballot, and any other applicable cost.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the West Virginia Development Office informing that Governor Mencken has proclaimed April 2008 as Fair Housing Month for the State of West Virginia.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion that the Fayette County

Commission proclaims April 2008 as Fair Housing Month. Commissioner

Wender seconded. Unanimous. Proclamation signed.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners she received the Community Participation Grant for the New River Humane Society (\$5,000) and the Mountain View Church (\$5,000).

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve and authorize the adoption of the Resolutions for the New River Humane Society and the

Mountain View Church of God. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous. Resolutions signed.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Mountain Transit authority asking if the Commission approved their request for local commitment in the amount of \$3,000 for Fiscal Year 2000.

The Commissioners signed a letter to the Mountain Transit
Authority (MTA) informing that the Commissioners have completed their
budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008 and have approved
\$1,000.00 for their organization.

Mike Gasper with Mountain RCD appeared before the Commissioners to discuss the upcoming rail corridor abandonment in Greenbrier and Fayette Counties.

Mr. Gasper told the Commissioners that CSX Transportation filed for the abandonment of 16.7 miles of track within Greenbrier and Fayette Counties.

Mr. Gasper told the Commissioners he is here today to provide them with this information so they may take advantage of this opportunity to develop a real regional asset-a multi use trail that can accommodate hikers, bikers, equestrians and other appropriate uses.

Mr. Gasper told the Commissioners that a draft of a letter of interest is filed with the Surface Transportation Board (STB) which is attached.

Mr. Gasper told the Commissioners that filing this letter does not commit them to acquire this corridor, it gives the Commission time

to develop a rail-trail proposal and undertake negotiations with the railroad.

Mr. Gasper told the Commissioners the letter is good for 30 to 40 days.

Commissioner Wender suggested forwarding all the information to Carl Thompson. Mr. Gasper told the Commissioner he would work with Mr. Thompson.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that Fayette County

Commission makes a request to hold the upcoming rail corridor

abandonment in Greenbrier and Fayette Counties. Commissioner Lopez

seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender informed he would notify Carl Thompson to contact Mike Gasper regarding this matter.

Carol Smith presented the ballot box keys to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve Oak Hill permission to plant trees along the Oak Hill Rail Trail at their discretion. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly presented Quarterly Sales Tax Report for the Fayette County Park to the Commissioners to sign.

The Commissioners received and signed from the Fayette County
Health Department the Application for a Permit to Operate the pool at
the Fayette County Park.

The Commissioner received/reviewed and signed request from John David requesting letters of support for the Housing Counseling

Assistance and a Rural Housing and Economic Development Project.

Angie Groves, Region 4 Planning and Development Counsel and

Kenneth Hayes, Chairman New Haven Public Service District appeared before the Commission to continue the discussion of the Small Cities Block Grant (SCBG) applications.

The Commissioners informed that since the Kanawha Falls Public Service District does not have their project ready for construction, the Commission decided to approve the New Haven Public Service District to make application for the Small Cities Block Grant (SCBG).

Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator read a letter addressed to the Kanawha Falls Public Service District informing that the Fayette County Commission is interested in helping them move forward in providing water to the communities of Kanawha Falls and Boonesborough as outlined in their recent submittal for a Small Cities Block Grant (SCBG) consideration. The Commission asked the Kanawha Falls Public Service District to schedule a meeting at their office to discuss in the very near future.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that the Fayette County
Commission will give its priority to the water project to the New
Haven Public Service District, and this will include Stringtown Road
area for the Small Cities Block Grant (SCBG) application.
Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Kenneth Hayes, Chairman, New Haven Public Service District thanked the Commission for their support.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Ben Argento Basketball League requesting use of the Memorial Building for two (2) nights per week in July and August for their youth summer program.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve same as last year request for the use of the Memorial Building for the Ben Argento Basketball League. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous. A letter signed.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Fayette County Volunteers requesting a discounted rental rate for the Fayette County Park on behalf of Camp Kismet. The Commissioners asked to hold to discuss with Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent at his scheduled appointment.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from Amber L. L. Marstiller, SPF-SIG Project Director for the Fayette County Prevention Partnership.

Ms. Marstiller informed the Commissioners that the SPF-SIG prevention funds include \$2500.00 in administrative costs. Ms. Marstiller asked the Commissioners if they would like to collect the administrative cost.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to wave the administrative fee for the current year for the SPF-SIG grant. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

The Commissioners recessed the Commission meeting at 10:25 a.m. for a five (5) minute break.

The Commissioners reconvened the Commission meeting at 10:45 a.m.

Larry Rogers and Alfred Skaggs appeared before the Commission to discuss the rezoning of Route 60 and Stringtown Road.

Commissioner Wender informed the Commissioners that Mr. Rogers called him and he suggested that he come before the Commission.

Also, present was Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer.

Mr. Rogers told the Commissioners that Alfred Skaggs owns C & D Industrial building at Route 60, Stringtown Road. Mr. Rogers told the Commissioner this building needs to be rezoned to house Appalachian Power equipment. The building is 36 hundred square feet.

Mr. Rogers told the Commissioners in the Fayette County Unified Development Code the minimum acres required for Heavy Industry is 5 acres.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Richardson if they could revise the Heavy Industrial Ordinance.

Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney informed the Commissioners that this would have to go to the Planning Commission.

The Commissioners asked to postpone hearing until Tim Richardson,
Zoning Officer and Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator is
present.

Terrell Ellis, 4C Consultant appeared before the Commission to help think through how to develop an internal marketing strategic plan. Mr. Ellis told the Commissioners that this is a courtesy call.

Mr. Ellis told the Commissioners that 4-C Region is to be branded and New River Gorge Region is the brand.

Mr. Ellis told the Commissioners he hope the Commission can put a logo on their website and link website to the New River Gorge or consider putting on their stationery.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Ellis if the Fayette County Chamber of Commerce going to use the logo.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion that when the Commission needs stationery to incorporate the New River Gorge Region brand logo.

Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Dave Pollard, County Resource Coordinator, Tim Richardson, Zoning Officer, and Carl Harris, Prosecuting Attorney appeared before the Commission to continue discussion regarding the rezoning of route 60 Stringtown Road.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Pollard if they could accommodate without restricting the possibility of a various for the 3.6 acre site. Commissioner Wender informed that Appalachian Electric Power maintains the facility, 12-15 property owners okay with the rezoning.

Dave Pollard suggested to the Commissioners to request a various permit to the Board of Zoning Appeals. Heavy Industrial requires a minimum of 5 acres for a various permit.

Mr. Pollard informed the Commissioners he would have to review.

Commissioner Wender asked Dave Pollard if the Ordinance can be changed and asked Mr. Pollard if he would give some thought to this as well.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Pollard if they could get together what they can do and prepare something for the Commission to review.

Commissioner Eskew asked Mr. Pollard if they could have a recommendation based on the ordinance procedures and reschedule this hearing for April 15 at 10:00 a.m.

Earl Pauley, Park Superintendent appeared before the Commission to discuss the waterline extension for the pool.

Mr. Pauley informed the Commissioners that the 4-H had made a

request to bring shot guns, etc. to the camp.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to deny the request of the 4-H for the use of firearms in all areas open to the public within the Fayette County Park is absolutely prohibited. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender suggested to the Commission to inform Debbie Tate that she needs to meet with her counselors prior to camp and inform them of the damages.

The Commissioners suggested sending a letter to Debbie Tate to inform her that the Commission is concerned over damage done to the Fayette County Park for the past two years.

The Commissioners asked Ms. Tate to review the attached list and they expect every effort to be made by her and the camp counselors to take care of the Fayette County Park.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that last year they waived the camp fee and also gave the 4-H Leaders Association \$1,700.00 for the 4-H Camp.

Ms. Holly told the Commissioners that for the 2008 Fiscal Year Budget they are requesting: camp rental fee-\$750.00, 2-Volunteer camping assistants travel stipends-\$400.00 (\$200.00 each), 2-Camp cooks-\$750.00 (\$375.00 each), Medical Supplies requested to operate camp-\$100.00, total \$2,000.00.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to grant \$2,000.00 for operation of 4-H Camp in accordance with their request dated March 13, 2008. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Discussion was held regarding a discount on rental rate for Camp

Kismet.

Peggy Bennett informed the Commissioners that last year Kelvin Holliday did not take care of the request. Ms. Bennett told the Commissioners they received a check from the Fayette County Volunteers last week for last year.

The Commissioners received and reviewed a letter from the Fayette County Volunteers requesting a discount on the rental rate for the Fayette County Park on behalf of Camp Kismet.

Discussion was held the Commissioners decided to charge the same as last year a \$300.00 deduction.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to discount the camp fee to \$300.00 for Camp Kismet. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Earl Pauley explained to the Commissioners they need a waterline to the pool and a meter to Shelter #3 the meter to be put in ground on the side of the pool, the meter tap will cost \$300.00 and to run the line it would cost \$260.00, total \$560.00.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve \$560.00 for the waterline extension and meter from Shelter #3 to the pool.

Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that the poll will be open Memorial Day weekend.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners they have a 40-year-old trash truck that's a hazard to be on the road. Mr. Pauley told the Commissioner he would like to go shopping for another truck cost would about \$4,000.00 to \$5,000.00.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion for Earl Pauley to go

shopping for another garbage truck and asked to hold until the Commission review. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Ms. Holly informed the Commissioners that Mr. Pauley had sent up a list of vehicles to be auctioned off.

Mr. Pauley told the Commissioners that the estimated cost to replace two (2) sets of windows at the Recreation Hall by the pool cost would be \$6,000.00.

Commissioner Wender asked Mr. Pauley to get an estimate from AAA Glass.

Discussion was held regarding the West Virginia Civil War Trail interpretive signage program. The division of Tourism has agreed to pay for the first 150 interpretive sites in West Virginia; the community would be responsible for the cost of the sign \$2,000.00 per sign. A community-based organization or agency will be responsible for an annual \$200 maintenance commitment.

The Commissioners received a request from the Historic Fayetteville Convention and Visitors Museum asking if they could place one marker on the Courthouse property.

Commissioner Wender offered a motion to approve placing one (1) marker on the Courthouse property for the West Virginia Civil War Trails. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Eskew offered a motion for Commissioner Wender to participate in the meeting commemorator honoring Congress Rahall in Washington, D.C. Commissioner Wender will pay the travel expense if Fayette County Commission pay the hotel expense. Commissioner Lopez seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Eskew swore in Damon Rhodes.

Mr. Rhodes told the Commission that the taxes they presented fro review last year at that time based on their evidence the Commission saw fit to have reduced the T factor from T-20 to T-40 the evidence consisted of the fact that the leasing factor which goes to a five-mile radius was for a different seam than the seam in question which was a sewell seam. Also, they have an environmental factor which was

not taken into consideration the Meadow Ridge Mine. The environmental factor should have been increased and the leasing factor decreased which would make a T-40.

District 1 Parcel 9999-0623-1909-0000 State recommends value remain the same \$27,180 with the comment that last year th Commission assign the T factor of 40 instead the T factor 20 on this parcel; the same goes for District 1 Parcel 9999-0623-2365-0000 same treatment for Parcel 01-9999-0600-4879-0000 State recommends the value stay the same; Parcel 01-9999-0601-3057-0000 the T factor would be something the Commission would have to decide on whether to change from T-20 to T-40.

Mr. Rhodes informed the Commissioners it was not addressed last year because there was no increase.

Commissioner Eskew asked if it wasn't addressed last year would this be something within the jurisdiction of the Commission.

Mr. Simental replied yes you would have to decide if you're going to change from a T-20 that the State has to a T-40 and that is what the tax payer is requesting.

## Wastewater Updates

## **Arbuckle PSD**

- ✓ The PSC had originally planned to meet with White Oak PSD about becoming the receiver on July 16. PSC cancelled at the last moment and the meeting has been rescheduled for July 28 at 1 pm. I will be in attendance. In discussions with White Oak, they have expressed several concerns, both financial and operational. West Virginia-American has thus far declined to become involved on the wastewater side.
- ✓ On the water side, WV-American has put forth a proposal to purchase the Arbuckle system. It has been well received by the PSC, but USDA has not formally signed on. There has been a long-standing resistance from USDA to work with private water providers that is why we have never used RUS/USDA funding in any of the New Haven water extensions. We were successful in purchasing the Mossy PSD system which had a USDA grant involved in the financing so there is an avenue for this to happen.
- ✓ The interesting question on the wastewater side is what would happen if White Oak declines? Will the PSC try to force them in some way (perhaps through the County Commission?) to take it? Would the PSC take over operation in some format? There is some advice coming to White Oak that the PSC caused the problem by allowing it to go on for so long. If this goes past August 9 and the proposed sale of the Fayetteville system to WV-American, would they reconsider the Arbuckle sewer?
- ✓ Unfortunately, there is no short-term perfect solution here. Whomever takes over is going to have to invest significant time into getting the system on its feet. They will have to begin disconnecting customers that do not pay their bills to get the message across that the old way is not going to continue. Then, DEP is going to have to come down hard on those individuals. This does not address the significant physical problems of the system, nor does it address the problem of getting qualified people in place. While White Oak may be able to take over fiscal management without stressing its current staff too much, they will have to get operators in place − and these people are not that easy to find in today's market. While Steve Sparks is an excellent operator, he has plenty of wok to do keeping up the White Oak system without taking on Arbuckle.

## **County Wastewater Plan**

✓ As we stated some time ago, it is in our best interests to have WV-American involved in our efforts because of the financial benefits they bring to the table.

- The election on the Fayetteville system is due to be held on August 9. Hopefully, the voters approve that sale. This would not only give WV-American a customer base in Fayette County, but it would give them a facility and workers who could be cross trained to maintain different kinds of systems. Dan Bickertonand I have kept in constant touch to update the Fayetteville and Oak Hill discussions and he knows that we will be seeking a proposal first on Winona once the purchase has been completed.
- While we would have liked to move more quickly on this front, WV-American is not the only factor slowing things down. From the start of the Regional Water Project we positioned things so that New Haven would eventually be a wastewater provider - that is why they were chartered to provide this service when the District was re-configured back in 1996. At this time, New Haven has its hands full with three water extension projects - one that will begin construction this year (Beauty Mountain/Power Plant Road/Shawver Bridge Road) and two more that are in position for next year (Stringtown Road and Derry Hale). We worked hard to come up with a new funding scenario which go the Beauty Mountain project funded and we have gotten a design loan (design now complete) for Stringtown and a design grant for Derry Hale which makes these projects very likely to proceed. That in itself is a process that takes a lot of time and effort -not only on my part in working with funders and coordinating the various professionals, but also on the part of the district itself - their attorney has been extremely busy getting needed easements on the Beauty Mountain and Stringtown projects – as well as getting Certificates of Need from the PSC – which are required to get the release of funds from the various agencies. The engineer has had to submit and acquire a multitude of other required permits. Additionally we have had multiple status conferences with all of the funders, bond counsel and other important players. That said, the District has been reluctant to plow additional ground while these projects are moving ahead.
- ✓ I do keep in contact with the engineer for the District in terms of moving forward with Winona. To do this we will have to reduce the projected costs that Pio developed because what he called for was 100% grant this will not happen and then bills of over \$60/month for O&M. That, is another reasons we need WV-American both to generate investment in the project and to reduce O&M costs by having their workers on board.
- On the funding front, I made contact with Jefferson County (through zoning perhaps not the best people to talk to) in regard to a potential flush tax. The word I received is that they felt they would be interested but that they would probably not take the lead. I am going to try to work with Delegate Perry this fall to get a lay of the land for the upcoming sessions to see what the Governor has in mind for funding additional sewer work as he has indicated that water and sewer infrastructure is a priority. At this point, we can get significant amounts of loan dollars, but grants are very hard to come by on the sewer side. IJDC has just \$2 million in grant available for our district for the near future (both water and sewer) and this is already committed for a Richwood project. We have committed to Stringtown (and rightfully so given the health risks) for our Small Cities grant application and are still approved for Corps dollars for Wolf Creek

- (still trying to align \$167,000 match). RUS has grant money but reserve it for those willing to take 50% grant and 50% loan from them. And as mentioned, if we use them then WV-American will most likely have to be left out of the equation.
- ✓ Timing is going to be everything on this matter, but a lot of factors are in place and others (particularly the WV-American/Fayetteville acquisition) are moving in our direction.

Service District. Commissioner Wender seconded. Unanimous.

Commissioner Wender suggested holding until they find someone from the New Haven District that might be interested.

Commissioner Eskew informed he would talk with Mayor Pete Hobbs to see if he knew anyone who might be interested.

The Commissioners asked to hold further discussion on August 8, 2008.

The Commissioners approved to go into Executive Session at 10:35 a.m. with James Perdue, Maintenance Supervisor to discuss a personnel problem.

The Commissioners reconvened the Commission meeting at 10:55 a.m. Commissioner Eskew informed no decision made regarding personnel

matter.

The Commissioners asked James Perdue and Donnie Austin to meet in an executive session after the annexation hearing.

After a brief discussion regarding the incinerator, the Commission asked James Perdue to get quotes on a shredder.

Commissioner Lopez offered a motion to approve James Perdue overtime. Commissioner Eskew seconded. Unanimous.

I notified at once this morning Jason Williams, Elections Division Chief for the W.V. Sec. of State, and was directed to proceed as follows:

- 1) determine all absentee ballots in affected precincts 60, 65, 67, 68, 72 & 74;
- 2) determine all early voters affected in precincts listed above by matching paper ballot stub with poll slip, which I did over several hours with part-time clerk Alicia Treadway;
- determine category totals by political party in points one and two and match these totals with ballots found in precinct envelopes specified above;
- 4) document conclusion of this process (by this letter).

My list of affected voters was not finalized until mere moments before quitting time at 4 p.m. once all proper linkage of ballows concluded. Thus, my efforts to notify my Prosecutor, Co. Administrator, and two of three Co. Commissioners this date failed due to the lateness of the work hour, with the exception of Commissioner Matt Wender who was given a summary of the above.

I recommend counting at canvass, with attached lists and ballots totalling:

- 1 Non-partisan (Independent)
- 8 Republican
- 65 Democrat
- 74 Total

I am available at any further time to discuss my process or findings.

## REVISION TO SICK LEAVE POLICY FOR DEPUTY SHERIFFS

WHEREAS, the sick leave policy of Fayette County provides that all accrued sick leave is lost upon an employee leaving employment by the County for any reason, and

WHEREAS, the deputy sheriffs are able to apply accrued sick leave upon retirement to their years of service and for other benefits provided under the Deputy Sheriffs' Civil Service Act, and

WHEREAS, a deputy sheriff may leave his employment and be reinstated within two years without losing any years of service, and

WHEREAS, the accrued sick leave at the time of a deputy sheriff's departure may be applied to years of service if the deputy is not retiring at that time, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Fayette County Commission to adopt a policy to provide for application of accrued sick leave when a deputy sheriff of Fayette County has left employment due to an involuntary lay-off and has returned to employment as a Fayette County Deputy Sheriff within two years of that involuntary lay-off.

NOW, THEREOFRE, be it RESOLVED that the sick leave policy of Fayette County be amended to provide the following provision for deputy sheriffs, which provision replaces and rescinds the previous revision to sick leave policy:

In the event that a Fayette County Deputy Sheriff leaves his/her employment as a deputy sheriff as a result of an involuntary lay-off and has already become vested in the Deputy Sheriffs' Retirement System and is thereafter reinstated as a Fayette County Deputy Sheriff within two (2) years after having been involuntarily laid off, the deputy sheriff may apply any accrued sick leave that existed at the time of the involuntary lay-off as

a deputy sheriff toward years of service as a vested retirement benefit, or toward such other benefits as may be available under the Deputy Sheriffs' Civil Service Act, at the election of the retiring deputy.
